- AN ACT to amend the economic development law, in relation to the establishment of the New York state task force on health care cost reduction through entrepreneurial innovation

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The economic development law is amended by adding a new 2 section 139 to read as follows:

3 S 139. NEW YORK STATE TASK FORCE ON HEALTH CARE COST REDUCTION THROUGH ENTREPRENEURIAL INNOVATION. 1. THE LEGISLATURE FINDS THAT OPPORTUNITIES 4 5 EXIST TO IMPROVE HEALTH CARE DELIVERY, AND HEALTH THROUGH NONSURGICAL б AND NON-PHARMACOLOGICAL MEANS BY ENCOURAGING COOPERATION OF HEALTH CARE PROVIDERS, MANUFACTURERS, SERVICE PROVIDERS, RESEARCHERS AND ENGINEERS 7 DEVELOP INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS. BY DEVELOPING PRODUCTS THAT HELP OUR 8 TO SENIORS STAY IN THEIR HOMES LONGER, PEOPLE ON SPECIAL DIETS GET THE FOOD 9 THAT THEY NEED AT A COST THEY CAN AFFORD, OR ENABLING REMOTE EMERGENCY 10 WORKERS TO RESPOND MORE EFFECTIVELY, ULTIMATELY, HEALTH CARE COSTS ARE 11 12 REDUCED. THEREFORE, THE LEGISLATURE ESTABLISHES THE NEW YORK STATE TASK 13 FORCE ON HEALTH CARE COST REDUCTION THROUGH ENTREPRENEURIAL INNOVATION 14 IN ORDER TO DEVELOP A COMPREHENSIVE STATEWIDE PLAN FOR DEVELOPMENT OF 15 THAT DELIVER PRODUCTS AND SERVICES TO REDUCE THE COST OF INDUSTRIES HEALTH CARE WHILE CREATING JOBS AND STIMULATING ECONOMIC ACTIVITY 16 17 THROUGHOUT THE STATE.

18 2. THE DEPARTMENT, IN COOPERATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, SHALL 19 ESTABLISH A TASK FORCE TO UNDERTAKE AN ASSESSMENT OF CONDITIONS THAT ARE 20 TREATED IN THE HEALTH CARE SYSTEM WHERE COSTS ARE LOWERED THROUGH USE OF CURRENTLY AVAILABLE OR NEW PRODUCTS OR SERVICES AND DEVELOP A PLAN FOR 21 NEW YORK STATE PUBLIC, NOT-FOR-PROFIT AND PRIVATE HEALTH CARE 22 PROVIDERS 23 TO WORK TOGETHER WITH INNOVATIVE SERVICE AND MANUFACTURING BUSINESSES TO 24 DEVELOP AND PROMOTE THE USE OF INNOVATIVE PRODUCTS AND SERVICES THAT 25 LOWER HEALTH CARE COST WHILE IMPROVING HEALTH CARE OUTCOMES FOR PATIENTS, CAREGIVERS AND COMMUNITIES. THE 26 TASK FORCE SHALL ISSUE A

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PRELIMINARY REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND LEGISLATURE OF ITS FINDINGS, 1 2 CONCLUSIONS, AND RECOMMENDATIONS WITHIN NINETY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE 3 DATE OF THIS SECTION AND A FINAL REPORT OF ITS FINDINGS, CONCLUSIONS, 4 AND RECOMMENDATIONS NO LATER THAN ONE HUNDRED FIFTY DAYS AFTER THE 5 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION. THE NEW YORK STATE TASK FORCE ON HEALTH CARE COST REDUCTION THROUGH ENTREPRENEURIAL INNOVATION REPORT SHALL 6 7 INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE FOLLOWING:

8 (A) AN INVENTORY OF TARGETED HEALTH CARE CONDITIONS FOR A COST 9 REDUCTION PLAN AND THE RELATED PRODUCTS AND/OR SERVICES TO BE DEVELOPED, 10 SUCH AS:

(I) PRODUCTS THAT MEET THE NEEDS OF SPECIAL DIETS, SUCH AS FOR THOSE 11 WITH FOOD ALLERGIES, CELIAC DISEASE AND LACTOSE INTOLERANCE; 12

(II) PRODUCTS USED IN THE WORKPLACE TO PREVENT INJURIES FROM REPETI-13 14 TIVE STRESS, BURNS OR FALLS;

15 (III) PRODUCTS USED IN REHABILITATION AND RECOVERY FROM SURGICAL 16 PROCEDURES OR INJURY;

17 (IV) PRODUCTS USED TO ALLOW HOMES TO BE ACCESSIBLE TO THE DISABLED, OR TO ALLOW SENIORS TO AGE IN PLACE; 18

(V) PRODUCTS FOR IMPROVING EMERGENCY OR FIRST RESPONDER SERVICES; AND

(VI) PRODUCTS TO PROVIDE FOR EFFICIENT AND EFFECTIVE REMOTE OR VIRTUAL 20 21 AND ELECTRONICALLY ENABLED REMOTE HEALTH CARE, INCLUDING LOCATOR TECH-22 NOLOGY.

(B) AN INVENTORY OF NEW YORK STATE'S CURRENT INDUSTRIES AND RESOURCES 23 24 THAT PROVIDE PRODUCTS AND SERVICES RELATED TO HEALTH CARE COST REDUCTION 25 PLANS AS WELL AS CURRENTLY UNMET NEEDS, SHOWING GEOGRAPHIC AND INDUSTRY 26 BASED STRENGTHS AND WEAKNESSES. PARTICULAR ATTENTION SHALL BE GIVEN TO 27 THE CURRENT AND FUTURE OPPORTUNITIES FOR SMALL AND EMERGING MANUFACTUR-28 TECHNOLOGY BUSINESS THROUGHOUT NEW YORK STATE AS WELL AS THE ING AND 29 RELEVANT SPECIALIZED RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT CAPABILITIES OF THE 30 STATE'S UNIVERSITIES AND COLLEGES.

(C) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR DEVELOPMENT OF PRODUCTS AND SERVICES AND 31 32 ACCOMPANYING BENCHMARKS, TIMELINES AND GOALS THAT CAN BE IMPLEMENTED AND 33 PROMOTED BY THE DEPARTMENT WHILE WORKING WITH STAKEHOLDERS, INCLUDING, 34 BUT NOT LIMITED TO, BUSINESSES, RESEARCH INSTITUTIONS, STATE AGENCIES 35 AND AUTHORITIES, INDUSTRY AND TRADE GROUPS, AND LOCAL, REGIONAL AND STATEWIDE HEALTHCARE PROVIDERS. 36

37 (D) IN ORDER TO ACHIEVE THESE GOALS, THE TASK FORCE MAY HOLD PUBLIC 38 HEARINGS, AND SHALL HAVE THE POWERS OF A LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE PURSUANT 39 TO THE LEGISLATIVE LAW.

40 TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT FEASIBLE, THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE ENTITLED (E) TO REQUEST AND RECEIVE AND SHALL UTILIZE AND BE PROVIDED WITH SUCH 41 FACILITIES, RESOURCES, AND DATA OF ANY DEPARTMENT, DIVISION, BOARD, 42 43 BUREAU, COMMISSION, OR AGENCY OF THE STATE OR ANY POLITICAL SUBDIVISION 44 THEREOF AS IT MAY REASONABLY REQUEST TO CARRY OUT PROPERLY ITS POWERS 45 AND DUTIES PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. THE TASK FORCE MAY USE RESOURCES OF THE DEPARTMENT AS IT MAY DEEM NECESSARY FOR THE PERFORMANCE OF ITS FUNC-46 47 TIONS.

48 3. NEW YORK STATE TASK FORCE ON HEALTH CARE COST REDUCTION THROUGH ENTREPRENEURIAL INNOVATION SHALL BE COMPOSED OF NINETEEN MEMBERS AS 49 50 FOLLOWS:

51 (A) TWO EX-OFFICIO MEMBERS, WHO MAY DESIGNATE A REPRESENTATIVE TO ACT 52 ON HIS OR HER BEHALF:

53 (I) THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT; AND 54 (II) THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

55 (B) FIVE MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR, FOUR MEMBERS APPOINTED BY 56 THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, FOUR MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE 1 SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, TWO MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF 2 THE SENATE AND TWO MEMBERS APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE 3 ASSEMBLY. SUCH MEMBERS SHALL BE LEADERS IN THE RELEVANT AREAS OF HEALTH 4 SERVICE DELIVERY, ADVANCED MANUFACTURING, RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT, NEW 5 PRODUCT DEVELOPMENT AND COMMERCIALIZATION. THE GOVERNOR SHALL DESIGNATE 6 A CHAIRPERSON OF THE TASK FORCE. VACANCIES IN THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE TASK 7 FORCE SHALL BE FILLED IN THE MANNER PROVIDED FOR ORIGINAL APPOINTMENTS.

8 (C) APPOINTING AUTHORITIES SHALL APPOINT MEMBERS OF THE TASK FORCE ON 9 OR BEFORE THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION AND THE 10 TASK FORCE SHALL CONVENE ITS FIRST MEETING ON OR BEFORE THIRTY DAYS 11 THEREAFTER.

12 4. NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION SEVENTY-FOUR OF THE PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW, SECTION EIGHT HUNDRED SIX OF THE GENERAL MUNICIPAL 13 14 LAW OR ANY OTHER PROVISION OF LAW, MEMBERSHIP ON THE COMMISSION OF ANY 15 STATE OR MUNICIPAL OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE SHALL NOT CONSTITUTE THE VIOLATION OF ANY CODE OF ETHICS OR A CONFLICT OF INTEREST. THE MEMBERS 16 17 OF THE TASK FORCE SHALL RECEIVE NO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES, BUT SHALL BE ALLOWED THEIR ACTUAL AND NECESSARY EXPENSES INCURRED IN THE 18 19 PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION.

20 S 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall 21 have become a law.
