AN ACT to amend the public service law and the state finance law, in relation to enacting the accessible electronic information act

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as 2 the "accessible electronic information act".

3 S 2. The public service law is amended by adding a new section 92-g to 4 read as follows:

5 S 92-G. ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION; BLIND AND DISABLED PERSONS. б 1. A QUALIFIED NOT-FOR-PROFIT ENTITY CAPABLE OF PROVIDING SUCH SERVICE 7 SHALL PROVIDE AN ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE FOR ELIGIBLE 8 BLIND AND DISABLED PERSONS. THIS SERVICE SHALL BE PLANNED FOR CONTINUA-TION FROM YEAR TO YEAR AND MAKE MAXIMUM USE OF FEDERAL AND 9 OTHER FUNDS 10 AVAILABLE BY OBTAINING GRANT OR IN-KIND SUPPORT FROM APPROPRIATE 11 PROGRAMS AND SECURING ACCESS TO LOW-COST INTERSTATE RATES FOR TELECOMMU-12 NICATIONS BY REIMBURSEMENT OR OTHERWISE.

13 2. AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING TERMS SHALL HAVE THE FOLLOW-14 ING MEANINGS, UNLESS OTHERWISE INDICATED:

(A) "ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE" MEANS NEWS AND OTHER
TIMELY INFORMATION (INCLUDING NEWSPAPERS) PROVIDED TO ELIGIBLE INDIVIDUALS FROM A MULTI-STATE SERVICE CENTER, USING HIGH-SPEED COMPUTERS AND
TELECOMMUNICATIONS TECHNOLOGY FOR INTERSTATE ACQUISITION OF CONTENT AND
RAPID DISTRIBUTION IN A FORM APPROPRIATE FOR USE BY SUCH INDIVIDUALS;

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(B) "BLIND AND DISABLED PERSONS" MEANS THOSE 1 INDIVIDUALS WHO ARE 2 ELIGIBLE FOR LIBRARY LOAN SERVICES THROUGH THE LIBRARY OF CONGRESS AND 3 THE STATE LIBRARY FOR THE BLIND AND PHYSICALLY HANDICAPPED PURSUANT TO 4 36 CFR 701.10(B); 5 (C) "DIRECTOR" MEANS THE DIRECTOR OF THE SELECTED NOT-FOR-PROFIT ENTI-6 TY; 7 (D) "OUALIFIED ENTITY" MEANS A NOT-FOR-PROFIT ENTITY WITHIN THIS STATE 8 CAPABLE OF PROVIDING ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICES WHICH: 9 PROVIDES INTERSTATE ACCESS FOR ELIGIBLE PERSONS TO READ DAILY (I)10 NEWSPAPERS PRODUCING AUDIO EDITIONS BY COMPUTER, AND 11 (II) PROVIDES A MEANS OF PROGRAM ADMINISTRATION AND READER REGISTRA-12 TION ON THE INTERNET. 13 S 3. The state finance law is amended by adding a new section 99-r to 14 read as follows: 15 S 99-R. ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE FUND. 1. THERE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED 16 IN THE CUSTODY OF THE STATE COMPTROLLER A SPECIAL REVENUE FUND TO BE KNOWN AS 17 "ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION THE18 SERVICE FUND". 19 NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION SHALL PREVENT THE STATE FROM 2. RECEIVING GRANTS, GIFTS OR BEQUESTS AND DEPOSITING THEM INTO THE 20 ACCES-21 SIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE FUND ACCORDING TO LAW. 22 THE ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE FUND SHALL BE ADMIN-3. 23 ISTERED BY THE PUBLIC SERVICE COMMISSION, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE 24 DIRECTOR, IN ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SECTION. 25 TARGETED ACCESSIBILITY FUND, INC., ESTABLISHED BY THE PUBLIC 4. THE 26 SERVICE COMMISSION IN ITS "ORDER AND OPINION 98-10", MAY ALLOCATE FUNDS 27 THE PURPOSE OF PROVIDING ELECTRONIC DISTRIBUTION OF NEWSPAPERS, FOR 28 PERIODICALS, TIME SENSITIVE MATERIALS, AND OTHER INFORMATION WHICH MAY 29 BE OF BENEFIT TO THE COMMUNITY. S 4. Subdivision 3 of section 95 of the state finance law, as amended 30 by chapter 516 of the laws of 1992, is amended to read as follows: 31 32 3. Whenever the amount of moneys in the abandoned property fund as of last day of any month shall exceed the greater of the sum of six 33 the 34 million dollars or an amount which in the comptroller's sole discretion necessary to satisfy claims against such fund during the immediately 35 is succeeding month, the comptroller shall draw a warrant or voucher upon 36 37 such special fund for the amount in excess of such sum and shall pay such amount into the state treasury to the credit of the [general fund] ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION SERVICE FUND, ESTABLISHED IN SECTION 38 39 40 NINETY-NINE-R OF THIS ARTICLE. Notwithstanding the foregoing, the comptroller and the director of the budget or their respective designees 41 shall review the balance remaining in the abandoned property fund as of 42 43 last day of the months of March, June, September and December in the 44 each year, as soon as practicable after each such date, and may mutually 45 agree upon an amount to be paid from such fund into the state treasury the credit of the [general fund] ACCESSIBLE ELECTRONIC INFORMATION 46 to 47 SERVICE FUND, ESTABLISHED IN SECTION NINETY-NINE-R OF THIS ARTICLE, 48 which may cause the balance in such fund to fall below six million dollars; provided, however, in no event shall the amount of moneys 49 in 50 the abandoned property fund exceed seven hundred fifty thousand dollars 51 at the end of the last day of the fiscal year. S 5. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 52 have become a law; provided, however, that effective immediately, the 53 54 addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rule or regulation necessary 55 for the implementation of this act on its effective date is authorized
