- AN ACT to amend the economic development law and the New York state urban development corporation act, in relation to establishing a strategic network partnerships program

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 190 of the economic development law is amended by 2 adding three new subdivisions 7, 8 and 9 to read as follows:

3 "STRATEGIC INDUSTRY" SHALL MEAN A REGIONAL OR STATEWIDE INDUS-7. 4 TRY GROUP ENGAGED IN MANUFACTURING OR OTHER PRODUCTION OF GOODS OR 5 SERVICES, INCLUDING RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES, THAT IS CONSID-6 ERED TO BE CRITICAL TO THE ECONOMY OF THE STATE IN TERMS OF EMPLOYMENT, 7 AND/OR IN WHICH THE STATE APPEARS TO HAVE A COMPARATIVE ADVANTAGE WHICH 8 WOULD ENABLE SUCH AN INDUSTRY GROUP TO CONTINUE TO MAKE A SIGNIFICANT 9 CONTRIBUTION TO THE ECONOMIC HEALTH OF THE STATE OR A REGION OF THE 10 STATE, AND WHICH IS DESIGNATED BY THE COMMISSIONER AS A STRATEGIC INDUS-TRY PURSUANT TO SECTION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-TWO-B OF THIS ARTICLE. 11

SHALL MEAN A STATEWIDE OR REGIONAL GROUP OF 12 8. "SUPPLIER NETWORK" 13 SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED MANUFACTURING FIRMS OR OTHER PRODUCERS OF GOODS OR SERVICES, INCLUDING RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES, IN DIFFERENT 14 15 INDUSTRY GROUPS WHICH SUPPLY THE SAME MANUFACTURING COMPANY OR GROUP OF SIMILAR MANUFACTURING COMPANIES WITH PRODUCTS USED IN 16 THE MANUFACTURE, PRODUCTION, OR ASSEMBLING OF FINAL PRODUCTS. 17

18 9. "STRATEGIC ALLIANCES" SHALL MEAN AN INFORMAL OR FORMAL ASSOCIATION 19 OF BUSINESSES IN A STRATEGIC INDUSTRY FOR THE PURPOSE OF SOLVING COMMON 20 PROBLEMS AND ENGAGING IN COOPERATIVE ACTIVITIES.

1 S 2. The economic development law is amended by adding three new 2 sections 192-a, 192-b and 192-c to read as follows:

192-A. STRATEGIC NETWORK PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM. 1. THE DEPARTMENT 3 S 4 SHALL ENTER INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH THE NEW YORK STATE URBAN DEVELOPMENT 5 CORPORATION, THE NEW YORK STATE JOB DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, THE NEW YORK 6 STATE OFFICE OF SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND ACADEMIC RESEARCH, THE STATE UNIVERSITY OF NEW YORK, THE STATE EDUCATION DEPARTMENT, THE DEPARTMENT 7 8 OF LABOR AND OTHER STATE AGENCIES TO CREATE A STRATEGIC NETWORK PARTNER-9 SHIPS PROGRAM WHICH SHALL BE COORDINATED BY THE DEPARTMENT.

10 2. IN ORDER TO EFFECT SUCH COORDINATION, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ESTAB-11 LISH THROUGH THE STRATEGIC NETWORK PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM AN INTER-AGENCY 12 COMMITTEE COMPOSED OF REPRESENTATIVES OF EACH OF THE STATE AGENCIES SET FORTH IN SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION, WHICH SHALL PROVIDE INTEGRATED 13 14 PLANNING OF STATE-SUPPORTED INDUSTRIAL MODERNIZATION ACTIVITIES, INCLUD-15 ING DEVELOPMENT OF CRITERIA AND PROCESSES FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF 16 STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES IN COOPERATION WITH THE STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP 17 AND SUPPLIER NETWORK ADVISORY PANEL ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION ONE 18 HUNDRED NINETY-TWO-B OF THIS ARTICLE.

19 3. THROUGH THE STRATEGIC NETWORK PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM THE DEPARTMENT 20 SHALL:

(A) ORGANIZE, INTEGRATE AND COORDINATE STATE PROGRAMS DESIGNED TO
 ASSIST MANUFACTURING INDUSTRIES AND OTHER PRODUCERS OF GOODS OR SERVICES
 TO BECOME MORE COMPETITIVE AND PRODUCTIVE.

(B) ANALYZE THE MODERNIZATION NEEDS OF SMALL AND MEDIUM-SIZED MANUFACTURERS AND OTHER PRODUCERS OF GOODS OR SERVICES, INCLUDING SELECTED
BRANCH PLANTS OF LARGER FIRMS, AT BOTH THE INDIVIDUAL FIRM AND OVERALL
INDUSTRY LEVELS, FOR THE PURPOSE OF TARGETING APPROPRIATE AND NECESSARY
RESOURCES TO IMPROVE PRODUCTIVITY AND COMPETITIVENESS.

(C) STIMULATE SELF-HELP ACTIVITIES THAT ARE DEVELOPED THROUGH COOPERATIVE EFFORTS BY FIRMS OR GROUPS OF FIRMS AT THE STATE AND REGIONAL
LEVELS, WHICH ARE DESIGNED TO DEVELOP SOLUTIONS TO FUNDAMENTAL PROBLEMS
FACING INDUSTRY GROUPS.

33 (D) ENCOURAGE, WHERE APPROPRIATE, THE FORMATION OF FLEXIBLE MANUFAC-34 TURING NETWORKS AMONG SMALLER FIRMS.

35 (E) CREATE A COMPUTER NETWORK AMONG MANUFACTURING FIRMS IN THE STATE 36 OR REGION.

37 (F) ESTABLISH A STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES GROUP SERVICES PROGRAM PURSUANT38 TO SECTION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-TWO-B OF THIS ARTICLE.

39 (G) ESTABLISH A SUPPLIER NETWORK GROUP SERVICES PROGRAM PURSUANT TO 40 SECTION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-TWO-C OF THIS ARTICLE.

FOLLOWING PROGRAMS WITHIN THE DEPARTMENT AND THE AGENCIES AND 41 THE 4. AUTHORITIES SET FORTH IN SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE COOR-42 43 DINATED WITH THE STRATEGIC NETWORK PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM: INDUSTRIAL 44 EFFECTIVENESS PROGRAM, PROCUREMENT ASSISTANCE PROGRAMS, EXPORT ASSIST-45 ANCE PROGRAMS, EXCELSIOR LINKED DEPOSIT PROGRAM, THE URBAN AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, THE EMPIRE STATE ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT FUND, THE 46 47 STRATEGIC TRAINING ALLIANCE PROGRAM AND OTHER PROGRAMS AS DETERMINED BY 48 THE COMMISSIONER.

THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ESTABLISH, WITHIN THE STRATEGIC NETWORK 50 PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM, A QUALITY COUNCIL PROGRAM DESIGNED TO COORDINATE 51 EDUCATIONAL AND ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ASSISTANCE ACTIVITIES RELATED TO FURTHERING THE IMPLEMENTATION OF TOTAL QUALITY MANAGEMENT 52 PRINCIPLES WITHIN MANUFACTURING FIRMS AND INDUSTRIES AND OTHER PRODUCERS OF GOODS 53 54 OR SERVICES. THE QUALITY COUNCIL PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE COMMUNICATION ON 55 INFORMATION CONCERNING QUALITY PRINCIPLES AND BEST QUALITY PRACTICES,

1 SPONSORSHIP OF QUALITY CONFERENCES, SEMINARS AND WORKSHOPS, AND SHALL 2 SERVE AS A QUALITY INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE FOR MANUFACTURERS.

3 S 192-B. STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES GROUP SERVICES PROGRAM. 1. THE DEPART-4 MENT SHALL:

5 (A) ESTABLISH WITHIN THE STRATEGIC NETWORK PARTNERSHIPS PROGRAM A 6 STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES GROUP SERVICES PROGRAM AND CREATE A PROCESS, PURSU-7 ANT TO SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION, TO DESIGNATE CERTAIN INDUSTRIAL 8 GROUPS ENGAGED IN MANUFACTURING OR THE PRODUCTION OF OTHER GOODS OR 9 SERVICES AS STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES.

10 (B) ACTIVELY PROMOTE COOPERATION AMONG FIRMS IN A STRATEGIC INDUSTRY IDENTIFY NEEDS, SOLVE COMMON PROBLEMS, AND ENCOURAGE AND BUILD COOP-11 TΟ ERATIVE PROGRAMS AMONG MEMBER COMPANIES OF STRATEGIC NETWORKS OR ALLI-12 ANCES IN AREAS CRITICAL TO THEIR SURVIVAL AND GROWTH, SUCH AS WORKFORCE 13 14 DEVELOPMENT, MARKET DEVELOPMENT AND EXPANSION, EXPORT TRADE, COMPETI-15 TIVENESS IMPROVEMENT, PRODUCT QUALITY IMPROVEMENT, TOTAL QUALITY MANAGE-MENT, PRODUCT DIVERSIFICATION, AND HIGH PERFORMANCE WORK ORGANIZATIONS. 16

17 (C) OFFER COMPANIES WITHIN A STRATEGIC INDUSTRY VARIOUS FORMS OF TECH-NICAL AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE, IN COOPERATION WITH THE NEW YORK STATE 18 URBAN DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, THE NEW YORK STATE JOB DEVELOPMENT 19 AUTHORITY, THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND ACADEMIC 20 RESEARCH, AND OTHER STATE AGENCIES, AS INCENTIVES FOR THE FORMATION OF 21 22 STRATEGIC ALLIANCES AMONG FIRMS IN A DESIGNATED STRATEGIC INDUSTRY AND 23 DIRECT SUCH ASSISTANCE TOWARD ADDRESSING THE PROBLEMS OF STRATEGIC 24 INDUSTRIES PURSUANT TO AGREEMENTS ENTERED INTO WITH STATE AGENCIES AND 25 AUTHORITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION ONE HUNDRED NINETY-TWO-A OF THIS ARTI-26 CLE.

(D) PROVIDE IN-DEPTH ASSISTANCE FOR ACTIVITIES SPONSORED BY INDUSTRY
 ASSOCIATIONS AND STRATEGIC ALLIANCES IN STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES TO STIMU LATE INDUSTRIAL MODERNIZATION AND MARKET EXPANSION ACTIVITY.

(E) IN COOPERATION WITH THE OFFICE OF SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND ACADEMIC
 RESEARCH, ASSIST AND SUPPORT STRATEGIC INDUSTRIES IN ACCESSING MANUFAC TURING TECHNOLOGY SERVICE AND OUTREACH CENTERS CREATED PURSUANT TO THE
 FEDERAL DEFENSE CONVERSION REINVESTMENT AND TRANSITION ASSISTANCE ACT OF
 1992 (P.L. 102-484) AND OTHER SOURCES OF STATE AND LOCAL MODERNIZATION
 ASSISTANCE DESIGNED TO:

36 (I) COLLECT AND DISSEMINATE THE MOST CURRENT INFORMATION ON MANUFAC37 TURING AND PRODUCTION METHODS, PROCEDURES, PROCESS AND TECHNOLOGIES
38 RELEVANT TO MEMBERS OF THE STRATEGIC INDUSTRY SERVED BY THE CENTER AND
39 CREATE AN INFORMATION RETRIEVAL SYSTEM FOR USE BY MEMBERS OF A STRATEGIC
40 INDUSTRY.

41 (II) CONDUCT DEMONSTRATIONS OF THE MOST CURRENT MANUFACTURING AND 42 PRODUCTION METHODS, PROCEDURES, PROCESSES AND TECHNOLOGIES FOR MEMBERS 43 OF THE STRATEGIC INDUSTRY AND UNDERTAKE TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER ACTIVITIES.

(III) PROVIDE TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP MEMBERS
TO ASSIST THEM IN ANALYZING PRODUCTION PROBLEMS AND IN IMPLEMENTING NEW
MANUFACTURING AND PRODUCTION PRACTICES, PROCESSES, PROCEDURES AND TECHNOLOGIES.

48 (IV) PROVIDE THE OPPORTUNITY FOR SHARED MANUFACTURING AND PRODUCTION 49 SPACE AND THE USE OF SPECIALIZED DEMONSTRATION EQUIPMENT FOR USE BY 50 INDIVIDUAL FIRMS OR GROUPS OF FIRMS IN A STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP.

51 (V) ESTABLISH TIES WITH UNIVERSITIES AND CONDUCT JOINT RESEARCH INTO 52 THE PROBLEMS AFFECTING A STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP.

53 (VI) OFFER MANAGEMENT AND TECHNICAL COURSES TO MEMBERS OF A STRATEGIC 54 INDUSTRY GROUP.

55 (VII) ARRANGE FOR AND CONDUCT WORKER PARTICIPATION AND TRAINING FOR 56 STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP MEMBERS. 1 (VIII) ARRANGE FOR AND PROVIDE EXPORT INFORMATION, ASSISTANCE AND 2 REPRESENTATION AT TRADE SHOWS.

3 (IX) ACT AS PACKAGERS, WHERE APPROPRIATE, OF GROUP INSURANCE FOR STRA-4 TEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP MEMBERS.

5 (F) GRADUALLY REDUCE ASSISTANCE TO STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUPS OVER TIME 6 TO ALLOW INDUSTRY GROUPS TO BECOME USER-FUNDED AND SELF-SUPPORTING.

7 2. (A) THE COMMISSIONER SHALL DESIGNATE A STRATEGIC INDUSTRY GROUP AND 8 SUPPLIER NETWORK ADVISORY PANEL.

9 (I) SUCH ADVISORY PANEL SHALL BE COMPOSED OF LEADING UNIVERSITY AND 10 PRIVATE SECTOR ECONOMISTS, REPRESENTATIVES OF LABOR GROUPS, REPRESEN-TATIVES FROM THE PRIVATE BUSINESS SECTOR, SELECTED MEMBERS OF THE BOARD 11 12 OF DIRECTORS OF THE NEW YORK STATE URBAN DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, THE YORK STATE JOB DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, AND THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE 13 NEW 14 OF SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY AND ACADEMIC RESEARCH AND OTHER SUCH REPRESEN-15 TATIVES AS THE COMMISSIONER DEEMS APPROPRIATE.
