AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to the practice of naturopathic medicine

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The education law is amended by adding a new article 132-A 2 to read as follows:

THIS ARTICLE APPLIES TO THE PROFESSION OF NATU-S 16 ROPATHIC MEDICINE. THE GENERAL PROVISIONS FOR ALL PROFESSIONS CONTAINED IN ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY OF THIS TITLE APPLY TO THIS ARTICLE. 17 S 6576. DEFINITION OF PRACTICE OF NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE. "NATUROPATHIC 18 MEDICINE" OR "NATUROPATHY" MEANS A SYSTEM OF PRIMARY HEALTH CARE FOR THE 19 DIAGNOSIS, AND CARE OF HUMAN HEALTH CONDITIONS, INJURIES, 20 PREVENTION, 21 AND DISEASES THAT USES EDUCATION AND NATURAL SUBSTANCES AND REMEDIES TO

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SUPPORT AND STIMULATE THE INDIVIDUAL'S INTRINSIC SELF-HEALING PROCESSES. 1 2 FOR PURPOSES OF THIS CHAPTER: 3 "DIAGNOSE" MEANS TO EXAMINE IN ANY MANNER ANOTHER PERSON, PARTS OF 1. 4 A PERSON'S BODY, OR SUBSTANCES, FLUIDS, OR MATERIALS EXCRETED, TAKEN, OR 5 REMOVED FROM A PERSON'S BODY OR PRODUCED BY A PERSON'S BODY TO DETERMINE 6 THE SOURCE, KIND, OR EXTENT OF A DISEASE OR OTHER PHYSICAL CONDITION. 7 2. "MINOR OFFICE PROCEDURE" MEANS THE USE OF OPERATIVE, ELECTRICAL, OR 8 OTHER METHODS FOR THE REPAIR OF, AND CARE INCIDENTAL TO, SUPERFICIAL LACERATIONS AND ABRASIONS, THE REMOVAL OF FOREIGN BODIES LOCATED IN 9 10 SUPERFICIAL TISSUES, AND THE USE OF ANTISEPTICS AND LOCAL ANESTHETICS IN CONNECTION WITH THESE METHODS. THE TERM INCLUDES THE USE OF LOCAL ANES-11 12 APPLIED TOPICALLY OR BY INJECTION, WHETHER NATURAL OR THESIA PRESCRIPTION, IN SUPERFICIAL TISSUES ASSOCIATED WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF 13 14 MINOR OFFICE PROCEDURES. THE TERM SHALL NOT INCLUDE GENERAL OR SPINAL ANESTHESIA, MAJOR SURGERY, SURGERY OF THE BODY CAVITIES, OR SPECIALIZED 15 16 SURGERIES, INCLUDING PLASTIC SURGERY OR SURGERY INVOLVING THE EYES, 17 TENDONS, LIGAMENTS, OR MAJOR BLOOD VESSELS. 3. "NATURAL ANTIBIOTICS" MEANS ANTIMICROBIAL, ANTIFUNGAL, AND ANTIPRO-18 19 TOZOAL AGENTS THAT ARE NATURALLY OCCURRING SUBSTANCES OR MANUFACTURED SUBSTANCES THAT ARE SUBSTANTIALLY IDENTICAL TO THE NATURALLY OCCURRING 20 21 SUBSTANCES. 22 4. "NATURAL MEDICINES" MEANS: A. FOOD, FOOD EXTRACTS, AND DIETARY SUPPLEMENTS AS DEFINED BY THE 23 FEDERAL FOOD, DRUG, AND COSMETIC ACT (21 U.S.C. SECTION 301 ET SEQ.), AS 24 25 AMENDED; 26 B. HOMEOPATHIC REMEDIES; 27 C. PLANT SUBSTANCES THAT ARE NOT DESIGNATED AS PRESCRIPTION DRUGS OR 28 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES; 29 D. OVER-THE-COUNTER MEDICATIONS; E. PRESCRIPTIONS THAT ARE CONSISTENT WITH THE COMPETENT PRACTICE OF 30 31 NATUROPATHY; AND 32 F. SUBSTANCES PREPARED ACCORDING TO THE HOMEOPATHIC PHARMACOPEIA OF 33 THE UNITED STATES. 5. "NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE" OR "NATUROPATHY" MEANS A SYSTEM OF PRIMARY 34 35 HEALTH CARE FOR THE PREVENTION, DIAGNOSIS, AND CARE OF HUMAN HEALTH CONDITIONS, INJURIES, AND DISEASES THAT USES EDUCATION AND NATURAL 36 37 SUBSTANCES AND REMEDIES TO SUPPORT AND STIMULATE THE INDIVIDUAL'S INTRINSIC SELF-HEALING PROCESSES. 38 39 6. "NATUROPATHIC CHILDBIRTH" MEANS UNCOMPLICATED NATURAL CHILDBIRTH 40 ASSISTED BY A NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN. THE TERM INCLUDES THE USE OF NATURAL SUBSTANCES, OPHTHALMIC ANTIBIOTICS, EMERGENCY CHILDBIRTH MEDI-41 CINES, AND SIMPLE UNCOMPLICATED EPISIOTOMIES, BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE THE 42 43 USE OF FORCEPS DELIVERY, GENERAL OR SPINAL ANESTHESIA, CAESAREAN 44 SECTION, OR INDUCED ABORTION. 45 7. "NATUROPATHIC MOBILIZATION THERAPY" MEANS MANUALLY ADMINISTERING MECHANICAL TREATMENT OF BODY STRUCTURES OR TISSUES TO RESTORE THE NORMAL 46 47 PHYSIOLOGICAL FUNCTION OF THE BODY BY NORMALIZING AND BALANCING THE 48 MUSCULOSKELETAL SYSTEM OF THE BODY. THE TERM DOES NOT INCLUDE OSSEOUS 49 MANIPULATION. 50 8. "NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN" MEANS A PERSON WHO HOLDS HIMSELF OR 51 HERSELF OUT TO THE PUBLIC AS LICENSED TO PRACTICE NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE OR WHO PRACTICES NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE UNDER THIS ARTICLE. 52 9. "NATUROPATHIC PHYSICAL MEDICINE" MEANS THE USE OF THE PHYSICAL 53 54 AGENTS OF AIR, WATER, HEAT, COLD, SOUND, LIGHT, AND ELECTROMAGNETIC 55 NONIONIZING RADIATION AND THE PHYSICAL MODALITIES OF ELECTROTHERAPY, 56 BIOFEEDBACK, DIATHERMY, ULTRAVIOLET LIGHT, ULTRASOUND, HYDROTHERAPY,

NATUROPATHIC MOBILIZATION THERAPY, AND EXERCISE. THE TERM DOES NOT 1 INCLUDE THE PRACTICE OF PHYSICAL THERAPY, ACUPUNCTURE, OR CHIROPRACTIC. 2 10. "TOPICAL PREPARATIONS" MEANS TOPICAL ANALGESICS, ANESTHETICS, 3

4 ANTISEPTICS, SCABICIDES, ANTIFUNGALS, AND ANTIBACTERIALS. 5 S 6577. PRACTICE OF NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE AND USE OF TITLE "NATURO-6 PATHIC PHYSICIAN". ONLY A PERSON LICENSED OR OTHERWISE AUTHORIZED UNDER 7 THIS ARTICLE SHALL PRACTICE NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE OR USE THE TITLE "NATUROPATH", "DOCTOR OF NATUROPATHY", "DOCTOR OF NATUROPATHIC MEDI-8 CINE", OR USE THE INITIALS, "ND", OR "NMD" OR HOLD HIMSELF OR HERSELF 9 10 OUT TO THE PUBLIC THAT THEY PRACTICE NATUROPATHY IN ANY OF ITS FORMS.

S 6578. STATE BOARD FOR NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE. 1. A STATE BOARD FOR 11 12 NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE BOARD OF REGENTS ON RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSIONER FOR THE PURPOSE OF ASSISTING THE 13 14 BOARD OF REGENTS AND THE DEPARTMENT ON MATTERS OF PROFESSIONAL LICENSING 15 IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE ONE HUNDRED THIRTY OF THIS TITLE.

2. THE BOARD SHALL BE COMPOSED OF NOT LESS THAN SEVEN NATUROPATHIC 16 17 PHYSICIANS LICENSED IN THIS STATE WHO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS SET FORTH IN THIS ARTICLE. AN EXECUTIVE SECRETARY TO THE BOARD SHALL BE APPOINTED BY 18 19 THE BOARD OF REGENTS ON RECOMMENDATION OF THE COMMISSIONER AND SHALL BE EITHER A NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN LICENSED IN THIS STATE OR A NON-PHYSI-20 21 CIAN, DEEMED QUALIFIED BY THE COMMISSIONER AND BOARD OF REGENTS.

22 3. THERE SHALL BE TWO MEMBERS OF THE BOARD FROM THE MEDICAL OR OSTEO-PATHIC COMMUNITY AND NO ONE DISCIPLINE SHALL COMPRISE BOTH MEMBERS. 23

24 S 6579. REOUIREMENTS FOR A PROFESSIONAL LICENSE. TO OUALIFY FOR A 25 LICENSE AS A NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN, AN APPLICANT SHALL FULFILL THE 26 FOLLOWING REOUIREMENTS: 27

1. APPLICATION: FILE AN APPLICATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT;

28 2. EDUCATION: HAVE RECEIVED AN EDUCATION, INCLUDING A DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE, "N.D.", FROM AN APPROVED NATUROPATHIC COLLEGE. 29 FOR PURPOSES OF THIS ARTICLE, THE TERM "APPROVED NATUROPATHIC COLLEGE" 30 31 MEANS A COLLEGE OR RESIDENTIAL PROGRAM GRANTING THE DEGREE OF DOCTOR OF 32 NATUROPATHY OR DOCTOR OF NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE THAT:

33 IS ACCREDITED BY AN AGENCY RECOGNIZED BY THE FEDERAL GOVERNMENT, Α. 34 THE COUNCIL FOR NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL EDUCATION OR ITS SUCCESSOR, OR 35 APPROVED BY THE BOARD WHICH MEETS THE STANDARDS GENERALLY RECOGNIZED AND BEING MET BY OTHER LICENSING JURISDICTIONS IN THE UNITED STATES; 36

37 B. HAS CANDIDATE FOR ACCREDITATION STATUS WITH THE ACCREDITING AGENCY; 38 OR

39 C. HAS BEEN APPROVED BY THE BOARD AFTER THE COLLEGE OR RESIDENTIAL 40 PROGRAM WAS INVESTIGATED AND FOUND TO MEET EDUCATION STANDARDS EOUIV-ALENT TO THOSE ESTABLISHED BY THE ACCREDITING AGENCY AND WHICH MEETS THE 41 STANDARDS GENERALLY RECOGNIZED AND BEING MET BY OTHER LICENSING JURIS-42 43 DICTIONS IN THE UNITED STATES;

44 3. EXPERIENCE: HAVE EXPERIENCE AS A NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN SATISFAC-45 TORY TO THE BOARD AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS; 4. EXAMINATION: PASS AN EXAMINATION SATISFACTORY TO THE BOARD AND IN 46 47 ACCORDANCE WITH THE COMMISSIONER'S REGULATIONS WHICH MAY INCLUDE THE 48 NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIANS LICENSING EXAMINATION OR ITS SUCCESSOR; OR OTHER 49 TEST THAT MAINTAINS THE STANDARDS GENERALLY ACCEPTED NATIONALLY;

50 5. AGE: BE AT LEAST TWENTY-ONE YEARS OF AGE;

51 6. CITIZENSHIP OR IMMIGRATION STATUS: BE A UNITED STATES CITIZEN OR AN ALIEN LAWFULLY ADMITTED FOR PERMANENT RESIDENCE IN THE UNITED STATES; 52 PROVIDED, HOWEVER THAT THE BOARD OF REGENTS MAY GRANT A ONE-TIME THREE 53 54 YEAR WAIVER FOR AN ALIEN NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN TO PRACTICE IN AN AREA 55 WHICH HAS BEEN DESIGNATED BY THE DEPARTMENT AS MEDICALLY UNDERSERVED, 56 EXCEPT THAT THE BOARD OF REGENTS MAY GRANT AN EXTENSION OF SUCH THREE

YEAR WAIVER OF NOT MORE THAN THREE YEARS FOR A NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN

WITH ALIEN CITIZENSHIP STATUS WHO IS COMPLETING A SERVICE OBLIGATION 2 3 AGREEMENT UNDER AN APPROVED VISA WAIVER PROGRAM; 4 7. CHARACTER: BE OF GOOD MORAL CHARACTER AS DETERMINED BY THE DEPART-5 MENT; AND 8. FEES: PAY A FEE AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSIONER TO THE DEPARTMENT 6 7 FOR ADMISSION TO A DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED EXAMINATION AND FOR AN INITIAL 8 LICENSE; A FEE OF TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY-FIVE DOLLARS FOR EACH REEXAMINA-TION; A FEE OF FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS FOR AN INITIAL LICENSE FOR PERSONS 9 10 NOT REQUIRING ADMISSION TO A DEPARTMENT CONDUCTED EXAMINATION; A FEE OF FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY DOLLARS FOR ANY BIENNIAL REGISTRATION PERIOD 11 12 COMMENCING AUGUST FIRST, TWO THOUSAND NINE AND THEREAFTER. 6580. EXEMPT PERSONS. THE FOLLOWING PERSONS UNDER THE FOLLOWING 13 S 14 LIMITATIONS MAY PRACTICE NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE WITHIN THE STATE WITHOUT 15 A LICENSE: 16 1. ANY NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN WHO IS EMPLOYED AS A RESIDENT IN A PUBLIC HOSPITAL, PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED TO SUCH HOSPITAL AND 17 18 IS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN OR OTHER 19 PHYSICIAN LICENSED IN THE STATE; 20 2. ANY NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN WHO IS LICENSED IN A BORDERING STATE AND WHO RESIDES NEAR A BORDER OF THIS STATE, PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS 21 LIMITED IN THIS STATE TO THE VICINITY OF SUCH BORDER AND PROVIDED SUCH 22 NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN DOES NOT MAINTAIN AN OFFICE OR PLACE TO MEET 23 24 PATIENTS OR RECEIVE CALLS WITHIN THIS STATE; 25 3. ANY NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN WHO IS LICENSED IN ANOTHER STATE OR 26 COUNTRY AND WHO IS MEETING A NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN LICENSED IN THIS 27 STATE, FOR PURPOSES OF CONSULTATION, PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED 28 TO SUCH CONSULTATION; 29 4. ANY NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN WHO IS LICENSED IN ANOTHER STATE OR COUNTRY, WHO IS VISITING A MEDICAL SCHOOL OR TEACHING HOSPITAL IN THIS 30 STATE TO RECEIVE NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL OR MEDICAL INSTRUCTION FOR A PERI-31 32 OD NOT TO EXCEED SIX MONTHS OR TO CONDUCT NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL OR MEDICAL INSTRUCTION, PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED TO SUCH INSTRUC-33 TION AND IS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN 34 35 OR OTHER LICENSED PHYSICIAN; 5. ANY NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN WHO IS AUTHORIZED BY A FOREIGN GOVERN-36 37 MENT TO PRACTICE IN RELATION TO ITS DIPLOMATIC, CONSULAR OR MARITIME 38 STAFFS, PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED TO SUCH STAFFS; 39 6. ANY COMMISSIONED NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL OFFICER WHO IS SERVING IN THE 40 UNITED STATES ARMED FORCES OR PUBLIC HEALTH SERVICE OR ANY NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN WHO IS EMPLOYED IN THE UNITED STATES VETERANS ADMINISTRATION, 41 PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED TO SUCH SERVICE OR EMPLOYMENT; 42 43 7. ANY INTERN WHO IS EMPLOYED BY A HOSPITAL AND WHO IS A GRADUATE OF A 44 NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL SCHOOL IN THE UNITED STATES OR CANADA, PROVIDED 45 SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED TO SUCH HOSPITAL AND IS UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF A LICENSED NATUROPATHIC PHYSICIAN OR OTHER LICENSED PHYSICIAN; 46 47 8. ANY NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL STUDENT WHO IS PERFORMING A CLINICAL 48 CLERKSHIP OR SIMILAR FUNCTION IN A HOSPITAL AND WHO IS MATRICULATED IN A 49 NATUROPATHIC MEDICAL SCHOOL WHICH MEETS STANDARDS SATISFACTORY TO THE 50 DEPARTMENT, PROVIDED SUCH PRACTICE IS LIMITED TO SUCH CLERKSHIP OR SIMI-51 LAR FUNCTION IN SUCH HOSPITAL; 9. A PERSON ENGAGED IN THE SALE OF VITAMINS, HEALTH FOODS, DIETARY 52 SUPPLEMENTS, HERBS, OR OTHER PRODUCTS OF NATURE, THE SALE OF WHICH IS 53 54 NOT OTHERWISE PROHIBITED UNDER STATE OR FEDERAL LAW; OR 55 10. A PERSON PROVIDING NUTRITIONAL ADVICE, GIVING ADVICE CONCERNING PROPER NUTRITION, OR GIVING INFORMATION AS TO THE USE AND ROLE OF FOOD 56

1 AND FOOD INGREDIENTS, INCLUDING DIETARY SUPPLEMENTS, EXCEPT THAT PROVID-2 ING NUTRITIONAL ADVICE UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION DOES NOT INCLUDE THE 3 AUTHORITY TO PRACTICE MEDICINE OR SURGERY, TO UNDERTAKE THE TREATMENT OR 4 CURE OF A DISEASE, PAIN, INJURY, DEFORMITY, OR PHYSICAL OR MENTAL CONDI-5 TION, OR TO STATE THAT A PRODUCT MIGHT CURE A DISEASE, PAIN, INJURY, 6 DEFORMITY, OR OTHER CONDITION OTHER THAN PROVIDING NUTRITIONAL SUPPORT 7 FOR THE PERSON.

8 SPECIAL PROVISIONS. 1. A NOT-FOR-PROFIT MEDICAL OR DENTAL S 6581. EXPENSE INDEMNITY CORPORATION OR A HOSPITAL SERVICE CORPORATION ORGAN-9 10 IZED UNDER THE INSURANCE LAW MAY EMPLOY LICENSED NATUROPATHS AND ENTER INTO CONTRACTS WITH PARTNERSHIPS OR MEDICAL CORPORATIONS ORGANIZED UNDER 11 ARTICLE FORTY-FOUR OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, HEALTH MAINTENANCE 12 ORGAN-IZATIONS POSSESSING A CERTIFICATE OF AUTHORITY PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 13 14 FORTY-FOUR OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, PROFESSIONAL CORPORATIONS ORGANIZED 15 UNDER ARTICLE FIFTEEN OF THE BUSINESS CORPORATION LAW OR OTHER GROUPS OF 16 NATUROPATHS TO PRACTICE NATUROPATHIC MEDICINE ON ITS BEHALF FOR PERSONS 17 INSURED UNDER ITS CONTRACTS OR POLICIES.

18 NOTWITHSTANDING ANY INCONSISTENT PROVISION OF ANY GENERAL, SPECIAL 2. 19 OR LOCAL LAW, ANY LICENSED NATUROPATH WHO VOLUNTARILY AND WITHOUT THE 20 EXPECTATION OF MONETARY COMPENSATION RENDERS FIRST AID OR EMERGENCY TREATMENT AT THE SCENE OF AN ACCIDENT OR OTHER EMERGENCY, 21 OUTSIDE A HOSPITAL, DOCTOR'S OFFICE OR ANY OTHER PLACE HAVING PROPER AND NECESSARY 22 MEDICAL EQUIPMENT, TO A PERSON WHO IS UNCONSCIOUS, ILL OR INJURED, SHALL 23 NOT BE LIABLE FOR DAMAGES FOR INJURIES ALLEGED TO HAVE BEEN SUSTAINED BY 24 25 PERSON OR FOR DAMAGES FOR THE DEATH OF SUCH PERSON ALLEGED TO HAVE SUCH OCCURRED BY REASON OF AN ACT OR OMISSION IN THE RENDERING OF SUCH FIRST 26 AID OR EMERGENCY TREATMENT UNLESS IT IS ESTABLISHED THAT SUCH INJURIES 27 28 WERE OR SUCH DEATH WAS CAUSED BY GROSS NEGLIGENCE ON THE PART OF SUCH NATUROPATH. NOTHING IN THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL BE DEEMED OR CONSTRUED TO 29 RELIEVE A LICENSED NATUROPATH FROM LIABILITY FOR DAMAGES FOR INJURIES OR 30 DEATH CAUSED BY AN ACT OR OMISSION ON THE PART OF A NATUROPATH WHILE 31 32 RENDERING PROFESSIONAL SERVICES IN THE NORMAL AND ORDINARY COURSE OF HIS 33 PRACTICE.

3. NO INDIVIDUAL WHO SERVES AS A MEMBER OF:
