AN ACT to amend the arts and cultural affairs law, in relation to auto-  
mated ticket purchasing devices

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-  
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. The arts and cultural affairs law is amended by adding a  
2 new section 23.25 to read as follows:  
3 S 23.25. AUTOMATED TICKET PURCHASING DEVICES. 1. THE TERM "AUTOMATED  
4 TICKET PURCHASING DEVICE" SHALL MEAN A DEVICE OR COMPUTER PROGRAM THAT  
5 NAVIGATES THROUGH TICKET WEBSITES AND BYPASSES CERTAIN SECURITY MEASURES  
6 IN ORDER TO PURCHASE LARGE QUANTITIES OF TICKETS. SUCH TERM SHALL  
7 INCLUDE THE USE OF SOFTWARE APPLICATIONS THAT RUN AUTOMATED TASKS OVER  
8 THE INTERNET.  
9 2. ANY PERSON WHO UTILIZES AN AUTOMATED TICKET PURCHASING DEVICE TO  
10 PURCHASE TICKETS SHALL BE GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR, PUNISHABLE BY  
11 A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS.  
12 3. ANY PERSON WHO SUPERVISES THE OPERATION OF AN AUTOMATED TICKET  
13 PURCHASING MACHINE OR WHO RECEIVES ANY MONETARY GAINS FROM SUCH OPERA-  
14 TION SHALL BE GUILTY OF A CLASS B MISDEMEANOR, PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF  
15 NOT MORE THAN ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS.  
16 4. ANY PERSON WHO POSSESSES AN AUTOMATED TICKET PURCHASING MACHINE  
17 SHALL BE GUILTY OF A VIOLATION, PUNISHABLE BY A FINE OF NOT MORE THAN  
18 FIVE HUNDRED DOLLARS.  
19 S 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall  
20 have become a law.
