AN ACT to amend the elder law, in relation to establishing a senior housing task force

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The elder law is amended by adding a new section 203-a to 2 read as follows:

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203-A. SENIOR HOUSING TASK FORCE. 1. THERE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED WITHIN THE OFFICE A SENIOR HOUSING TASK FORCE WHICH SHALL MEET AT LEAST FOUR TIMES IN DIFFERENT GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS OF THE STATE. THE TASK FORCE SHALL CONSIST OF SEVENTEEN MEMBERS AND SHALL INCLUDE REPRESENTATIVES FROM THE FOLLOWING STATE AGENCIES: THE OFFICE FOR THE AGING, THE DIVI-HOUSING AND COMMUNITY RENEWAL, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE OFFICE OF MENTAL HEALTH, THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, THE OFFICE OF MENTAL RETARDATION EMPIRE STATE AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, THE DIVISION OF PROTECTIVE SERVICES FOR ADULTS OF THE OFFICE OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES, AND THE NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT FOR THE AGING. OF THE EIGHT REMAINING MEMBERS, THE ASSEMBLY, THREE SHALL BE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE APPOINTED BY THE SENATE, ONE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND ONE SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE, AND SHALL BROADLY REPRE-

SENT HOUSING AND SENIOR CITIZEN GROUPS FROM ALL GEOGRAPHIC AREAS OF THE

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STATE INCLUDING SERVICE PROVIDERS, ASSOCIATIONS, ADVOCATES, PROPRIETORS, AND CONSUMERS OF FOR-PROFIT AND NOT-FOR-PROFIT SENIOR HOUSING OPTIONS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO: ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES, ADULT HOMES, SKILLED NURSING FACILITIES, INDEPENDENT LIVING FACILITIES, NATURALLY 5 OCCURRING RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES, NEIGHBORHOOD NATURALLY OCCURRING 6 RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES, AND CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES. 7 MEMBERS SHALL RECEIVE NO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES BUT SHALL BE 8 REIMBURSED FOR TRAVEL AND OTHER EXPENSES ACTUALLY AND NECESSARILY INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES. THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE 9 10 CO-CHAIRED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE AND THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DIVISION OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY RENEWAL. THE TASK FORCE IS RESPONSIBLE 11 FOR CONDUCTING A STATE-WIDE ASSESSMENT OF SENIOR HOUSING NEEDS TAKING 12 INTO CONSIDERATION THE VARIOUS GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS AND DIFFERENT NEEDS OF 13 14 THE SENIORS IN THOSE AREAS AND RESOURCES AVAILABLE IN THOSE DIFFERENT AREAS AND PROJECT THOSE NEEDS OVER THE NEXT TEN YEARS; OTHER FACTORS WHICH SHALL BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION ARE: HEALTH CARE NEEDS OF 16 SENIORS, THE LONG TERM CARE NEEDS OF SENIORS, FINANCIAL RESOURCES AVAIL-17 ABLE TO SENIORS, OR NEEDED BY SENIORS, AND TRANSPORTATION NEEDS OF 18 19 SENIORS. THE ASSESSMENT SHALL INCLUDE A REVIEW OF INNOVATIVE APPROACHES 20 SUCCESSFULLY BEING IMPLEMENTED IN OTHER STATES AND THEIR POTENTIAL FOR 21 IMPLEMENTATION IN THIS STATE. SUCH ASSESSMENT SHALL ALSO DEVELOP A VIABLE PLAN FOR PROVIDING QUALITY SENIOR HOUSING TO MEET THE PROJECTED NEEDS OF SENIORS WITH ACTIONS, STEPS AND TIME FRAMES. 23 24

- 2. THE TASK FORCE SHALL ISSUE A REPORT BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN OUTLINING ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS INCLUDING THE STATE PLAN WITH TIME FRAMES. THE REPORT SHALL BE DELIVERED TO THE GOVERNOR, THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIRPERSONS OF THE AGING, HEALTH AND HOUSING COMMITTEES IN THE ASSEMBLY, AND THE CHAIRPERSONS OF THE AGING, HEALTH AND HOUSING, CONSTRUCTION, AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEES IN THE SENATE.
- 31 S 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 32 have become a law.
