AN ACT to amend the civil rights law, in relation to civilian complaint review boards

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 50-a of the civil rights law, as 2 amended by chapter 137 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as 3 follows:

4 1. All personnel records, used to evaluate performance toward contin-5 ued employment or promotion, under the control of any police agency or 6 department of the state or any political subdivision thereof including authorities or agencies maintaining police forces of individuals defined 7 8 police officers in section 1.20 of the criminal procedure law and as 9 such personnel records under the control of a sheriff's department or a department of correction of individuals employed as correction officers 10 and such personnel records under the control of a paid fire department 11 12 force individuals employed or of as firefighters or 13 firefighter/paramedics and such personnel records under the control of 14 the division of parole for individuals defined as peace officers pursu-15 ant to subdivisions twenty-three and twenty-three-a of section 2.10 of criminal procedure law shall be considered confidential and not 16 the 17 subject to inspection or review without the express written consent of such police officer, firefighter, firefighter/paramedic, correction 18 19 officer or peace officer within the division of parole except as may be 20 lawful court order, AND EXCEPT THAT A MEMBER OF A CIVILIAN mandated by 21 COMPLAINT REVIEW BOARD THAT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR INVESTIGATING POLICE 22 MISCONDUCT MAY PETITION THE COURT FOR AN ORDER PERMITTING DISCLOSURE OF 23 ALL PERSONNEL RECORDS IF THOSE RECORDS RELATE OFFICER TO AN WHO WAS 24 INVOLVED IN A POLICE SHOOTING OR POLICE MISCONDUCT. 25 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
