AN ACT to amend the tax law, in relation to the definition of qualified historic home for the purposes of the historic homeownership rehabilitation credit

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph (A) of paragraph 5 of subsection (pp) of section 606 of the tax law, as added by chapter 547 of the laws of 2006, is amended to read as follows:

- (A) The term "qualified historic home" means, for purposes of this subsection, a certified historic structure located within New York state:
 - (i) which has been substantially rehabilitated,

- 8 (ii) which, or any portion of which, is owned, in whole or part, by 9 the taxpayer, 10 (iii) in which the taxpayer resides during the taxable year in which
 - (iii) in which the taxpayer resides during the taxable year in which the taxpayer is allowed a credit under this subsection, and
- which is [in whole or in part a targeted area residence within 12 the meaning of section 143(j) of the internal revenue code and] located 13 within an area of a city, town or village whose governing body has iden-14 tified by resolution that such area is in need of community renewal 15 because of deteriorated and/or vacant buildings and, by local law, 16 adopted a historic preservation and community renewal program to 17 preserve and/or revitalize such area. A historic preservation and commu-18 19 nity renewal program is a program that coordinates all applicable 20 governmental benefits and programs with the aims of preserving and/or 21 revitalizing neighborhoods, encouraging property owners to complete

substantial rehabilitation projects and promoting smart growth economic development. Such local laws shall be filed with the office of parks,

- recreation and historic preservation. The office of parks, recreation and historic preservation shall assist local governments in developing historic preservation and community renewal programs.

 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
