AN ACT authorizing the commissioner of the office of children and family services to study the implementation of a child daycare rating system

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Legislative findings and purpose. The legislature finds and
2 declares that with the increase in the number of single parent house-
3 holds and the growing number of households in which both parents work at
4 least part-time, the number of children in daycare programs has grown
5 significantly. While parents can be assured that a state licensed
6 program has met minimal health, safety, and educational requirements,
7 that does not insure that the program will necessarily meet all of the
8 educational needs of each child. Currently there are few ways for
9 parents to evaluate the quality of the programs available to them and
10 their children. There are a number of states in the United States which
11 currently have daycare center rating programs, which provide a rating
12 scale based on specific criteria. The ratings that each daycare center
13 receives are posted on web sites, and available to parents to help guide
14 them in choosing the daycare center which is most appropriate for their
15 children's needs. We feel that because the years from birth to age five
16 are the most critical years for a child's establishment of healthy
17 thinking and learning skills, social development and both interest in
18 and interaction with the world around them, it is in the state's best
19 interests, and society as a whole, to provide parents with as much
20 information as possible about the quality of daycare programs available
21 to their children.

22 S 2. The commissioner of the office of children and family services is
23 hereby authorized and directed to prepare or have prepared, a study on
24 implementing a child daycare rating system throughout New York state.

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets

1 Such study shall include, but not be limited to: (a) the type of rating
2 scales used in other states and which one would be the most effective
3 for use in New York state; (b) the method in which the program would be
4 administered; (c) how such information would be made available to
5 parents and the general public; and (d) the cost of operating such a
6 program.

7 S 3. The findings and results of the study shall be delivered, in the
8 form of a report, to the governor, the temporary president of the
9 senate, and the speaker of the assembly within 12 months of the effec-
10 tive date of this act. The report shall also include recommended legis-
11 lation that will assist in the timely implementation of a child daycare
12 rating system.

13 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
