AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to creating a youth employment and career development program and making an appropriation therefor

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 2590-g of the education law is amended by adding a
2 new subdivision 7 to read as follows:

3 7. A. ESTABLISH A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM, AS
4 FOLLOWS:

5 (1) THERE SHALL BE A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
6 ADMINISTERED BY THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. THE PROGRAM SHALL ENCOURAGE THE
7 DEVELOPMENT OF PART TIME AND FULL TIME JOBS FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS AND
8 GRADUATES, PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH JOB TRAINING, PLACEMENT SERVICES AND
9 CAREER COUNSELING AND ASSIST HIGH SCHOOL FACULTY IN DEVELOPING AND
10 IMPLEMENTING A CURRICULUM TO PROVIDE STUDENTS WITH WORK-COMPETENCY
11 TRAINING.

12 (2) SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF PARAGRAPH C OF THIS SUBDIVISION, EACH
13 HIGH SCHOOL IN NEW YORK CITY MAY HAVE A YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER
14 DEVELOPMENT OFFICE STAFFED BY A JOB COORDINATOR, A CAREER SPECIALIST AND
15 SUCH SUPPORT STAFF AS PERMITTED BY BUDGET ALLOCATIONS THEREFOR.

16 (3) THE JOB COORDINATOR SHALL:

17 (I) ACT AS LIAISON BETWEEN THE DIRECTORS OF ALL EMPLOYMENT-RELATED
18 PROGRAMS WITHIN THE SCHOOL, INCLUDING COOPERATIVE EDUCATION PROGRAMS,
19 TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES PROGRAMS AND SCHOOL TO EMPLOYMENT PROGRAMS;

20 (II) CONDUCT JOB AND CAREER FAIRS;

21 (III) ORGANIZE FIELD TRIPS TO BUSINESSES AND THE NEW YORK CITY JOB AND
22 CAREER CENTER;

1 (IV) WORK CLOSELY WITH THE NEW YORK CITY BOARD OF EDUCATION WORK EXPE-
2 RIENCE AND TRAINING UNIT; AND
3 (V) COMPILE AND MAINTAIN CURRENT LISTS OF ALL JOBS AVAILABLE TO BE
4 FILLED BY PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS INCLUDING FULL TIME AND PART TIME EMPLOY-
5 MENT OPPORTUNITIES.
6 (4) THE JOB DEVELOPER SHALL:
7 (I) SOLICIT EMPLOYMENT OPPORTUNITIES FOR HIGH SCHOOL STUDENTS FROM
8 EMPLOYERS REPRESENTING THE PUBLIC SECTOR, PRIVATE SECTOR,
9 COMMUNITY-BASED ORGANIZATIONS AND INTERNSHIP PROGRAMS;
10 (II) ENDEAVOR TO INCREASE INTERNSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AND DEVELOP OTHER
11 WORK-EXPERIENCE PROGRAMS FOR STUDENTS;
12 (III) ASSIST PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IN SECURING FULL TIME AND PART TIME
13 SCHOOL YEAR AND SUMMER EMPLOYMENT;
14 (IV) PROVIDE TRAINING IN RESUME DRAFTING AND INTERVIEWING SKILLS TO
15 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS;
16 (V) ASSIST SCHOOL OFFICIALS TO DEVELOP FLEXIBLE ACADEMIC SCHEDULES FOR
17 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS TO FACILITATE THE COMPLETION OF HIGH SCHOOL WHILE
18 THE STUDENT IS EMPLOYED;
19 (VI) ACT AS AN ADVOCATE FOR PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS IF DIFFICULTIES ARISE
20 IN THE WORKPLACE; AND
21 (VII) CONTINUE TO PROVIDE JOB PLACEMENT AND COUNSELING SERVICES TO
22 PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS ONE YEAR SUBSEQUENT TO GRADUATION.
23 (5) ALL PROGRAM STAFF SHALL BE EMPLOYED PURSUANT TO APPLICABLE CITY
24 AND STATE REGULATIONS.

25 B. PROVIDE PROGRAM FACILITIES. EACH SCHOOL OPERATING A YOUTH EMPLOY-
26 MENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM SHALL BE EQUIPPED WITH AN OFFICE OR
27 CLASSROOM TO ACCOMMODATE PROGRAM STAFF. THE OFFICE SHALL CONTAIN APPRO-
28 PRIATE FURNITURE, CARPETING, TELEPHONES, TELEFAX MACHINES, COPYING
29 MACHINES AND OTHER OFFICE SUPPLIES NECESSARY TO ESTABLISH THE ATMOSPHERE
30 OF A MODERN BUSINESS OFFICE. THIS OFFICE SHALL BE OPENED EIGHT HOURS PER
31 DAY, ON A YEAR-ROUND BASIS, AND SHALL BE USED TO ACCOMMODATE PROGRAM
32 STAFF AND TO FACILITATE STUDENT CAREER TRAINING AND COUNSELING.

33 C. IMPLEMENT SUCH PROGRAM. ANY HIGH SCHOOL PRINCIPAL WISHING TO IMPL-
34 MENT THE YOUTH EMPLOYMENT AND CAREER DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM IN HIS OR HER
35 HIGH SCHOOL SHALL SUBMIT A WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE CHANCELLOR OF THE
36 BOARD OF EDUCATION FOR SUCH PROGRAM. THE CHANCELLOR SHALL SELECT THE
37 HIGH SCHOOLS IN WHICH THE PROGRAM SHALL BE IMPLEMENTED. THE CHANCELLOR
38 SHALL TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY TO IMPLEMENT THE PROGRAM IN THE SELECTED
39 SCHOOLS IN A PROMPT MANNER; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT, ONE YEAR AFTER THE
40 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED IN NO
41 MORE THAN THIRTY-TWO NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOLS. WITHIN TWO YEARS AFTER
42 THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE IMPLEMENTED
43 IN NO MORE THAN SIXTY-FOUR NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOLS; AND WITHIN THREE
44 YEARS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, THE PROGRAM MAY BE
45 IMPLEMENTED IN EVERY NEW YORK CITY HIGH SCHOOL.

46 S 2. The sum of seven million five hundred thousand dollars
47 (\$7,500,000), or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appro-
48 priated to the department of education from any monies in the state
49 treasury in the general fund to the credit of the local assistance
50 account for purposes of providing for the state's share of the necessary
51 appropriation to the board of education of the city of New York for the
52 operation of the youth employment and career development program estab-
53 lished by this act provided, however, that no expenditure shall be made
54 available from this appropriation for any purpose unless and until an
55 appropriation to such board of education of the city of New York is made
56 by such city and then only in amounts matching such moneys paid to such

1 board of education. Such sum shall be payable on the audit and warrant
2 of the state comptroller on vouchers certified or approved by the
3 commissioner of education, or his duly designated representative in the
4 manner provided by law. Consistent with the foregoing provisions of this
5 act, no expenditure shall be made from this appropriation until a
6 certificate of approval of availability shall have been issued by the
7 director of the budget and filed with the state comptroller and a copy
8 filed with the chairman of the senate finance committee and the chairman
9 of the assembly ways and means committee. Such certificate may be
10 amended from time to time by the director of the budget and a copy of
11 each such amendment shall be filed with the state comptroller, the
12 chairman of the senate finance committee and the chairman of the assem-
13 bly ways and means committee.

14 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately; provided, however, that
15 the amendments to section 2590-g of the education law made by section
16 one of this act shall survive the expiration and reversion of such
17 section as provided by section 34 of chapter 91 of the laws of 2002, as
18 amended.
