AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to allowing dental hygienists to perform block anesthesia

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 6606 of the education law, as amended by chapter 437 of the laws of 2001, is amended to read as follows:

- The practice of the profession of dental hygiene is defined as the performance of dental services which shall include removing calcareous deposits, accretions and stains from the exposed surfaces of the teeth which begin at the epithelial attachment and applying topical agents indicated for a complete dental prophylaxis, removing cement, placing or removing rubber dam, removing sutures, placing matrix band, providing patient education, applying topical medication, placing and X-ray films, performing topical fluoride applications and topical anesthetic applications, polishing teeth, taking medical history, caries, taking impressions for study casts, placing and removing temporary restorations, administering and monitoring nitrous oxide analgesia and administering and monitoring local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia, subject to certification in accordance with section sixty-six hundred five-b of this article, and any other function in the definition of the practice of dentistry as may be delegated by a licensed dentist in accordance with regulations promulgated by the commissioner. tice of dental hygiene may be conducted in the office of any licensed dentist or in any appropriately equipped school or public institution but must be done under the supervision of a licensed dentist.

1 S 6605-b. Dental hygiene restricted local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia/nitrous oxide analgesia certificate. 1. A dental hygienist shall not administer or monitor nitrous oxide analgesia or local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia in the practice of dental hygiene without a dental hygiene restricted local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia/nitrous 5 6 oxide analgesia certificate and except under the personal supervision of 7 dentist and in conjunction with the performance of dental hygiene procedures authorized by law and in accordance with regulations promulgated by the commissioner. Personal supervision, for purposes of this 9 10 section, means that the supervising dentist remains in the dental office 11 where the local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia or nitrous oxide analgesia services are being performed, personally authorizes and prescribes the use of local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia or nitrous 12 13 14 oxide analgesia for the patient and, before dismissal of the patient, 15 personally examines the condition of the patient after the use of local BLOCK anesthesia or nitrous oxide analgesia is 16 infiltration OR 17 completed. It is professional misconduct for a dentist to fail 18 provide the supervision required by this section, and any dentist found 19 guilty of such misconduct under the procedures prescribed in section sixty-five hundred ten of this title shall be subject to the penalties 20 21 prescribed in section sixty-five hundred eleven of this title. 22

- 2. The commissioner shall promulgate regulations establishing standards and procedures for the issuance of such certificate. Such standards shall require completion of an educational program and/or course of training or experience sufficient to ensure that a dental hygienist specifically trained in the administration and monitoring of nitrous oxide analgesia and local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia, the possible effects of such use, and in the recognition of and response to possible emergency situations.
- 3. The fee for a dental hygiene restricted local infiltration OR BLOCK anesthesia/nitrous oxide analgesia certificate shall be twenty-five dollars and shall be paid on a triennial basis upon renewal of such certificate. A certificate may be suspended or revoked in the same manner as a license to practice dental hygiene.
 - S 3. This act shall take effect January 1, 2010.
