AN ACT to amend the general municipal law, in relation to giving the city of Rochester the power to prefer minority and women-owned businesses in awarding public contracts

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 103 of the general municipal law, as amended by chapter 741 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as follows:

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3 1. Except as otherwise expressly provided by an act of the legislature or by a local law adopted prior to September first, nineteen hundred fifty-three, all contracts for public work involving an expenditure of 7 more than twenty thousand dollars and all purchase contracts involving 8 an expenditure of more than ten thousand dollars, shall be awarded by the appropriate officer, board or agency of a political subdivision or 9 of any district therein including but not limited to a soil conservation 10 district, to the lowest responsible bidder furnishing the required secu-11 rity after advertisement for sealed bids in the manner provided by this 12 13 section. In any case where a responsible bidder's gross price is reduciby an allowance for the value of used machinery, equipment, appara-14 tus or tools to be traded in by a political subdivision, the gross price 15 16 shall be reduced by the amount of such allowance, for the purpose of 17 determining the low bid. In cases where two or more responsible bidders 18 furnishing the required security submit identical bids as to price, such 19 officer, board or agency may award the contract to any of such bidders. 20 Such officer, board or agency may, in his or its discretion, reject all bids and readvertise for new bids in the manner provided by this 21 HOWEVER, 22 section; PROVIDED, THAT IN THE CITY OF ROCHESTER, FOR PUBLIC 23 WORKS AND PURCHASE CONTRACTS UP TO ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS, 24 CONTRACTS MAY BE AWARDED TO A MINORITY OR WOMAN-OWNED BUSINESS CERTIFIED

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AS SUCH BY THE STATE OF NEW YORK AND LOCATED WITHIN THE ROCHESTER METRO-AREA, AS LONG AS SUCH AWARD IS BASED ON CONTRACTOR POLITAN STATISTICAL 3 SUBMISSIONS IN RESPONSE TO A REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS AND MADE PURSUANT MINORITY AND WOMAN-OWNED BUSINESS ENTERPRISE PROGRAM LAWFULLY ADOPTED 5 BY THE CITY OF ROCHESTER. For purposes of this section, "sealed bids", as that term applies to purchase contracts, shall include bids submitted 6 7 an electronic format, provided that the governing board of the poli-8 tical subdivision or district, by resolution, has authorized the receipt of bids in such format. Submission in electronic format may not, howev-9 10 be required as the sole method for the submission of bids. Bids submitted in an electronic format shall be transmitted by bidders to the 11 12 receiving device designated by the political subdivision or district. 13 method used to receive electronic bids shall comply with article 14 three of the state technology law, and any rules and regulations promul-15 gated and guidelines developed thereunder and, at a minimum, must 16 document the time and date of receipt of each bid received electronically; (b) authenticate the identity of the sender; 17 (c) ensure the 18 security of the information transmitted; and (d) ensure the confidentiality of the bid until the time and date established for the opening 19 20 bids. The timely submission of an electronic bid in compliance with 21 instructions provided for such submission in the advertisement for bids 22 and/or the specifications shall be the responsibility solely of each bidder or prospective bidder. No political subdivision or district ther-23 ein shall incur any liability from delays of or interruptions in the 24 25 receiving device designated for the submission and receipt of electronic 26 bids.

27 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately; provided that the amend-28 ments to subdivision 1 of section 103 of the general municipal law made 29 by section one of this act shall not affect the expiration of such 30 subdivision and shall be deemed to expire therewith.
