- AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to changing the state fiscal year from the first of April to the first of June and requiring revisions of the consensus forecast of the economy, estimates of receipts for the current and the ensuing state fiscal year and the joint report of the director of the budget and the secretary of the senate finance committee and the secretary of the assembly ways and means committee, and directing the state comptroller to provide estimates for receipts for the current and ensuing state fiscal year; and to amend the education law, in relation to the timing and notice of annual elections in school districts and the submission of a property tax report card

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 3 of the state finance law, as added by chapter 1 1 of the laws of 1943 and as separately renumbered by chapters 405 and 957 2 3 of the laws of 1981, is amended to read as follows: 1. The current fiscal year of the state which 4 S 3. Fiscal year. 5 commenced with the first day of [July, nineteen hundred forty-two] б APRIL, TWO THOUSAND TEN, is hereby [abridged] EXTENDED and shall end with the thirty-first day of [March, nineteen hundred forty-three] MAY, 7

8 TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN. For all purposes of determining annual increments 9 of state employees pursuant to the education law, the civil service law 10 or other state law, and for all purposes whenever by law some act is to 11 be performed or time is to be measured by the fiscal year of the state,

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1 the current fiscal year, as so [abridged] EXTENDED, shall be deemed to 2 be a full year unless the context clearly requires a contrary 3 construction.

4 On and after the first day of [April, nineteen hundred forty-three] JUNE, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, the fiscal year of the state, for the purpose 5 6 of budget, appropriations, receipts and disbursements of state moneys 7 and all other state affairs which are regulated in accordance with or 8 based on fiscal years, including the fiscal affairs of all state departments, commissions, boards, agencies, offices and institutions, shall 9 10 begin with the first day of [April] JUNE and end with the next following 11 thirty-first day of [March] MAY.

12 2. All books and accounts in the offices of the comptroller and the 13 department of taxation and finance shall be kept by fiscal years. All 14 annual accounts required to be rendered to the comptroller or to such 15 department by any person shall be closed on the thirty-first day of 16 [March] MAY in each year, and be rendered as soon thereafter as practi-17 cable, if no time is specially prescribed by law.

18 3. Where any statute provides, in terms or effect, that any inventory or account, or a report relating in whole or in part to receipts and 19 disbursements of money, be made to the legislature or any state officer 20 21 annually, or for a year, by a department, commission, board, or officer under the state government, such inventory or account, and such report 22 23 so far as it relates to such receipts and disbursements, shall be for 24 the preceding fiscal year, unless the calendar year be expressly 25 mentioned.

26 4. Existing provisions of other laws describing or referring to a fiscal year of the state as beginning [July] APRIL first and ending [June thirtieth] MARCH THIRTY-FIRST, or making any requirement with 27 28 29 respect to such fiscal year, or referring to any year so beginning and ending which applies to inventories or accounts in state matters, or to 30 reports relating to state money or property, shall be deemed modified by 31 32 and be construed in connection with this section, and be deemed to refer 33 to a fiscal or to another year or period beginning and ending as [herein] prescribed IN THIS SECTION for a fiscal year. 34

35 S 2. Subdivision 6 of section 23 of the state finance law, as amended 36 by chapter 1 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as follows:

37 6. Consensus economic and revenue forecasting conference; report. (a) 38 (1) By the end of February in each year, prior to the report required by 39 paragraph (b) of this subdivision, the chairperson and ranking minority 40 member of the senate finance committee, the chairperson and ranking minority member of the assembly ways and means committee and the direc-41 tor of the budget shall jointly convene a consensus economic and revenue 42 43 forecasting conference in the form of a joint legislative-executive 44 hearing, for the purpose of assisting the governor and the legislature 45 in reaching the consensus revenue forecast required by paragraph (b) of this subdivision. The conveners of the conference shall invite the state 46 47 comptroller and such other participants to the conference as shall, in 48 their judgment, provide guidance on the current conditions in, and probable outlook for the performance of, the economy of the state, as well as the effect of such conditions and such performance on state receipts. 49 50 51 (2) ON OR AFTER APRIL FIFTEENTH, THE CHAIRPERSON AND RANKING MINORITY 52 MEMBER OF THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE, THE CHAIRPERSON AND RANKING MINORITY MEMBER OF THE ASSEMBLY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE AND THE DIREC-53 54 TOR OF THE BUDGET SHALL JOINTLY RECONVENE TO REVISE THE CONSENSUS FORE-55 ECONOMY AND ESTIMATES OF RECEIPTS FOR THE CURRENT AND THE CAST OF THE 56 ENSUING STATE FISCAL YEAR. THE REVISED CONSENSUS FORECAST OF THE ECONOMY

1 AND ESTIMATES OF RECEIPTS SHALL INCORPORATE THE MOST CURRENT TAX REVENUE 2 AND ANY OTHER PERTINENT FISCAL INFORMATION.

Such estimates of for 8 receipts shall include, but not be limited to: expected tax receipts on 9 an all-funds basis, projected lottery receipts, and anticipated miscel-10 laneous receipts to be received in the general fund. The estimate of 11 receipts for the ensuing fiscal year contained in the report, shall be 12 all receipts from such sources described in this subdivision available to make disbursements authorized by the appropriation bills submitted by 13 14 the governor pursuant to section three of article seven of the constitu-15 tion for the ensuing fiscal year.

16 (2) ON OR BEFORE MAY FIRST IN EACH YEAR, THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUDGET 17 AND THE SECRETARY OF THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE SECRETARY OF 18 THE ASSEMBLY WAYS AND MEANS COMMITTEE SHALL ISSUE A REVISED VERSION OF 19 THE JOINT REPORT THAT WAS INITIALLY DUE BY MARCH FIRST AND THAT CONTAINS 20 A CONSENSUS FORECAST OF THE ECONOMY AND ESTIMATES OF RECEIPTS.

21 (c) (1) On a failure of the director of the budget, the secretary of 22 senate finance committee and the secretary of the assembly ways and the 23 means committee to issue a joint report containing a consensus forecast provided in paragraph (b) of this subdivision, the state comptroller 24 as 25 shall, on or before March fifth, provide estimates of receipts for the 26 current and the ensuing state fiscal year. Such estimates shall include, but not be limited to, expected tax receipts on an all-funds basis, projected lottery receipts, and miscellaneous receipts to be received in 27 28 the general fund. In rendering his or her estimate, as required in this 29 paragraph, the comptroller shall give due consideration to the inherent 30 risks in economic and revenue forecasting and the interest of the state 31 32 maintain budget balance throughout the fiscal year. The estimate of to 33 receipts for the ensuing fiscal year provided by the state comptroller, 34 shall be all receipts from such sources available to make disbursements 35 authorized by the appropriation bills submitted by the governor pursuant to section three of article seven of the constitution for 36 the ensuing fiscal year. 37

38 (2) ON A FAILURE OF THE DIRECTOR OF THE BUDGET AND THE SECRETARY OF 39 THE SENATE FINANCE COMMITTEE AND THE SECRETARY OF THE ASSEMBLY WAYS AND 40 MEANS COMMITTEE TO ISSUE A JOINT REPORT REVISING THE MARCH FIRST CONSEN-COMPTROLLER SHALL, 41 SUS FORECAST THE STATE ON OR BEFORE MAY FIFTH, PROVIDE ESTIMATES FOR RECEIPTS FOR THE CURRENT AND ENSUING STATE 42 FISCAL 43 YEAR. SUCH ESTIMATES SHALL INCORPORATE THE MOST CURRENT TAX REVENUE AND 44 ANY OTHER PERTINENT FISCAL INFORMATION.

45 S 3. Subdivision 1 of section 2022 of the education law, as amended by 46 section 8 of part C of chapter 58 of the laws of 1998, is amended to 47 read as follows:

48 1. Notwithstanding any law, rule or regulation to the contrary, PRIOR 49 TO TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, the election of trustees or members of the board 50 of education, and the vote upon the appropriation of the necessary funds 51 to meet the estimated expenditures, in any common school district, union free school district, central school district or central high school 52 district shall be held at the annual meeting and election on the third 53 54 Tuesday in May, provided, however, that such election shall be held on 55 second Tuesday in May if the commissioner at the request of a local the school board certifies no later than March first that such election 56

would conflict with religious observances. COMMENCING IN TWO THOUSAND 1 2 ELEVEN, THE ELECTION OF TRUSTEES OR MEMBERS OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION. 3 THE VOTE UPON THE APPROPRIATION OF THE NECESSARY FUNDS TO MEET THE AND 4 ESTIMATED EXPENDITURES, IN ANY COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT, UNION FREE SCHOOL 5 DISTRICT, CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT OR CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL 6 BE HELD AT THE ANNUAL MEETING AND ELECTION ON THE FOURTH TUESDAY IN 7 JUNE. When such election or vote is taken by recording the ayes and noes 8 the qualified voters attending, a majority of the qualified voters of present and voting, by a hand or voice vote, may determine to take up 9 10 the question of voting the necessary funds to meet the estimated expend-11 itures for a specific item separately, and the qualified voters present and voting may increase the amount of any estimated expenditures or reduce the same, except for teachers' salaries, and the ordinary contin-12 13 14 expenses of the schools. The sole trustee, board of trustees or qent 15 board of education of every common, union free, central or central high 16 school district and every city school district to which this article applies shall hold a budget hearing not less than seven nor more than 17 18 fourteen days prior to the annual meeting and election or special 19 district meeting at which a school budget vote will occur, and shall prepare and present to the voters at such budget hearing a proposed school district budget for the ensuing school year. 20 21

22 S 4. Subdivision 2 of section 2601-a of the education law, as amended 23 by section 6 of part M of chapter 57 of the laws of 2005, is amended to 24 read as follows:

25 2. The board of education shall conduct all annual and special school 26 district meetings for the purpose of adopting a school district budget in the same manner as a union free school district in accordance with 27 the provisions of article forty-one of this title, except as otherwise 28 provided by this section. [The] PRIOR TO TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, THE annual 29 meeting and election of each such city school district shall be held on 30 the third Tuesday of May in each year, provided, however that such annu-31 32 meeting and election shall be held on the second Tuesday in May if al 33 the commissioner at the request of a local school board certifies no later than March first that such election would conflict with religious 34 35 observances, and any school budget revote shall be held on the date and 36 the same manner specified in subdivision three of section two thouin 37 sand seven of this title. PRIOR TO TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN, THE ANNUAL MEET-ING AND ELECTION OF EACH SUCH CITY SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL BE HELD ON 38 THE 39 THIRD TUESDAY OF MAY IN EACH YEAR, PROVIDED, HOWEVER THAT SUCH ANNUAL 40 MEETING AND ELECTION SHALL BE HELD ON THE SECOND TUESDAY IN MAY ΙF THE COMMISSIONER AT THE REQUEST OF A LOCAL SCHOOL BOARD CERTIFIES NO LATER 41 THAN MARCH FIRST THAT SUCH ELECTION WOULD CONFLICT WITH RELIGIOUS OBSER-42 43 VANCES, AND ANY SCHOOL BUDGET REVOTE SHALL BE HELD ON THE DATE AND IN 44 THE SAME MANNER SPECIFIED IN SUBDIVISION THREE OF SECTION TWO THOUSAND 45 SEVEN OF THIS TITLE. The provisions of this article, and where applicable subdivisions nine and nine-a of section twenty-five hundred two of 46 47 this title, governing the qualification and registration of voters, and 48 procedures for the nomination and election of members of the board of education shall continue to apply, and shall govern the qualification 49 50 registration of voters and voting procedures with respect to the and 51 adoption of a school district budget.

52 S 5. Subdivision 1 of section 2003 of the education law, as amended by 53 chapter 64 of the laws of 1993, is amended to read as follows:

1. The district clerk of each common school district shall give notice 55 of the availability of the statement of expenditures pursuant to the 56 provisions of section sixteen hundred eight of this chapter and shall

also give notice of the time and place of the annual meeting by publish-1 2 ing a notice [four] TWO times within the [seven] THREE weeks next 3 preceding such annual meeting, the first publication to be at least 4 [forty-five] EIGHTEEN days before said meeting, in two newspapers if there shall be two, or in one newspaper if there shall be but one, having general circulation within such district. But if no newspaper 5 6 7 shall then have general circulation therein, the said notice shall be 8 posted in at least twenty of the most public places in said district 9 forty-five days before the time of such meeting. THE CLERK OF EACH 10 COMMON SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL POST PREDOMINATELY ON THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S THE NOTICE OF THE AVAILABILITY OF THE STATEMENT OF 11 OFFICIAL WEBSITE 12 EXPENDITURES PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION SIXTEEN HUNDRED EIGHT 13 OF THIS CHAPTER, AND SHALL ALSO POST PREDOMINATELY ON THE SCHOOL 14 DISTRICT'S OFFICIAL WEBSITE THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE ANNUAL MEETING 15 THROUGHOUT THE THREE WEEKS NEXT PRECEDING SUCH DISTRICT MEETING, THE FIRST PUBLICATION TO BE AT LEAST EIGHTEEN DAYS BEFORE SAID MEETING. 16 S 6. Subdivision 1 of section 2004 of the education law, as amended by 17

18 chapter 68 of the laws of 1994, is amended to read as follows: 19 The clerk of each union free school district shall give notice of 1. 20 the availability of the statement of expenditures pursuant to the 21 provisions of section seventeen hundred sixteen of this chapter and shall also give notice of the time and place of the annual meeting and 22 the notice required by section seventeen hundred sixteen of this chapter 23 24 by publishing a notice [four] TWO times within the [seven] THREE weeks 25 next preceding such district meeting, the first publication to be at 26 least [forty-five] EIGHTEEN days before said meeting, in two newspapers if there shall be two, or in one newspaper if there shall be but one, 27 28 having general circulation within such district. But if no newspaper 29 shall then have general circulation therein, the said notice shall be posted in at least twenty of the most public places in said district 30 31 forty-five days before the time of such meeting. THE CLERK OF EACH 32 UNION FREE SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL POST PREDOMINATELY ON THE SCHOOL 33 DISTRICT'S OFFICIAL WEBSITE THE NOTICE OF THE AVAILABILITY OF THE STATE-34 MENT OF EXPENDITURES PURSUANT TO THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION SEVENTEEN 35 HUNDRED SIXTEEN OF THIS CHAPTER AND SHALL ALSO POST PREDOMINATELY ON THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S OFFICIAL WEBSITE THE TIME AND PLACE OF THE ANNUAL 36 37 MEETING THROUGHOUT THE THREE WEEKS NEXT PRECEDING SUCH DISTRICT MEETING, 38 THE FIRST PUBLICATION TO BE AT LEAST EIGHTEEN DAYS BEFORE SAID MEETING. S 7. Paragraph b of subdivision 7 of section 1608 of the education 39

40 law, as amended by section 4 of part H of chapter 83 of the laws of 41 2002, is amended to read as follows:

42 b. A copy of the property tax report card prepared for the annual 43 district meeting shall be submitted to the department in the manner 44 prescribed by the department by the end of the business day next follow-45 ing approval of the report card by the trustee or board of trustees, but no later than [twenty-four] EIGHTEEN days prior to the statewide uniform 46 47 voting day. The department shall compile such data for all school 48 districts whose budgets are subject to a vote of the qualified voters 49 and shall make such compilation available electronically at least ten 50 days prior to the statewide uniform voting day.

51 S 8. This act shall take effect January 1, 2011.
