AN ACT to amend the social services law, in relation to the annual
service fee for child support

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection 3 of section 111-g of the
2 social services law, as added by section 1 of part Z of chapter 57 of
3 the laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:
4 (a) A person who is receiving child support services pursuant to this
5 section who has never received assistance pursuant to title IV-A of the
6 federal social security act shall be subject to an annual service fee of
7 twenty-five dollars for each child support case if at least five hundred
8 dollars of support has been collected in the federal fiscal year. Where
9 a custodial parent has children with different noncustodial parents, the
10 order payable by each noncustodial parent shall be a separate child
11 support case for the purpose of imposing an annual service fee. The fee
12 shall be [deducted from] PAID BY THE NONCUSTODIAL PARENT, IN ADDITION TO
13 child support payments received on behalf of the individual receiving
14 services.
15 S 2. This act shall take effect April 1, 2009; provided, however, if
16 this act shall become a law after such date it shall take effect imme-
17 diately and shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on and
18 after April 1, 2009; provided, further, however, that the office of
19 temporary and disability assistance is immediately authorized to promul-
20 gate any and all rules and regulations, and take any other measures
21 necessary for the timely implementation of the provisions of this act on
22 its effective date, and is specifically authorized to promulgate emer-
23 gency regulations to implement the collection of the annual service fee
24 from noncustodial parents pursuant to subdivision 3 of section 111-g of
25 the social services law, as amended by section one of this act.
