Introduced by M. of A. SWEENEY -- read once and referred to the Committee on Education

AN ACT to authorize the Copiague union free school district to repay an overpayment of state aid in equal installments over six years

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Notwithstanding any provisions of law to the contrary,  
2 state aid payments in the amount of not more than \$992,411 made to the  
3 Copiague union free school district in the 2006-07 school year, which  
4 included excess payments of building aid of which the district has been  
5 notified, and for which a recovery must be made by the state through  
6 deduction of future aid payments, shall be reduced through aid  
7 deductions totaling such excess payments, by deducting one-sixth of such  
8 excess payments from the payments due to such school district and paya-  
9 ble in the month of June in the years 2009, 2010, 2011, 2012, 2013, and  
10 2014 provided, however, there shall be no interest penalty assessed  
11 against such district or collected by the state, and provided further  
12 that, notwithstanding any other provisions of this act, any pending  
13 payment of moneys due to such district as a prior year adjustment paya-  
14 ble pursuant to paragraph c of subdivision 5 of section 3604 of the  
15 education law for aid claims that had been previously paid in excess as  
16 current aid payments and for which recovery of excess payments is to be  
17 made pursuant to this section, shall be reduced at the time of actual  
18 payment by any remaining unrecovered balance of such excess payments,  
19 and the remaining scheduled deductions of such excess payments pursuant  
20 to this section shall be reduced by the commissioner of education to  
21 reflect the amount so recovered.

22 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
