AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to including Silver Lake within the definition of "inland waterways" for the purposes of waterfront revitalization

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. Subdivision 4 of section 911 of the executive law, as separately amended by chapters 185, 186 and 363 of the laws of 2008 and  
2     paragraph (b) as separately amended by chapter 103 of the laws of 2008,  
3     is amended to read as follows:  
4     4. "Inland waterways" shall mean (a) the state's major inland lakes  
5     consisting of lakes Big Tupper, Black, Canandaigua, Cayuga, Champlain,  
6     Chautauqua, Conesus, Cranberry, George, Great Sacandaga, Honoe, Indian,  
7     Keuka, Long, Oneida, Onondaga, Otisco, Otsego, Owasco, Raquette,  
8     Sacandaga, Saratoga, Schroon, Seneca, Skaneateles, SILVER (IN THE COUNTY  
9     OF WYOMING) and Saranac, and the Fulton chain of lakes; (b) the state's  
10    major rivers comprised of the Ausable, Black, Boquet, Canisteo, Chemung,  
11    Cohocton, Delaware, Deer, Genesee, Grasse, Hudson north of the federal  
12    dam at Troy, Indian, Little Salmon (including north and south branches),  
13    Mad, Mettowie, Mohawk, Oswegatchie, Racquette, Salmon, Saranac, Susquehanna,  
14    Tioga and Tioughnioga rivers, and the north and middle branches  
15    of the Moose river; (c) the state's major creeks comprised of the Cincinnati,  
16    East Kill, Esopus (including upper and lower branches), Fish  
17    (including east and west branches), Gooseberry, Little Sandy, Sandy,  
18    Schoharie, South Sandy, Oatka and Tonawanda and West Kill; (d) the Barge  
19    Canal System as defined in section two of the canal law; and (e) the  
20    adjacent shorelands to the extent that such inland waters and adjacent  
21    lands are strongly influenced by each other including, but not limited  
22    to, islands, wetlands, beaches, dunes, barrier islands, cliffs, bluffs  
23    and erosion prone areas.  
24    S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
