AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to increasing the membership on the state board of acupuncture

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 8213 of the education law, as added by chapter 772
2 of the laws of 1990, is amended to read as follows:
3 S 8213. State board for acupuncture. (1) There is hereby established
4 within the department a state board for acupuncture. The board shall
5 consist of not less than [eleven] THIRTEEN members to be appointed by
6 the board of regents on the recommendation of the commissioner for the
7 purpose of assisting the board of regents and the department on matters
8 of professional licensing and professional conduct in accordance with
9 section sixty-five hundred eight of this chapter, [four] SIX of whom
10 shall be licensed acupuncturists, four of whom shall be licensed physi-
11 cians certified to use acupuncture and three of whom shall be public
12 members representing the consumer and community. Of the acupuncturists
13 first appointed to the board, one may be a registered specialist's
14 assistant-acupuncture provided that the term of such registered special-
15 ist's assistant-acupuncture shall not be more than four years. Of the
16 members first appointed, three shall be appointed for a one year term,
17 three shall be appointed for a two year term and three shall be
18 appointed for a three year term, and two shall be appointed for a four
19 year term. Thereafter all members shall serve for five year terms. In
20 the event that more than eleven members are appointed, a majority of the
21 additional members shall be licensed acupuncturists. The members of the
22 board shall select one of themselves as chairman to serve for a one year
23 term.
24 (2) An executive secretary to the board shall be appointed by the
25 board of regents on recommendation of the commissioner.

1 (3) The board of regents and the commissioner shall promulgate such
2 rules and regulations as they deem necessary and appropriate to effectu-
3 ate the provisions of this article.
4 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
