AN ACT to amend the elder law, in relation to establishing a senior housing task force

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. The elder law is amended by adding a new section 203-a to 2 read as follows:

203-A. SENIOR HOUSING TASK FORCE. 1. THERE IS HEREBY ESTABLISHED WITHIN THE OFFICE A SENIOR HOUSING TASK FORCE WHICH SHALL MEET AT LEAST 5 FOUR TIMES IN DIFFERENT GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS OF THE STATE. THE TASK FORCE SHALL CONSIST OF SEVENTEEN MEMBERS AND SHALL INCLUDE REPRESENTATIVES 7 FROM THE FOLLOWING STATE AGENCIES: THE OFFICE FOR THE AGING, THE DIVI-HOUSING AND COMMUNITY RENEWAL, THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, THE OF 9 OFFICE OF MENTAL HEALTH, THE DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, EMPIRE STATE DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION, THE OFFICE OF MENTAL RETARDATION 10 AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES, THE DIVISION OF PROTECTIVE SERVICES FOR 11 ADULTS OF THE OFFICE OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES, AND THE NEW YORK 12 CITY DEPARTMENT FOR THE AGING. OF THE EIGHT REMAINING MEMBERS, 13 14 SHALL BE APPOINTED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, THREE SHALL BE ONE SHALL BE 15 APPOINTED BY THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THESENATE, 16 APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE ASSEMBLY AND ONE SHALL BE 17 APPOINTED BY THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE SENATE, AND SHALL BROADLY REPRE-SENT HOUSING AND SENIOR CITIZEN GROUPS FROM ALL GEOGRAPHIC AREAS OF THE 18 19 STATE INCLUDING SERVICE PROVIDERS, ASSOCIATIONS, ADVOCATES, PROPRIETORS, 20 AND CONSUMERS OF FOR-PROFIT AND NOT-FOR-PROFIT SENIOR HOUSING OPTIONS INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO: ASSISTED LIVING FACILITIES, ADULT HOMES, 21 22 SKILLED NURSING FACILITIES, INDEPENDENT LIVING FACILITIES, NATURALLY

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets

MEMBERS SHALL RECEIVE NO COMPENSATION FOR THEIR SERVICES BUT SHALL BE

COMMUNITIES, AND CONTINUING CARE RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES.

OCCURRING RETIREMENT COMMUNITIES, NEIGHBORHOOD NATURALLY

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REIMBURSED FOR TRAVEL AND OTHER EXPENSES ACTUALLY AND NECESSARILY INCURRED IN THE PERFORMANCE OF THEIR DUTIES. THE TASK FORCE SHALL BE CO-CHAIRED BY THE DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE AND THE COMMISSIONER OF THE DIVISION OF HOUSING AND COMMUNITY RENEWAL. THE TASK FORCE IS RESPONSIBLE FOR CONDUCTING A STATE-WIDE ASSESSMENT OF SENIOR HOUSING NEEDS TAKING INTO CONSIDERATION THE VARIOUS GEOGRAPHICAL AREAS AND DIFFERENT NEEDS OF 7 THE SENIORS IN THOSE AREAS AND RESOURCES AVAILABLE IN THOSE DIFFERENT AREAS AND PROJECT THOSE NEEDS OVER THE NEXT TEN YEARS; OTHER FACTORS WHICH SHALL BE TAKEN INTO CONSIDERATION ARE: HEALTH CARE NEEDS OF 9 10 SENIORS, THE LONG TERM CARE NEEDS OF SENIORS, FINANCIAL RESOURCES AVAIL-ABLE TO SENIORS, OR NEEDED BY SENIORS, AND TRANSPORTATION NEEDS OF 11 SENIORS. THE ASSESSMENT SHALL INCLUDE A REVIEW OF INNOVATIVE APPROACHES 12 SUCCESSFULLY BEING IMPLEMENTED IN OTHER STATES AND THEIR POTENTIAL FOR 13 14 IMPLEMENTATION IN THIS STATE. SUCH ASSESSMENT SHALL ALSO DEVELOP A VIABLE PLAN FOR PROVIDING QUALITY SENIOR HOUSING TO MEET THE PROJECTED 16 NEEDS OF SENIORS WITH ACTIONS, STEPS AND TIME FRAMES. 17

- 2. THE TASK FORCE SHALL ISSUE A REPORT BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN OUTLINING ITS FINDINGS AND RECOMMENDATIONS INCLUDING THE STATE PLAN WITH TIME FRAMES. THE REPORT SHALL BE DELIVERED TO THE GOVERNOR, THE SPEAKER OF THE ASSEMBLY, THE TEMPORARY PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE, THE CHAIRPERSONS OF THE AGING, HEALTH AND HOUSING COMMITTEES IN THE ASSEMBLY, AND THE CHAIRPERSONS OF THE AGING, HEALTH AND HOUSING, CONSTRUCTION, AND COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT COMMITTEES IN THE SENATE.
- 24 S 2. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 25 have become a law.
