AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to assault on certain emergency medical professionals

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 120.05 of the penal law, as amended by chapter 45 of the laws of 2008, is amended to read as follows:

- With intent to prevent a peace officer, a police officer, REGIS-TERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, a firefighter, including a fire-6 fighter acting as a paramedic or emergency medical technician adminis-7 tering first aid in the course of performance of duty as 8 firefighter, an emergency medical service paramedic or emergency medical 9 service technician, or medical or related personnel in a hospital emergency department, a city marshal, a traffic enforcement officer or traf-10 fic enforcement agent, from performing a lawful duty, by means including 11 releasing or failing to control an animal under circumstances 12 the actor's intent that the animal obstruct the lawful activity of such 13 peace officer, police officer, REGISTERED NURSE, 14 LICENSED PRACTICAL paramedic, technician, city marshal, 15 firefighter, NURSE, 16 enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent, he or she causes phys-17 ical injury to such peace officer, police officer, REGISTERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, firefighter, paramedic, technician or medical 18 or related personnel in a hospital emergency department, city marshal, 19 traffic enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent; or 20

S 120.08 Assault on a peace officer, police officer, [fireman] FIRE-FIGHTER, REGISTERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, or emergency medical services professional.

A person is guilty of assault on a peace officer, police officer, [fireman] FIREFIGHTER, REGISTERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, or emergency medical services professional when, with intent to prevent a peace officer, police officer, a [fireman] FIREFIGHTER, including a [fireman] FIREFIGHTER acting as a paramedic or emergency medical technician administering first aid in the course of performance of duty as such [fireman] FIREFIGHTER, REGISTERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, or an emergency medical service paramedic or emergency medical service technician, from performing a lawful duty, he OR SHE causes serious physical injury to such peace officer, police officer, [fireman] FIREFIGHTER, REGISTERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, paramedic or technician.

Assault on a peace officer, police officer, [fireman] FIREFIGHTER, REGISTERED NURSE, LICENSED PRACTICAL NURSE, or emergency medical services professional is a class C felony.

19 S 3. This act shall take effect on the first of November next succeed-20 ing the date on which it shall have become a law.
