AN ACT to amend the public officers law and the education law, in
relation to removal of school district officers who have been
convicted of a felony or crime involving violation of oath of office

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Section 2 of the public officers law is amended to read as
2 follows:
3 S 2. Definitions. The term "state officer" includes every officer for
4 whom all the electors of the state are entitled to vote, members of the
5 legislature, justices of the supreme court, regents of the university,
6 and every officer, appointed by one or more state officers, or by the
7 legislature, and authorized to exercise his official functions through-
8 out the entire state, or without limitation to any political subdivision
9 of the state, except United States senators, members of congress, and
10 electors for president and vice-president of the United States. The term
11 "local officer" includes every other officer who is elected by the elec-
12 tors of a portion only of the state, every officer of a political subdivi-
13 sion or municipal corporation of the state, EVERY SCHOOL OFFICER, and
14 every officer limited in the execution of his official functions to a
15 portion only of the state. The office of a state officer is a state
16 office. The office of a local officer is a local office.
17 S 2. Subdivision 1 of section 2112 of the education law is amended to
18 read as follows:
19 1. A. A school district office becomes vacant by death, resignation,
20 refusal to serve, incapacity, or removal from the district or from
21 office.
22 B. IN ACCORDANCE WITH PARAGRAPH E OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION THIRTY
23 OF THE PUBLIC OFFICERS LAW, A SCHOOL DISTRICT OFFICE BECOMES VACANT UPON
24 CONVICTION OF A FELONY, OR CRIME INVOLVING A VIOLATION OF HIS OR HER
25 OATH OF OFFICE.
26 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
