AN ACT to amend the county law, in relation to the creation of a regional pilot program for enhanced wireless 911 service based on voice over internet protocol technology

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 328 of the county law is amended by adding a new
2 subdivision 5-a to read as follows:
3 5-A. THE BOARD SHALL ADOPT STANDARDS GOVERNING REASONABLE ELIGIBLE
4 WIRELESS 911 SERVICE COSTS FOR FUNDING OF ENHANCED WIRELESS 911 SERVICE,
5 REPAYMENT PROVISIONS, AND THE CRITERIA FOR APPROVAL OF PRIORITY ENHANCED
6 WIRELESS 911 PLANS FOR THE REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT
7 TO SUBDIVISION SEVEN OF SECTION THREE HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE OF THIS ARTI-
8 CLE. STANDARDS FOR THE REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM SHALL CONSIDER WHETHER
9 THE PROJECTED COSTS ARE REASONABLY NECESSARY FOR THE PROVISION OF
10 ENHANCED WIRELESS 911 SERVICE AND WHETHER THE PRIORITY ENHANCED WIRELESS
11 PLAN CONFORMS TO THE FCC ORDER.
12 S 2. Subdivision 9 of section 328 of the county law, as added by
13 section 1 of part G of chapter 81 of the laws of 2002 and as renumbered
14 by chapter 292 of the laws of 2004, is amended to read as follows:
15 9. The board shall issue an annual report to the governor, the tempo-
16 rary president of the senate, the minority leader of the senate, the
17 speaker of the assembly, and the minority leader of the assembly, on or
18 before March first of each year, regarding the board's activities in the
19 previous calendar year, including but not limited to, the status of 911
20 services across the state, including the extent to which public safety
21 answering points across the state are equipped to receive enhanced wire-
22 less 911 calls, the allocation of moneys from the fund including allo-
23 cations made and not disbursed, and the disbursements of moneys from the
24 fund. THE REPORT SHALL ALSO INCLUDE INFORMATION RELATING TO THE

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1 REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM ESTABLISHED IN SUBDIVISION SEVEN OF SECTION THREE
2 HUNDRED THIRTY-THREE OF THIS ARTICLE. THE INFORMATION REGARDING SUCH
3 REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, THE NUMBER
4 OF GRANT AWARDS MADE FOR THE REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM, AND DOLLAR VALUE OF
5 THE GRANT AWARDS, AND THE STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE PROGRAMS FUND-
6 ED BY THE REGIONAL PILOT GRANTS. FURTHERMORE, THE ANNUAL REPORT SHALL
7 PROVIDE AN ANALYSIS ON THE EFFECTIVENESS OF THE TECHNOLOGY AND SYSTEMS,
8 AS IT RELATES TO IMPROVED PUBLIC SAFETY, USED IN THE COUNTIES PARTIC-
9 IPATING IN THE REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM AS COMPARED TO THE TECHNOLOGIES
10 USED IN COUNTIES FUNDED FROM THE REGULAR EXPEDITED APPLICATION PROCESS.

11 S 3. Section 333 of the county law is amended by adding a new subdivi-
12 sion 7 to read as follows:

13 7. THE BOARD SHALL DEVELOP A REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM FOR EXPEDITED
14 DEPLOYMENT IN TWO COUNTIES WHICH IS BASED UPON TECHNOLOGY USING A CALL
15 ASSOCIATED SIGNALING SYSTEM WHICH UTILIZES VOICE OVER INTERNET PROTOCOL.
16 THE BOARD SHALL SELECT TWO COUNTIES AS RECIPIENTS OF THE REGIONAL PILOT
17 PROGRAM BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TEN. THE STANDARDS FOR THE
18 REGIONAL PILOT PROGRAM SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH THE STANDARDS DEVELOPED
19 PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION FIVE-A OF SECTION THREE HUNDRED TWENTY-EIGHT OF
20 THIS ARTICLE. THE APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS FOR THE REGIONAL PILOT
21 PROGRAM SHALL BE CONSISTENT WITH SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION. THE
22 BOARD SHALL ENSURE THAT SUFFICIENT FUNDS, NOT LESS THAN FIVE MILLION
23 DOLLARS, ARE RESERVED FOR GRANTS TO BE AWARDED FOR THE REGIONAL PILOT
24 PROGRAM.

25 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately.
