AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to establishing the bridge and road investment and dedicated fund guaranteed enforcement "BRIDGE" reform act

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "bridge and road investment and dedicated fund guaranteed enforcement (BRIDGE) reform act".

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- S 2. Paragraph a of subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the state finance law, as amended by section 1 of part B of chapter 84 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:
- a. Moneys in the dedicated highway and bridge trust fund shall, following appropriation by the legislature, be utilized for: struction, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation preservation of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways, and bridges thereon, to restore such facilities to their construction, reconstruction, functions; enhancement improvement of state, county, town, city, and village roads, highways, parkways, and bridges thereon, to address current and projected capacity problems including costs for traffic mitigation activities; aviation projects authorized pursuant to section fourteen-j of the transportation law and for payments to the general debt service fund of amounts equal to amounts required for service contract payments related to aviation projects as provided and authorized by section three hundred eighty-six of the public authorities law; programs to assist small and minority and women-owned firms engaged in transportation construction and reconstruction projects, including a revolving fund for working capital loans, and a bonding guarantee assistance program in accordance with

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provisions of this chapter; matching federal grants or apportionments to the state for highway, parkway and bridge capital projects; the acquisition of real property and interests therein required or expected to be required in connection with such projects; preventive maintenance activ-5 ities necessary to ensure that highways, parkways and bridges meet or 6 exceed their optimum useful life; [expenses of control of snow and 7 state highways by the department of transportation including but not 8 limited to personal services, nonpersonal services and fringe benefits, payment of emergency aid for control of snow and ice in municipalities 9 10 pursuant to section fifty-five of the highway law, expenses of control snow and ice on state highways by municipalities pursuant to section 11 12 twelve of the highway law, and for expenses of arterial maintenance agreements with cities pursuant to section three hundred forty-nine of 13 14 the highway law; personal services and fringe benefit costs of the 15 department of transportation for bus safety inspection activities; [costs of the department of motor vehicles, including but not limited to 16 personal and nonpersonal services;] costs of engineering and administra-17 18 tive services of the department of transportation, including but not 19 limited to fringe benefits; the contract services provided by private 20 firms in accordance with section fourteen of the transportation law; 21 personal services and nonpersonal services, for activities including but 22 limited to the preparation of designs, plans, specifications and 23 estimates; construction management and supervision activities; costs of 24 appraisals, surveys, testing and environmental impact statements for 25 transportation projects; expenses in connection with buildings, 26 ment, materials and facilities used or useful in connection with the maintenance, operation, and repair of highways, parkways and bridges 27 28 and project costs for: construction, reconstruction, improve-29 ment, reconditioning and preservation of rail freight facilities 30 intercity rail passenger facilities and equipment; construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of state, munic-31 32 ipal and privately owned ports; construction, reconstruction, 33 ment, reconditioning and preservation of municipal airports; privately 34 owned airports and aviation capital facilities, excluding airports oper-35 ated by the state or operated by a bi-state municipal corporate instru-36 mentality for which federal funding is not available provided the 37 project is consistent with an approved airport layout plan; construction, reconstruction, enhancement, improvement, replacement, 38 39 reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and preservation of state, 40 county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways and bridges; and construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and pres-41 ervation of fixed ferry facilities of municipal and privately owned 42 43 ferry lines for transportation purposes, and the payment of debt service required on any bonds, notes or other obligations and related expenses 45 for highway, parkway, bridge and project costs for: construction, recon-46 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of rail freight 47 facilities and intercity rail passenger facilities and equipment; 48 construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of state, municipal and privately owned ports; construction, recon-49 50 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of municipal 51 airports; privately owned airports and aviation capital facilities, excluding airports operated by the state or operated by a bi-state municipal corporate instrumentality for which federal funding is not 52 53 54 available provided the project is consistent with an approved airport 55 layout plan; construction, reconstruction, enhancement, improvement, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and preserva-56

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tion of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways and bridges; and construction, reconstruction, improvement, recondition-3 ing and preservation of fixed ferry facilities of municipal and privately owned ferry lines for transportation purposes, purposes authorized on 5 after the effective date of this section. Beginning with disburse-6 ments made on and after the first day of April, nineteen hundred nine-7 ty-three, moneys in such fund shall be available to pay such costs or 8 expenses made pursuant to appropriations or reappropriations made during 9 the state fiscal year which began on the first of April, nineteen 10 hundred ninety-two. Beginning the first day of April, nineteen hundred ninety-three, moneys in such fund shall also be used for payments to the 11 to amounts required for 12 general debt service fund of amounts equal service contract payments as provided and authorized by section three 13 14 hundred eighty of the public authorities law and by section eleven of 15 chapter three hundred twenty-nine of the laws of nineteen hundred nine-16 ty-one, as amended. 17

- S 3. Paragraph a of subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the state finance law, as amended by section 1 of part D of chapter 151 of the laws of 2001, is amended to read as follows:
- Moneys in the dedicated highway and bridge trust fund shall, following appropriation by the legislature, be utilized for: struction, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation and preservation of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways, and bridges thereon, to restore such facilities to their construction, reconstruction, intended functions; enhancement improvement of state, county, town, city, and village roads, highways, parkways, and bridges thereon, to address current and projected capacity problems including costs for traffic mitigation activities; projects authorized pursuant to section fourteen-j of the transportation law and for payments to the general debt service fund of amounts equal to amounts required for service contract payments related to aviation projects as provided and authorized by section three hundred eighty-six of the public authorities law; programs to assist small and minority and women-owned firms engaged in transportation construction and reconstruction projects, including a revolving fund for working capital loans, and a bonding guarantee assistance program in accordance provisions of this chapter; matching federal grants or apportionments to the state for highway, parkway and bridge capital projects; the acquisition of real property and interests therein required or expected to be required in connection with such projects; preventive maintenance activities necessary to ensure that highways, parkways and bridges meet or exceed their optimum useful life; [expenses of control of snow and ice on state highways by the department of transportation including but not limited to personal services, nonpersonal services and fringe benefits, payment of emergency aid for control of snow and ice in municipalities pursuant to section fifty-five of the highway law, expenses of control of snow and ice on state highways by municipalities pursuant to section the highway law, and for expenses of arterial maintenance agreements with cities pursuant to section three hundred forty-nine of the highway law;] personal services and fringe benefit costs of the department of transportation for bus safety inspection activities; costs of engineering and administrative services of the department of transportation, including but not limited to fringe benefits; the contract services provided by private firms in accordance with section fourteen of the transportation law; personal services and nonpersonal services, for activities including but not limited to the preparation of designs,

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specifications and estimates; construction management and supervision activities; costs of appraisals, surveys, testing and 3 mental impact statements for transportation projects; expenses connection with buildings, equipment, materials and facilities used or 5 useful in connection with the maintenance, operation, and repair of 6 and bridges thereon; and project costs for: parkways 7 construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preserva-8 tion of rail freight facilities and intercity rail passenger facilities 9 and equipment; construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning 10 and preservation of state, municipal and privately owned 11 construction, reconstruction, improvement, reconditioning and preserva-12 tion of municipal airports; privately owned airports and aviation capi-13 tal facilities, excluding airports operated by the state or operated by 14 a bi-state municipal corporate instrumentality for which federal funding 15 is not available provided the project is consistent with an approved airport layout plan; and construction, reconstruction, enhancement, 16 improvement, replacement, reconditioning, restoration, rehabilitation 17 18 and preservation of state, county, town, city and village roads, highways, parkways and bridges; and construction, reconstruction, improve-19 ment, reconditioning and preservation of fixed ferry facilities of 20 21 municipal and privately owned ferry lines for transportation purposes, 22 the payment of debt service required on any bonds, notes or other obligations and related expenses for highway, parkway, bridge and project costs for: construction, reconstruction, improvement, recondi-23 24 25 tioning and preservation of rail freight facilities and intercity rail 26 facilities and equipment; construction, reconstruction, 27 improvement, reconditioning and preservation of state, municipal 28 privately owned ports; construction, reconstruction, improvement, recon-29 ditioning and preservation of municipal airports; privately owned airports and aviation capital facilities, excluding airports operated by 30 31 the state or operated by a bi-state municipal corporate instrumentality 32 which federal funding is not available provided the project is 33 consistent with an approved airport layout plan; construction, recon-34 struction, enhancement, improvement, replacement, reconditioning, resto-35 ration, rehabilitation and preservation of state, county, town, city and 36 village roads, highways, parkways and bridges; and construction, recon-37 struction, improvement, reconditioning and preservation of fixed ferry 38 facilities of municipal and privately owned ferry lines for transporta-39 tion purposes, purposes authorized on or after the effective date of 40 this section. Beginning with disbursements made on and after the first 41 day of April, nineteen hundred ninety-three, moneys in such fund shall 42 available to pay such costs or expenses made pursuant to appropri-43 ations or reappropriations made during the state fiscal year which began 44 on the first of April, nineteen hundred ninety-two. Beginning the first 45 day of April, nineteen hundred ninety-three, moneys in such fund shall 46 also be used for payments to the general debt service fund of amounts 47 equal to amounts required for service contract payments as provided and 48 authorized by section three hundred eighty of the public authorities law and by section eleven of chapter three hundred twenty-nine of the 49 50 of nineteen hundred ninety-one, as amended. 51

- S 4. Subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the state finance law is amended by adding two new paragraphs c and d to read as follows:
- C. MONEYS IN THE DEDICATED HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE TRUST FUND APPROPRIATED BY THE LEGISLATURE FOR EXPENSES OF CONTROL OF SNOW AND ICE ON STATE HIGHWAYS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PERSONAL SERVICES, NONPERSONAL SERVICES AND FRINGE BENEFITS, PAYMENT

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OF EMERGENCY AID FOR CONTROL OF SNOW AND ICE IN MUNICIPALITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION FIFTY-FIVE OF THE HIGHWAY LAW, EXPENSES OF CONTROL OF SNOW AND ICE ON STATE HIGHWAYS BY MUNICIPALITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION TWELVE OF THE HIGHWAY LAW, AND FOR EXPENSES OF ARTERIAL MAINTENANCE AGREEMENTS WITH CITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE HUNDRED FORTY-NINE OF THE HIGHWAY LAW SHALL NOT EXCEED:

- (I) \$450.24 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND TEN--TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN;
- 9 (II) \$337.68 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN--TWO THOUSAND 10 TWELVE;
- 11 (III) \$225.12 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND TWELVE--TWO THOU-12 SAND THIRTEEN; AND
- 13 (IV) \$112.56 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOU-14 SAND FOURTEEN.
 - (V) FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN--TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN AND FOR ALL SUBSEQUENT YEARS THEREAFTER NO MONEYS FROM THE DEDICATED HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE TRUST FUND SHALL BE EXPENDED FOR EXPENSES OF CONTROL OF SNOW AND ICE ON STATE HIGHWAYS BY THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PERSONAL SERVICES, NONPERSONAL SERVICES AND FRINGE BENEFITS, PAYMENT OF EMERGENCY AID FOR CONTROL OF SNOW AND ICE IN MUNICIPALITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION FIFTY-FIVE OF THE HIGHWAY LAW, EXPENSES OF CONTROL OF SNOW AND ICE ON STATE HIGHWAYS BY MUNICIPALITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION TWELVE OF THE HIGHWAY LAW, AND FOR EXPENSES OF ARTERIAL MAINTENANCE AGREEMENTS WITH CITIES PURSUANT TO SECTION THREE HUNDRED FORTYNINE OF THE HIGHWAY LAW.
 - D. MONEYS IN THE DEDICATED HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE TRUST FUND APPROPRIATED BY THE LEGISLATURE FOR COSTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PERSONAL AND NONPERSONAL SERVICES SHALL NOT EXCEED:
 - (I) \$160.24 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND TEN--TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN;
- 32 (II) \$121.80 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN--TWO THOUSAND 33 TWELVE;
 - (III) \$81.20 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND TWELVE--TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN; AND
 - (IV) \$40.60 MILLION FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN--TWO THOU-SAND FOURTEEN.
- (V) FOR FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN--TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN AND FOR ALL SUBSEQUENT YEARS THEREAFTER NO MONEYS FROM THE DEDICATED HIGHWAY AND BRIDGE TRUST FUND SHALL BE EXPENDED FOR COSTS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MOTOR VEHICLES, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PERSONAL AND NONPERSONAL SERVICES.
- S 5. This act shall take effect immediately, provided that the amend-44 ments to paragraph a of subdivision 5 of section 89-b of the state 45 finance law made by section two of this act shall be subject to the 46 expiration and reversion of such paragraph pursuant to section 2 of part 47 B of chapter 84 of the laws of 2002, as amended, when upon such date the 48 provisions of section three of this act shall take effect.
