- AN ACT to amend the executive law and the public health law, in relation to providing certain benefits to veterans; and to amend the social services law and the correction law, in relation to requiring certain reports relating to veterans

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 353 of the executive law is amended by adding two 2 new subdivisions 20 and 21 to read as follows:

3 20. TO DEVELOP, IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND ANY OTHER PRIVATE OR NOT-FOR-PROFIT INSTITUTIONS, A PROGRAM FOR THE IDEN-4 TIFICATION, DIAGNOSIS, COUNSELING AND TREATMENT OF VETERANS WHO SUFFER 5 б POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER AND BRAIN-RELATED INJURIES. FROM SUCH 7 PROGRAM SHALL INCLUDE PROCEDURES FOR IDENTIFYING VETERANS WHO MAY NEED 8 ASSISTANCE AND INFORMATION AND OUTREACH TO MAKE VETERANS AWARE OF AVAIL-9 ABLE PROGRAMS AND SERVICES.

10 21. TO DEVELOP AND PROVIDE EDUCATIONAL, SOCIAL AND HEALTH RELATED 11 BENEFITS AND SERVICES TO VETERANS AND THEIR IMMEDIATE FAMILIES.

12 S 2. The executive law is amended by adding two new sections 353-a and 13 353-b to read as follows:

S 353-A. REPORTING ON SUICIDE RATES OF VETERANS. THE DIVISION, BY AND 14 STATE DIRECTOR OR HIS DULY AUTHORIZED OFFICER OR EMPLOYEE, 15 THROUGH THE SHALL ESTABLISH PROGRAMS AND PROCEDURES FOR MONITORING RATES OF SUICIDE 16 STUDY 17 AMONG VETERANS. SUCH REPORT SHALL THE INCIDENCE OF DEATHS 18 REPORTED AS SUICIDES AMONG VETERANS INTHIS STATE. IΤ SHALL ΒE 19 COMPLETED ANNUALLY AND SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGIS-

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LATURE. THE DIRECTOR SHALL DETERMINE WHAT ADDITIONAL INFORMATION SHALL
 BE MADE A PART OF SUCH REPORT INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, NON-CLASSI FIED INFORMATION RELATING TO THE SERVICE OF SUCH VETERANS, PREVIOUS
 MEDICAL HISTORY, LENGTH AND TYPE OF SERVICE AND ANY OTHER FACTORS WHICH
 MAY BE RELEVANT TO THE INCIDENCE OF SUICIDE AMONG VETERANS.

6 353-B. REPORTING ON RATES OF HOMELESSNESS AMONG VETERANS. THE DIVI-S 7 SION, BY AND THROUGH THE STATE DIRECTOR OR HIS DULY AUTHORIZED OFFICER 8 ESTABLISH PROGRAMS AND PROCEDURES FOR MONITORING OR EMPLOYEE, SHALL 9 RATES OF HOMELESSNESS AMONG VETERANS. SUCH REPORT SHALL STUDY THE INCI-10 DENCE OF HOMELESSNESS AMONG VETERANS IN THIS STATE. ITSHALL BE ANNUALLY AND SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THE GOVERNOR AND THE LEGIS-11 COMPLETED LATURE. SUCH STUDY SHALL PROVIDE INFORMATION GATHERED FROM LOCAL 12 SOCIAL 13 DISTRICTS AND SHELTERS RUN BY NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS. SERVICES ANY OTHER INFORMATION RELEVANT TO 14 SUCH REPORT MAY ALSO INCLUDE THE INCIDENCE OF HOMELESSNESS AMONG VETERANS AND ANY PROGRAMS CURRENTLY 15 16 SERVING SUCH POPULATION SPECIFICALLY.

17 S 3. Subdivision 1 of section 3803 of the public health law, as 18 amended by chapter 743 of the laws of 2006, is amended to read as 19 follows:

1. There is hereby created within the department the veterans health care information program (referred to in this section as the "program"), which shall provide information on health issues associated with military duty, including but not limited to Agent Orange, Gulf War Syndromes, toxic materials or harmful physical agents such as, depleted uranium, and hepatitis C, AND SPECIFIC MENTAL AND PHYSICAL HEALTH ISSUES INCLUDING POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS DISORDER AND BRAIN-RELATED INJURIES, for veterans, their surviving spouses and health care providers.

28 S 4. Section 95 of the social services law is amended by adding a new 29 subdivision 12 to read as follows:

12. THE COMMISSIONER OF THE OFFICE OF TEMPORARY AND DISABILITY ASSISTANCE SHALL SUBMIT AN ANNUAL REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE, NOT LATER THAN
DECEMBER THIRTY-FIRST OF EACH YEAR, DETAILING THE NUMBER OF MILITARY
VETERANS AND FAMILIES OF MILITARY PERSONNEL WHO HAVE BEEN DEPLOYED FOR
ACTIVE MILITARY DUTY IN THE ARMED FORCES OF THE UNITED STATES WHO ARE IN
RECEIPT OF FOOD STAMPS OR ARE PARTICIPATING IN A FOOD ASSISTANCE PROGRAM
UNDER THIS SECTION.

37 S 5. Section 71 of the correction law is amended by adding a new 38 subdivision 8 to read as follows:

39 8. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL, WITHIN ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY DAYS AFTER THE 40 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SUBDIVISION, AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER, DETERMINE REPORT TO THE LEGISLATURE ON THE NUMBER OF INMATES CURRENTLY IN THE 41 AND CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT, INCLUDING PERSONS SERVING SENTENCES IN 42 ANY 43 LOCAL CORRECTIONAL FACILITY, WHO ARE VETERANS OF THE ARMED FORCES OF THE 44 UNITED STATES. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL DEVELOP RULES AND REGULATIONS TO 45 PROVIDE FOR THE IDENTIFICATION OF VETERANS UPON COMMITMENT OF SUCH PERSONS TO THE CUSTODY OF THE DEPARTMENT. 46

47 S 6. This act shall take effect immediately.
