2 CITY UNIVERSITY--SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAMS

For the costs of the state share, as prescribed herein, as reimbursement to the city of New York to be paid during the state fiscal year beginning April 1, 2009 for the operating expenses of the senior college approved programs and services of the city university of New York as defined in section 6230 of the education law.

Notwithstanding paragraphs 3 and 4 of subdivision A of section 6221 of the education law, the amount appropriated herein shall constitute the maximum state payment for the 2009-10 state fiscal year beginning April 1, 2009 to the city of New York, of which \$428,000,000 is a state liability to the city for the period beginning April 1, 2009 through June 30, 2010, for reimbursement of costs incurred by the city at any time during the 2008-09 academic year.

Notwithstanding any inconsistent provision dormitory authority of the law, the state of New York may issue bonds for the purpose of reimbursing equipment disbursements subject to subdivision 14 of section of the public authorities law and upon transfer of bond proceeds for equipdisbursements, from the city university special revenue fund (377), faciliand planning income reimbursable account (NA) to an account of the city of New York, the general fund appropriations herein shall be reduced by amounts equivalent to such transfers but in no event \$20,000,000 for the 12-month less than period beginning July 1, 2009; the transfer of such bond proceeds shall immediately and equivalently reduce the general fund amounts appropriated herein; and the portions of such general fund appropriations so affected shall have no further force or effect.

The state share of operating expenses, a portion of which is appropriated herein as reimbursement to New York city, shall be an amount equal to the net operating expenses of the senior college approved programs and services which shall equal the total operating expenses of approved programs and services less:

(a) all excess tuition and instructional and noninstructional fees attributable

to the senior colleges received from the city university construction fund;

- (b) miscellaneous revenue and fees, including bad debt recoveries and income fund reimbursable cost recoveries;
- (c) pursuant to section 6221 of the education law, a representative share of the operating costs of those activities within central administration and university-wide programs which, as determined by the state budget director, relate jointly to the senior colleges and community colleges, and New York support for associate degree programs at the College of Staten Island and Medgar Evers College and notwithstanding any other provision of law, rule or regulation, New York support for associate degree programs at New York city college of technology and John Jay college, with such support based on the 2006-07 full-time equivalent (FTE) associate degree enrollments at these campuses and calculated using the New York city contribution per city university community college FTE in the 2006-07 base year, totaling \$32,275,000.

Items (a) and (b) of the foregoing shall be hereafter referred to as the senior college revenue offset, and item (c) as the central administration and university-wide programs offset.

In no event shall the state support for the operating expenses of the senior college approved programs and services for the 12-month period beginning July 1, 2009 Exceed [\$1,096,493,377] \$1,072,493,377 ...
