THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Section 1 of chapter 53 of the laws of 2009, as amended by

34 A portion of the moneys hereby appropriated

39 Notwithstanding any other provision of law,
40 during the fiscal year commencing April 1,
41 2009, additional awards due and payable to
