AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to recreational marine fishing licenses

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Subdivisions 5, 6, 15 and 16 of section 11-0701 of the
2 environmental conservation law, subdivision 5 as amended by section 10
3 of part F of chapter 82 of the laws of 2002, paragraph c of subdivision
4 5 as added by section 1 of part KK of chapter 59 of the laws of 2009,
5 subdivision 6 as amended by section 11 of part F of chapter 82 of the
6 laws of 2002, subdivision 15 as amended by section 16 of part F of chap-
7 ter 82 of the laws of 2002 and subdivision 16 as amended by section 1 of
8 part LL of chapter 59 of the laws of 2009, are amended to read as
9 follows:
- 10 5. a. A combined resident fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING and
11 small and big game license hereinafter in this article referred to as a
12 sportsman license, entitles the holder to the privileges the holder
13 would have if the holder held separately a fishing license, A RECRE-
14 ATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE and a small and big game license.
- 15 b. A combined resident fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING, small and
16 big game, bowhunting and muzzle-loading license, hereinafter in this
17 article referred to as a resident super-sportsman license, entitles the
18 holder to the privileges the holder would have if the holder held sepa-
19 rately a fishing license, A RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE, a small
20 and big game license, a bowhunting stamp, a muzzle-loading stamp, and a
21 turkey permit.
- 22 c. A combined resident fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING, small and
23 big game, muzzle-loading stamp and trapping license, hereinafter in this
24 article referred to as a resident trapper super-sportsman license, enti-
25 tles the holder to the privileges the holder would have if the holder
26 held separately a fishing license, A RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING

EXPLANATION--Matter in *ITALICS* (underscored) is new; matter in brackets [] is old law to be omitted.

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1 LICENSE, a small and big game license, a muzzle-loading stamp, a trap-
2 ping license, and a turkey permit.

3 6. A free sportsman license entitles the holder to the privileges the
4 holder would have if the holder held separately a small and big game
5 license, A RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE and a fishing license.

6 15. A non-resident combined hunting, fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE
7 FISHING, big game, bowhunting and muzzle-loading license, hereinafter in
8 this article referred to as a non-resident super-sportsman license,
9 entitles a person who has not been a resident of the state for more than
10 thirty days to the privileges that the holder would have if the holder
11 held separately a non-resident hunting license, a non-resident fishing
12 license, A NON-RESIDENT RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE, a non-resi-
13 dent big game license, a non-resident bowhunting license, a non-resident
14 muzzle-loading license and a non-resident turkey permit.

15 16. A conservation legacy license entitles the holder to fish, [except
16 for migratory fish of the sea or from the waters of the marine
17 district,] hunt wildlife, hunt big game with a longbow and a muzzle-
18 loading firearm during special seasons therefor, hunt turkey, enjoy the
19 benefits of a voluntary habitat stamp and receive the "New York State
20 Conservationist" magazine as if the holder of such license held sepa-
21 rately a resident super-sportsman license, a voluntary habitat stamp and
22 a subscription to the "New York State Conservationist" magazine.

23 S 2. Paragraph d and the closing paragraph of subdivision 1 of section
24 11-0702 of the environmental conservation law, as separately amended by
25 section 2 of part KK and section 2 of part LL of chapter 59 of the laws
26 of 2009, are amended to read as follows:

27 d. Lifetime COMBINED
28 fishing AND RECREATIONAL
29 MARINE FISHING license
30 for a person age seventy
31 and over.

32 The holder of a lifetime small and big game license, RECREATIONAL
33 MARINE FISHING LICENSE or fishing license may, at any time, convert such
34 license to a lifetime sportsman license and turkey permit for an addi-
35 tional fee equal to the existing differential.

36 S 3. Paragraphs g and h of subdivision 1 of section 11-0702 of the
37 environmental conservation law, as added by section 2 of part LL of
38 chapter 59 of the laws of 2009, are relettered paragraphs h and i.

39 S 4. Subdivision 4 of section 11-0702 of the environmental conserva-
40 tion law, as added by chapter 352 of the laws of 1987 and as renumbered
41 by chapter 626 of the laws of 1988, is amended to read as follows:

42 4. All moneys collected from the sale of lifetime licenses shall be
43 deposited in the state fish and game trust account pursuant to section
44 eighty-three of the state finance law, EXCEPT THAT TEN PERCENT OF THE
45 FEES COLLECTED FROM PARAGRAPHS A, D, H AND I OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS
46 SECTION SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN THE MARINE RESOURCES ACCOUNT OF THE
47 CONSERVATION FUND PURSUANT TO SECTION EIGHTY-THREE OF THE STATE FINANCE
48 LAW.

49 S 5. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall
50 have become a law.
