AN ACT to amend the public health law, in relation to sales and purchases of human organs

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 4307 of the public health law, as amended by chapter 362 of the laws of 2009, is amended to read as follows:

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3 S 4307. Prohibition of sales and purchases of human organs OR BODY 4 PARTS. 1. It shall be unlawful for any person to knowingly acquire, receive, or otherwise transfer for valuable consideration any human organ for use in human transplantation, OR TO PROCURE ANY BODY PART IN 5 6 7 VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION. [The term human organ means the human kidney, 8 liver, heart, lung, bone marrow, and any other human organ or tissue as 9 may be designated by the commissioner but shall exclude blood. The term 10 "valuable consideration" does not include the reasonable payments asso-11 ciated with the removal, transportation, implantation, processing, preservation, quality control, and storage of a human organ or the expenses 12 travel, housing, and lost wages incurred by the donor of a human 13 of 14 organ in connection with the donation of the organ.] Any person who 15 violates this section shall be guilty of a class E felony FOR EACH 16 INSTANCE OF SALE.

2. For the purposes of this section, the donation of a kidney or other 17 organ from a live donor for transplantation into an individual condi-18 19 tioned upon the donation and transplantation of a similar organ into an individual specified by the donor shall not, in and of itself, be 20 21 considered to be "valuable consideration" provided that such donation 22 and transplant are performed in accordance with other applicable laws, rules and regulations, including any specific rules and regulations the 23 commissioner may adopt, with the advice and consent of the transplant 24 with respect to such conditional donations. No individual may 25 council, 26 make a donation conditioned upon the race, color, creed, national origin 27 or religious affiliation of the recipient, and no hospital, organ procurement organization, tissue bank, physician or other professional 28

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1 may participate in the performance of any procedure or otherwise facili-2 tate the donation and/or transfer of organs and/or tissue conditioned on 3 such factors.

3. FOR PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

5 (A) THE TERM "PROCURE" MEANS AND INCLUDES THE ACT OF KNOWINGLY ACQUIR-6 ING, RECEIVING, OR OTHERWISE TRANSFERRING;

7 (B) THE TERM "HUMAN ORGAN" MEANS THE HUMAN KIDNEY, LIVER, HEART, LUNG,
8 BONE MARROW, AND ANY OTHER HUMAN ORGAN OR TISSUE AS MAY BE DESIGNATED BY
9 THE COMMISSIONER BUT SHALL EXCLUDE BLOOD, AND OCULAR TISSUE WHICH IS
10 RECOVERED BY LICENSED EYE BANK PERSONNEL;

(C) THE TERM "VALUABLE CONSIDERATION" DOES NOT INCLUDE THE 11 REASONABLE 12 ASSOCIATED WITH THE REMOVAL, PAYMENTS TRANSPORTATION, IMPLANTATION, PROCESSING, PRESERVATION, QUALITY CONTROL, AND STORAGE OF A HUMAN ORGAN 13 14 OR THE EXPENSES OF TRAVEL, HOUSING, AND LOST WAGES INCURRED BY THE DONOR 15 OF A HUMAN ORGAN IN CONNECTION WITH THE DONATION OF THE ORGAN OR REASON-COMPENSATION FOR RESTORATIVE WORK PERFORMED BY A LICENSED FUNERAL 16 ABLE 17 DIRECTOR IN CONNECTION WITH PROCUREMENT OF A HUMAN ORGAN;

18 (D) THE TERM "BODY PART" MEANS AND INCLUDES THE TERMS INCLUDED IN THE 19 DEFINITION OF BODY PART PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION FIVE OF SECTION 20 FORTY-THREE HUNDRED OF THIS ARTICLE, BUT SHALL EXCLUDE BLOOD, AND OCULAR 21 TISSUE WHICH IS RECOVERED BY LICENSED EYE BANK PERSONNEL OR ANY OTHER 22 ELEMENT AS THE COMMISSIONER MAY DEEM NECESSARY.

23 COMMISSIONER SHALL PRESCRIBE RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING 4. THE PROCUREMENT OF HUMAN BODY PARTS, WHICH SHALL REQUIRE AT A MINIMUM 24 THAT 25 ALL PROCUREMENT OF SUCH BODY PARTS BE PERFORMED ONLY BY A FACILITY (A) 26 REGISTERED WITH THE DEPARTMENT TO UNDERTAKE SUCH PROCUREMENT, (B) ALL 27 REGISTERED FOR PROCUREMENT OF HUMAN BODY PARTS SHALL REPORT FACILITIES AND DOCUMENT THE PROCUREMENT OF EACH BODY PART TO THE 28 MEDICAL EXAMINER CORONER OF THE COUNTY WHERE THE FACILITY IS LOCATED, AND (C) NO 29 OR FUNERAL DIRECTOR, UNDERTAKER, REGISTERED RESIDENT, MORTUARY STUDENT 30 OR REGISTERED FUNERAL HOME OR FACILITY SHALL CONDUCT OR PARTICIPATE IN 31 32 PROCUREMENT OF HUMAN BODY PARTS.

33 S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
