AN ACT requiring the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services to develop educational materials regarding screening for alcoholism and chemical dependency in women to health care providers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

causes, symptoms, and effects of alcoholism and Section 1. As substance abuse may manifest differently in women and men, the commis-3 sioner of the office of alcoholism and substance abuse services, in consultation with the commissioner of the department of health, shall 5 provide and publish, in electronic or other format, educational materials for health care providers, as defined in subdivision 6 of section 7 238 of the public health law, regarding screening, assessment, and diagnosis of alcoholism and chemical dependency in women. Such educational 9 materials may include, but shall not be limited to, information regardsymptoms of addiction, causes of addiction, evidence based instru-10 ments health care providers may use in screening, screening techniques, 11 12 how alcoholism and chemical dependency affects women's health, a referral list for treatment, a list of educational websites regarding alco-13 14 holism and chemical dependency, and literature regarding treatment and Such educational materials shall be made available to health 15 care providers through the official website of the office of alcoholism 16 and substance abuse services and by any other means deemed appropriate 17 18 by the commissioner of the office of alcoholism and substance abuse 19 services.

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
