AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to the creation of an animal cruelty and animal fighting data base

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Legislative findings. Studies in psychology, sociology and
2 criminology have demonstrated that violent offenders frequently have
3 childhood and adolescent histories of serious and repeated animal cruel-
4 ty. The Federal Bureau of Investigation has recognized this connection
5 since the 1970's when its analysis of the lives of serial killers
6 suggested that most had killed or tortured animals during their life.
7 Other research has shown consistent patterns of animal cruelty among
8 perpetrators of more common forms of violence, including child abuse,
9 spouse abuse, and elder abuse, leading the American Psychiatric Associ-
10 ation to consider animal cruelty as one of the diagnostic criteria of
11 conduct disorder.

12 S 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 837-s to
13 read as follows:

14 S 837-S. ANIMAL CRUELTY DATA BASE. THE DIVISION SHALL ESTABLISH AND
15 MAINTAIN A CRIME DATA BASE ON ALL CRIMES OF ANIMAL CRUELTY AND ANIMAL
16 FIGHTING COMMITTED IN THE STATE WHERE DATA OF SUCH CRIMES SHALL BE
17 COLLECTED AND DISPLAYED IN A MANNER THAT FACILITATES ANALYSIS. SUCH
18 CRIME DATA BASE SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, NAMES OF PERSONS
19 CONVICTED OF ANIMAL CRUELTY AND ANIMAL FIGHTING AS SET FORTH IN ARTICLE

1 TWENTY-SIX OF THE AGRICULTURE AND MARKETS LAW AND THE SPECIFIC ACTS OF
2 ANIMAL CRUELTY OR ANIMAL FIGHTING THAT WERE THE BASIS OF THE CONVICTION.
3 FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION, SUCH DATA BASE SHALL ALSO INCLUDE
4 INFORMATION ON PERSONS WHO HAVE PLED GUILTY TO A CHARGE OTHER THAN
5 ANIMAL CRUELTY OR ANIMAL FIGHTING IN SATISFACTION OF THE ANIMAL CRUELTY
6 OR ANIMAL FIGHTING CHARGE OR WHERE ANIMAL CRUELTY OR THE ANIMAL FIGHTING
7 CHARGE HAS NOT RESULTED IN A DISMISSAL ON THE MERITS. THE CRIME DATA
8 BASE SHALL BE IN PRINT AND IN ELECTRONIC FORM AND SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO
9 ALL LAW ENFORCEMENT ENTITIES, DISTRICT ATTORNEYS, DULY INCORPORATED
10 HUMANE SOCIETIES, SOCIETIES FOR THE PREVENTION OF CRUELTY TO ANIMALS,
11 DOG OR CAT PROTECTIVE ASSOCIATIONS AND ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS.

12 S 3. This act shall take effect June 1, 2013, provided, however, that
13 effective immediately, the division of criminal justice services shall
14 promulgate rules and regulations as it deems necessary to effectuate the
15 purposes of this act, on or before such effective date.
