AN ACT to amend the administrative code of the city of New York and  
chapter 110 of the laws of 2010, relating to making appropriations for  
the support of government, in relation to substance abuse prevention  
personnel in New York city schools

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-  
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1     Section 1. The administrative code of the city of New York is amended  
2     by adding a new section 12-140 to read as follows:  
3     S 12-140 SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION PERSONNEL. THE  
4     NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION SHALL PROVIDE ON A FULL-TIME BASIS  
5     AT LEAST ONE SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION SPECIALIST AT  
6     EACH PUBLIC SCHOOL IN THE CITY OF NEW YORK. FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS  
7     SECTION, A SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION AND INTERVENTION SPECIALIST IS A  
8     NEW YORK CITY DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION EMPLOYEE THAT HAS RECEIVED  
9     SUBSTANCE ABUSE TRAINING THROUGH THE NEW YORK STATE OFFICE OF ALCOHOL  
10    AND SUBSTANCE ABUSE SERVICES.  
11    S 2. Section 17 of chapter 110 of the laws of 2010, relating to making  
12    appropriations for the support of government, is amended by repealing  
13    the items herein below set forth in brackets and by adding to such  
14    section the other items underscored in this section.

4 Notwithstanding any provision of law to the  
5 contrary, the commissioner of the office  
6 of alcoholism and substance abuse services  
7 shall [be authorized to continue contracts  
8 which were executed on or before March 31,  
9 2010 with entities providing services for  
10 problem gambling and chemical dependency  
11 prevention and treatment services, without  
12 any additional requirements that such  
13 contracts be subject to competitive  
14 bidding, a request for proposal process or  
15 other administrative procedures. Of the  
16 amounts appropriated herein, at least  
17 \$15,549,568 shall be made] MAKE FUNDING  
18 available to the New York City Department  
19 of Education for the continuation of such  
20 school-operated prevention programs  
21 provided by school district [employees]
