Introduced by M. of A. SPANO, BROOK-KRASNY -- Multi-Sponsored by -- M. of A. PHEFFER -- read once and referred to the Committee on Ways and Means

AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to increasing the state aid an eligible city may receive from estimated net machine income generated by a video lottery gaming facility

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph a of subdivision 2 of section 54-1 of the state  
2 finance law, as amended by section 1 of part AA of chapter 56 of the  
3 laws of 2010, is amended to read as follows:  
4 a. An eligible city shall receive: (i) for the state fiscal years  
5 commencing April first, two thousand seven and April first, two thousand  
6 eight, a state aid payment equal to three and one-half percent of the  
7 "estimated net machine income" generated by a video lottery gaming  
8 facility located in such eligible city. Such state aid payment shall not  
9 exceed twenty million dollars per eligible city; and (ii) for the state  
10 fiscal year commencing April first, two thousand nine and [for each  
11 state fiscal year thereafter] APRIL FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TEN, an amount  
12 equal to the state aid payment received in the state fiscal year  
13 commencing April first, two thousand eight; AND (III) FOR THE STATE  
14 FISCAL YEAR COMMENCING APRIL FIRST, TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN AND FOR EACH  
15 STATE FISCAL YEAR THEREAFTER, A STATE AID PAYMENT EQUAL TO SEVEN PERCENT  
16 OF THE "ESTIMATED NET MACHINE INCOME" GENERATED BY A VIDEO GAMING FACIL-  
17 ITY LOCATED IN AN ELIGIBLE CITY OR FORTY MILLION DOLLARS, WHICHEVER  
18 SHALL BE GREATER.  
19 S 2. This act shall take effect April 1, 2011, provided however that  
20 if this act shall become a law after April 1, 2011, it shall take effect  
21 immediately and shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on  
22 and after April 1, 2011.
