- AN ACT to amend the education law and the state finance law, in relation to establishing the "New Century Libraries: Libraries 2011 act"

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Legislative intent. It is the intent of the legislature to 2 provide the people of New York with access to the information and 3 library services they need today and will need tomorrow by establishing 4 a New Century Libraries Initiative.

5 S 2. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "New Century 6 Libraries: Libraries 2011 act".

7 S 3. Section 271 of the education law, as amended by section 1 of part 8 O of chapter 57 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as follows:

9 S 271. Apportionment of state aid to Indian libraries. Any Indian 10 library chartered by the regents or in the absence of such library any 11 tribal government contracting for service from a chartered and regis-12 tered library or approved library system, shall be entitled to receive 13 state aid during each calendar year consisting of the following amounts: 14 1. [Eighteen] NINETEEN thousand dollars, and

15 2. The sum of [eighteen] NINETEEN dollars and [twenty] TWENTY-FIVE 16 cents per capita for persons residing on the reservation served by the 17 Indian library or contract as shown by the latest federal census or 18 certified by the New York state director of Indian services, and

19 3. The sum of one dollar and [fifty] FIFTY-FIVE cents per acre of area 20 served by the Indian library or contract.

Such sums shall be paid annually to the Indian library board of trustees for the use of the Indian library, or in the absence of such a board, to the tribal government for a contract for library service. Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to diminish the

funds, services or supplies provided to any Indian library by a library 1 2 system as defined in section two hundred seventy-two of this [article] 3 PART. Increases in appropriations for such purposes during a calendar 4 year shall be pro rated.

5 S 4. Section 273 of the education law, as amended by section 3 of part 6 of chapter 57 of the laws of 2005, subdivision 11 as added by section 0 7 3 of part A-5 of chapter 58 of the laws of 2006 and subdivision 12 as 8 amended by section 4-a of part A of chapter 57 of the laws of 2009, is 9 amended to read as follows:

10 S 273. Apportionment of state aid to libraries and library systems. 1. Any public library system providing service under an approved plan 11 12 during a calendar year shall be entitled to receive during that calendar 13 year state aid consisting of the following amounts: 14

a. An annual grant of:

15 (1)Ten thousand FIVE HUNDRED dollars where the library system serves 16 less than one county, or

17 (2) [Twenty] TWENTY-ONE thousand dollars where the library system 18 serves one entire county, or

19 (3) Where the library system serves more than one county the system 20 shall be entitled to receive [twenty-five] TWENTY-SIX thousand TWO HUNDRED FIFTY dollars for each entire county served and/or ten thousand 21 22 FIVE HUNDRED dollars for each county, any part of which is served by the 23 library system. If an entire county is served by two or more library systems, each of which serves a part thereof, each of such library 24 25 systems shall be entitled to receive a grant of ten thousand FIVE 26 HUNDRED dollars and in addition, a pro rata share of an additional sum of ten thousand FIVE HUNDRED dollars, such share to be computed in 27 28 accordance with the ratio which the population of the area of the county 29 served by such library system bears to the total population of the counas determined under subdivision one of section two hundred seventy-30 ty, two of this [article] PART. 31

32 b. In a library system which submits a plan for further development of 33 its central library, which plan shall be approved by the commissioner in 34 relation to standards for such central libraries, the amount of central 35 library development aid shall be:

(1) [thirty-two] THIRTY-FOUR cents per capita of the population within 36 37 the chartered area of service of such library system with a minimum amount of one hundred [five] TEN thousand TWO HUNDRED FIFTY dollars, and 38 39 (2) an additional [seventy-one] SEVENTY-FIVE thousand [five hundred] 40 FIFTY dollars to the library system for the purchase of HUNDRED TWO books and materials including nonprint materials, as defined in regu-41 lations of the commissioner, for its central library. Ownership of 42 43 library materials and equipment purchased with such central library aid 44 provided by this paragraph shall be vested in the public library system. 45 The sum of [ninety-four] NINETY-EIGHT AND SEVEN-TENTHS cents per c. 46 capita of population of the area served.

47 d. (1) An amount equal to the amount by which expenditures by the library system for books, periodicals, binding and nonprint materials during the preceding fiscal year exceeds forty cents per capita of popu-48 49 50 lation of the area served but the total apportionment pursuant to this 51 subparagraph shall not exceed [sixty-eight] SEVENTY-ONE AND FOUR-TENTHS cents per capita of population served. In the first year in which any 52 library system changes its reporting from the calendar year to a fiscal 53 54 year other than the calendar year, it shall file any additional report-55 schedules deemed necessary by the commissioner for the purpose of inq 56 determining state aid for the calendar year.

(2) Each public library system with an automation program to support bibliographic control and interlibrary sharing of information resources of member libraries, and to coordinate and integrate the automated system or systems of such member libraries consistent with regulations of the commissioner, shall be eligible to receive an amount equal to seven percent of the amount earned in subparagraph one of this paragraph, or [seventy-six] EIGHTY thousand [five] THREE hundred TWENTY-FIVE

7 graph, or [seventy-six] EIGH 8 dollars, whichever is more.

e. The sum of [fifty-two] FIFTY-FIVE dollars AND TWENTY-FIVE CENTS per 9 10 square mile of area served by the library system in the case of library 11 systems serving one county or less. Such sum shall be increased by five 12 dollars for each additional entire county served, provided, however, that no apportionment pursuant to this paragraph shall exceed [seventy-13 14 two] SEVENTY-FIVE dollars AND TWENTY-FIVE CENTS per square mile of area 15 served. If an entire county is served by two or more library systems, each of which serves a part thereof, each of such library systems shall 16 be entitled to receive, in addition to the aid computed in accordance 17 18 the foregoing provisions of this paragraph, a pro rata share of an with 19 increase of five dollars to be computed as follows: the sum resulting from the computation of five dollars per square mile of area served by 20 21 the one of such library systems which would receive the largest amount 22 aid pursuant to this paragraph shall be pro rated among the library of systems serving such county in accordance with the ratio which the popu-23 lation of the area served by each of such library systems bears to the 24 25 population of the county as determined under subdivision one of section 26 two hundred seventy-two of this [article] PART.

f. (1) Local library services aid. Except in cities with a population 27 excess of one million inhabitants, each chartered and registered 28 in 29 public and free association library meeting standards of service promulgated by the commissioner, and each public or free association library 30 serving a city with a population of one hundred thousand or more which 31 32 merged with the public library system on or before January first, nine-33 teen hundred seventy-six and which meets standards of service promulgat-34 ed by the commissioner, shall be eligible to receive annually [thirtyone] THIRTY-TWO AND FIFTY-FIVE HUNDREDTHS cents per capita of the 35 population of the library's chartered service area as on file with the 36 37 commissioner on January first of the calendar year for which aid is 38 payable, or, [thirty-one] THIRTY-TWO AND FIFTY-FIVE HUNDREDTHS cents per 39 capita of the population of the city with a population of one hundred 40 thousand or more whose public or free association library merged with the public library system on or before January first, nineteen hundred 41 42 seventy-six, with a minimum amount of one thousand five hundred SEVEN-43 TY-FIVE dollars, except that no library shall receive less than the 44 amount of local library services aid received in two thousand one. Regu-45 lations of the commissioner shall provide a method for establishing changes in chartered service areas or determining populations thereof. 46 47 Local library services aid shall be paid to the system for distribution 48 within thirty days of receipt to its member libraries in accordance with this subdivision. Notwithstanding any contrary provisions of this subparagraph, the commissioner shall establish procedures under which a 49 50 51 public or free association library may apply for a waiver of the requirements of the standards of service; provided, however, that any 52 such waivers may only be granted in the same year in which the commis-53 sioner has apportioned a reduction adjustment. 54

55 (2) Local services support aid. Except in cities with a population in 56 excess of one million inhabitants, each public library system operating 1 under an approved plan of service shall be eligible to receive annually 2 local services support aid equal to two-thirds of the total dollar 3 amount paid in local library services aid to the member libraries of the 4 system plus [thirty-one] THIRTY-TWO AND FIFTY-FIVE HUNDREDTHS cents per 5 capita of the system's population who do not reside within the chartered 6 service area of a member library.

7 (3) Local consolidated systems aid. In cities with a population in 8 excess of one million inhabitants, each public library system operating under an approved plan of service shall be eligible to receive annually 9 10 local consolidated system aid equal to the sum of (i) [thirty-one] THIR-11 TY-TWO AND FIFTY-FIVE HUNDREDTHS cents per capita of the population 12 served by the system, but not less than the amount of local library incentive aid received in nineteen hundred ninety-one as reported on the 13 14 library's nineteen hundred ninety-one annual report INCREASED BY FIVE 15 PERCENT OF THAT AMOUNT; and (ii) an additional amount equal to two-16 thirds of the total dollar amount computed for the system pursuant to 17 clause (i) of this subparagraph.

18 g. In addition to the sums otherwise provided in [paragraphs a, b, c, 19 d, e, f, h and i of] this subdivision, the New York Public Library shall 20 receive an amount equal to its actual expenditures for books, period-21 icals and binding for its research libraries which expenditures are not 22 otherwise reimbursed or [seven] EIGHT hundred [sixty-seven] FIVE thou-23 sand THREE HUNDRED FIFTY dollars, whichever is less, and the additional sum of five million [six] NINE hundred [forty-nine] THIRTY-TWO thousand 24 25 [six hundred] EIGHTY dollars for the general support of such research 26 libraries. In addition to any other sums provided to such library, the sum of two million dollars shall be payable annually to the New York Public Library for the general support of library services provided by 27 28 the New York Public Library to the students of the City University of 29 New York and the sum of one million dollars shall be payable annually to 30 the New York Public Library for the general support of its science, 31 32 industry and business library.

33 h. (1) Coordinated outreach services. Each public library system which 34 provides coordinated outreach services, as defined by regulations to be 35 promulgated by the commissioner, to persons who are educationally disadvantaged or who are members of ethnic or minority groups in need of 36 placement assistance, or who live in areas underserved by a library, or who are blind, physically disabled, have developmental or learning disa-bilities, or who are aged or confined in institutions. 37 38 39 40 to receive annually [forty-three] FORTY-FIVE thousand ONE HUNDRED FIFTY 41 dollars and [thirteen] FOURTEEN cents per capita of the total population 42 43 of the area served.

44 (2) Adult literacy grants. The commissioner shall award annual grants 45 for approved expenses for library-based programs conducted by public library systems and public and free association libraries which are 46 47 members of a public library system to assist adults to increase their 48 literacy skills. The commissioner shall award such grants having deter-49 mined that such programs are being operated in direct coordination with 50 local public schools, colleges and other organizations which are operat-51 similar adult literacy programs. Annual state aid of [two] FOUR inq hundred SIXTY thousand dollars shall be awarded for grants in accordance 52 with regulations promulgated by the commissioner. Ninety percent of the 53 54 amount of any such adult literacy grant shall be payable to the library 55 or system upon approval by the department. The final ten percent shall 56 be payable upon completion of the project.

(3) Family literacy grants. The commissioner shall award annual grants r approved expenses for library-based family literacy programs for 1 2 for 3 pre-school and school age children and their parents conducted by public 4 library systems and public libraries and free association libraries 5 which are members of a public library system. Annual state aid of 6 [three] SIX hundred SIXTY-FIVE thousand dollars for grants shall be 7 awarded in accordance with regulations promulgated by the commissioner. 8 Ninety percent of the amount of any such family literacy grant shall be payable to the library or system upon approval by the department. The 9 10 final ten percent shall be payable upon completion of the project.

11 i. In addition to any other sums provided for such purposes, the New 12 York Public Library shall receive annually the sum of seven hundred 13 [thirty-four] SEVENTY thousand SEVEN HUNDRED dollars for the program of 14 the Schomburg center for research in black culture, and the additional 15 sum of [nine] ONE MILLION THREE hundred [eighty-four] THIRTY-THREE thou-16 sand TWO HUNDRED dollars for the program of the library for the blind 17 and physically handicapped.

j. In addition to any other sums provided to such library, the sum of two hundred [fifty] SIXTY-TWO thousand FIVE HUNDRED dollars shall be paid annually to the New York Historical Society for making its library services available to the public.

k. In addition to any other sums provided to such library the sum of three hundred [fifty] SIXTY-SEVEN thousand FIVE HUNDRED dollars shall be payable annually to the Brooklyn Public Library for its business library for each calendar year.

1. In addition to any other sums provided to such library, the sum of [fifty] FIFTY-TWO thousand FIVE HUNDRED dollars shall be payable annually to the Buffalo and Erie County Public Library for a continuity of service project approved by the commissioner for each calendar year.

30 m. In addition to any other sums provided to such library system, the 31 sum of [thirty] THIRTY-ONE thousand FIVE HUNDRED dollars shall be paya-32 ble annually to the Nassau library system for a continuity of service 33 project approved by the commissioner for each calendar year.

n. IN ADDITION TO ANY OTHER SUM PROVIDED IN 34 THIS SUBDIVISION, EACH 35 PUBLIC LIBRARY SYSTEM WITH AN ELECTRONIC INFORMATION PROGRAM CONSISTENT WITH REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSIONER, SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ANNU-36 37 ALLY AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO EIGHT AND FOUR HUNDRED AND THIRTY-FIVE ONE THOU-38 SANDTH PERCENT OF THE TOTAL AMOUNT EARNED UNDER PARAGRAPHS A, C, E AND 39 SUBPARAGRAPH ONE OF PARAGRAPH D AND PARAGRAPH O OF THIS SUBDIVISION. THE 40 MINIMUM GRANT AVAILABLE SHALL BE SIXTY THOUSAND DOLLARS.

0. The minimum annual grant available to a library system under paragraphs a, c and e and subparagraph one of paragraph d of this subdivision shall be [six] SEVEN hundred [seventy-five] TEN thousand dollars.

(1) IN CALENDAR YEAR TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN AND THEREAFTER, EACH CHAR-45 TERED AND REGISTERED PUBLIC AND FREE ASSOCIATION LIBRARY MEETING STAND-ARDS OF SERVICE PROMULGATED BY THE COMMISSIONER AND SERVING 46 A CITY AS 47 THE FEDERAL CENSUS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO RECEIVE ANNUALLY DEFINED ΒY 48 URBAN LIBRARY SERVICES AID EQUAL TO ONE DOLLAR PER CAPITA OF THE POPU-49 LATION OF THE CITY AS DETERMINED BY THE LATEST FEDERAL CENSUS, PROVIDED 50 THAT IN THE CASE OF A CITY HAVING A POPULATION OF ONE MILLION OR MORE, 51 SHALL BE DETERMINED BASED ON THE POPULATION OF THE BOROUGH IN SUCH AID WHICH THE LIBRARY IS LOCATED. THIS ANNUAL STATE AID SHALL BE AWARDED 52 IΝ 53 ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS PROMULGATED BY THE COMMISSIONER. URBAN 54 LIBRARY SERVICES AID SHALL BE PAID TO THE LIBRARY SYSTEM FOR DISTRIB-55 WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF RECEIPT TO ITS ELIGIBLE MEMBER LIBRARIES IN UTION 56 ACCORDANCE WITH THIS SUBDIVISION.

(2) IN THE EVENT THAT THE SUM TOTAL OF LOCAL SPONSOR SUPPORT RAISED BY 1 2 LOCAL TAXATION EXCLUSIVE OF THE SUM RAISED FOR CAPITAL EXPENDITURES OR 3 THE TWELVE MONTH PERIOD, IS LESS THAN NINETY-FIVE PER DEBT SERVICE IN 4 CENTUM OF THE AVERAGE OF THE AMOUNTS RAISED FOR SUCH PURPOSES BY LOCAL 5 TAXATION FOR THE TWO PRECEDING TWELVE MONTH PERIODS, THE URBAN LIBRARY 6 SERVICES AID TO WHICH SUCH LIBRARY WOULD OTHERWISE BE ENTITLED SHALL BE7 REDUCED BY THE SAME RATIO.

19 6. Regional bibliographic data bases and interlibrary resources shara. The commissioner shall award annually to each of the approved 20 inq. 21 nine reference and research library resources systems, from funds appro-22 priated by the legislature for an annual grant for an automation program (i) to support bibliographic control and interlibrary sharing of infor-23 mation resources among all types of libraries and library systems in an 24 25 area not less than that of a reference and research library resources 26 system, and (ii) to coordinate and integrate the automated systems of 27 the component member public library system or systems, school library 28 systems and other automated systems within the area of the system or 29 reference and research library resources system. Each reference and 30 research library resources system of such region shall be entitled to an annual grant of two hundred TEN thousand dollars plus the sum of two AND 31 32 ONE-TENTH cents per capita of the population served.

7. Conservation and preservation of library research materials. a. 54 b. To be eligible for such grants, each such comprehensive research 55 library must submit both a five-year plan and an annual program budget. 56 The plan must satisfy criteria to be established by the commissioner in regulations relating to the identification of library research materi-

4 c. Additional grants, the sum of which shall not exceed three hundred 5 [fifty] SEVENTY-FIVE thousand dollars in any state fiscal year, may be 6 made to any or all of the eleven comprehensive research libraries for preservation and/or conservation of library research materials on the 7 8 basis of project proposals. Approval of such proposals, and determination of funding level, shall be based upon their contribution to 9 10 development of cooperative programs and/or facilities for conservation 11 and/or preservation works in the state, including but not limited to such factors as: institutional commitment to development of a collective 12 capacity and coordinated approach to conservation and preservation of 13 14 research materials important to the people of the state; research value 15 of materials to be preserved and/or conserved; appropriateness of conservation and preservation techniques in accordance with statewide 16 planning and national standards; institutional capacity for successful 17 18 completion of the project, including facilities, experience, and technical expertise; availability of staff with appropriate training and expertise; contribution of the institution to the project in matching 19 20 21 funds and staff resources; and volume of interlibrary lending and access 22 to holdings by the public. Ninety percent of each such grant shall be payable upon approval by the department and the remaining ten percent 23 24 shall be payable upon project completion.

Other agencies and libraries, as defined in regulations promulgated by the commissioner, which are not eligible for funding under paragraph 26 a of this subdivision, may receive separate grants the sum of which shall not exceed five hundred thousand dollars in any state fiscal year 27 28 29 to support the preservation and/or conservation of unique library research materials. Such agencies and libraries shall submit proposals 30 which shall be evaluated and determinations of approval and funding 31 32 shall be made on the same basis set forth in paragraph c of this subdi-33 vision. Ninety percent of each such grant shall be payable upon approval 34 by the department and the remaining ten percent shall be payable upon project completion. 35

e. Funds made available under the provisions of this section may 36 be 37 used by comprehensive research libraries and other agencies eligible for 38 funding to obtain matching funds from the national endowment for the 39 humanities preservation program.

The commissioner shall establish an office for coordination of conservation and/or preservation of library research materials to iden-41 tify the conservation and/or preservation needs of libraries within the 42 43 state, to assess the technology available for such conservation and and to coordinate the conservation and preservation 44 preservation, 45 efforts resulting from this legislation. THE NEW YORK STATE LIBRARY SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE ANNUALLY THE SUM OF FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS 46 47 COORDINATION OF CONSERVATION AND/OR PRESERVATION EFFORTS RESULTING FOR 48 FROM THIS LEGISLATION.

8. New York state talking book and braille library. The New York state 49 50 talking book and braille library shall be entitled to receive annually 51 amount equal to the product of the aid ceiling multiplied by the an number of registered borrowers of such materials of such library as of 52 the November report for the November immediately preceding the state 53 54 fiscal year for which the payment will be made. Such amount shall be 55 used to improve the quality of services provided to such borrowers. For aid payable in each state fiscal year, the aid ceiling per registered 56

borrower shall be [nineteen] TWENTY-SEVEN dollars. Notwithstanding any 1 other provision of law, the New York state talking book and braille 2 3 library shall be the successor in interest to the New York state library 4 for the blind and visually handicapped for all purposes, or the library 5 for the blind and physically handicapped, and the change in name shall 6 affect the rights or interests of any party. Except where the not context indicates a contrary intent, any reference in any other general 7 8 or special law to the New York state library for the blind and visually handicapped or the library for the blind and physically handicapped 9 10 shall be deemed a reference to the New York state talking book and 11 braille library.

12 9. NEW YORK ONLINE VIRTUAL ELECTRONIC LIBRARY. THE NEW YORK STATE SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE ANNUALLY THE SUM OF FIVE MILLION 13 LIBRARY 14 DOLLARS FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A STATEWIDE NEW YORK 15 ONLINE VIRTUAL ELECTRONIC LIBRARY FOR THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE. OF SUCH AMOUNT AT LEAST FOUR MILLION FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS SHALL BE MADE 16 AVAILABLE FOR STATEWIDE ACCESS TO ELECTRONIC INFORMATION BY NEW YORKERS, 17 18 WHICH MAY INCLUDE CONTRACTING WITH LIBRARY SYSTEMS OR OTHER LIBRARIES TO 19 DELIVER STATEWIDE SERVICES FOR THIS PURPOSE; AND FIVE HUNDRED THOUSAND BE MADE AVAILABLE FOR STRENGTHENING STATEWIDE 20 DOLLARS SHALL LIBRARY 21 SERVICES THAT SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT AND MAINTENANCE OF THE STATEWIDE 22 DIGITAL LIBRARY AND ELECTRONIC ACCESS TO INFORMATION. SUCH STATEWIDE SERVICES MAY INCLUDE, BUT SHALL NOT BE LIMITED TO, TRAINING, HELP DESK 23 SUPPORT, TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO LIBRARIES AND LIBRARY SYSTEMS, PUBLICA-24 25 TIONS, COMMUNICATIONS, AND PROGRAM PLANNING AND EVALUATION.

26 10. DIGITIZATION OF LIBRARY RESEARCH MATERIALS. INADDITION ΤO ANY 27 OTHER SUMS PROVIDED FOR SUCH PURPOSES, THE COMMISSIONER SHALL ANNUALLY 28 AWARD GRANTS FOR COMPETITIVE DIGITIZATION PROJECTS CONDUCTED BY А 29 LIBRARY SYSTEM OR LIBRARY, WHICH IS A MEMBER OF A LIBRARY SYSTEM. GRANTS SHALL BE PROVIDED FOR THE PERIOD COMMENCING JULY FIRST AND ENDING 30 ON THE FOLLOWING JUNE THIRTIETH. ANNUAL STATE AID OF ONE MILLION DOLLARS 31 32 FOR GRANT AWARDS, INCLUDING UP TO FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS TO THE NEW YORK STATE LIBRARY FOR THE REVIEW OF PROJECT PROPOSALS SUBMITTED BY LIBRARIES 33 34 OR LIBRARY SYSTEMS, INCLUDING PEER REVIEW, SHALL BE ALLOCATED FOR THIS PURPOSE. APPLICATIONS FOR GRANTS BY MEMBER LIBRARIES MUST BE ENDORSED BY 35 THE LIBRARY SYSTEM. SUCH GRANTS SHALL BE AWARDED ON THE BASIS OF PROJECT 36 37 PROPOSALS IN ACCORDANCE WITH PROJECT PROPOSAL GUIDELINES. CRITERIA FOR 38 APPROVAL OF SUCH PROPOSALS AND DETERMINATION OF FUNDING LEVELS SHALL BE BASED UPON, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, SUCH FACTORS AS: 39

A. THE PROJECT IS BEING OPERATED BY THE APPLICANT IN DIRECT COORDINATION WITH ONE OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING INSTITUTIONS: ANOTHER LIBRARY,
A LIBRARY SYSTEM, LOCAL PUBLIC SCHOOL, A COLLEGE OR UNIVERSITY, LOCAL
GOVERNMENT OR ANY OTHER NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATION PROVIDING EDUCATION,
CULTURAL AND INFORMATION SERVICES TO THE COMMUNITY OR TO THE PEOPLE OF
THE STATE;

B. INSTITUTIONAL COMMITMENT ON THE PART OF THE APPLICANT TO THE DEVELOPMENT OF A COORDINATED APPROACH TO DIGITIZATION OF MATERIALS IMPORTANT
TO THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE;

49 C. APPROPRIATENESS OF PLANNING IN RELATION TO NATIONAL STANDARDS OR 50 BEST PRACTICES AND STATEWIDE PLANNING; THE PROJECT'S IMPACT ON ACCESS TO 51 HOLDINGS AND INFORMATION BY THE PUBLIC;

52 D. CONTRIBUTION OF THE APPLICANT INSTITUTION TO THE PROJECT IN MATCH-53 ING FUNDS AND STAFF RESOURCES; AND INSTITUTIONAL CAPACITY FOR SUCCESSFUL 54 COMPLETION OF THE PROJECT INCLUDING FACILITIES, EXPERIENCE, TECHNICAL 55 CAPACITY AND EXPERTISE. 1 11. NEW YORK STATE LIBRARY RESEARCH COLLECTIONS. IN ADDITION TO ANY 2 OTHER SUMS PROVIDED FOR SUCH PURPOSES, THE NEW YORK STATE LIBRARY SHALL 3 RECEIVE ANNUALLY FOR STRENGTHENING ITS RESEARCH COLLECTIONS AN AMOUNT 4 EQUAL TO SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS.

12. State aid for a coordinated program of library and archival services at The Center for Jewish History, Inc. a. In addition to any 5 6 7 other sums provided to The Center for Jewish History, Inc., the commis-8 sioner shall award in any state fiscal year an annual grant of two hundred thousand dollars for a coordinated program of library and 9 10 archival services that will increase public access to the library and archival collections of The Center for Jewish History, Inc. and its 11 12 member institutions.

b. The Center for Jewish History, Inc. is hereby admitted to the University of the State of New York and shall, as a condition of continued receipt of aid, maintain such status in accordance with regulations of the commissioner. Such regulations may include submission of a fiveyear plan and annual program budget.

18 13. State aid for summer reading programs. The commissioner is [10.] 19 hereby authorized to expend the funds of the love your library fund, established in section ninety-nine-1 of the state finance law, which 20 21 shall provide grants for participation in statewide summer reading programs as coordinated by the state library to public library systems 22 on the basis of criteria to be developed by the commissioner. Upon a 23 24 determination by the commissioner that there is adequate revenue avail-25 able for a grant program in the upcoming fiscal year, grants shall be 26 awarded as follows:

a. sixty percent of the funds appropriated pursuant to this section shall be made available to public library systems for use by member libraries by the commissioner in such manner as to insure that the ratio of the amount received within each system to the whole of the aid made available pursuant to this paragraph is no greater than the ratio of the population served by such system to the population of the state; and

b. forty percent of the funds appropriated pursuant to this section
shall be made available to library systems for use by their member
libraries within each system by the commissioner in such manner as to
insure that an equal amount is received within each system in the state.

[11.] 14. Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the contrary, each year commencing with the two thousand six calendar year, no library or library system shall receive less aid pursuant to this section or section two hundred seventy-one or two hundred seventy-two of this part than it would have been eligible to receive for the two thousand one calendar year solely by reason of a decrease in the population of the area served as a result of the latest approved federal census.

44 [12.] 15. The commissioner is hereby authorized to expend in state 45 fiscal year two thousand six--two thousand seven three million dollars and in state fiscal year two thousand seven--two thousand eight eight 46 47 million dollars and in state fiscal year two thousand eight--two thousand nine seven million nine hundred forty thousand dollars and in state 48 49 fiscal year two thousand nine--two thousand ten eight million dollars 50 an appropriation for formula grants to public library subject to 51 systems, reference and research library resources systems, and school library systems operating under an approved plan of service. Such formu-52 la grants shall be provided for the period commencing July first and 53 54 ending on June thirtieth next following. Such formula grants will be 55 distributed in the following manner:

Each public library system established pursuant to sections two 1 a. 2 hundred fifty-five and two hundred seventy-two of this part and operat-3 under a plan approved by the commissioner is entitled to receive inq thirty-nine thousand dollars and an amount equal to ten and ninety-four 4 hundredths percent of the amount of state aid received for the current 5 6 year by such system under paragraphs a, c, d, e and n of subdivision one 7 of this section for the two thousand nine--two thousand ten state fiscal 8 year;

9 b. Each reference and research library resources system established 10 pursuant to section two hundred seventy-two of this part and operating 11 under a plan approved by the commissioner is entitled to receive thir-12 ty-nine thousand dollars and an amount equal to ten and ninety-four 13 hundredths percent of the amount of state aid received for the current 14 year under paragraph a of subdivision four of this section for the two 15 thousand nine--two thousand ten state fiscal year; and

c. Each school library system established pursuant 16 to section two 17 hundred eighty-two of this part and operating under a plan approved by 18 the commissioner is entitled to receive thirty-nine thousand dollars and 19 an amount equal to ten and ninety-four hundredths percent of the amount 20 state aid received for the current year by such system under paraof 21 graphs a, b, c[, d, e] and [f] D of subdivision one of section two 22 hundred eighty-four of this part for the two thousand nine--two thousand 23 ten state fiscal year.

24 S 5. Subdivision 1 of section 273-a of the education law, as amended 25 by section 4 of part A of chapter 57 of the laws of 2009, is amended to 26 read as follows:

27 State aid shall be provided for up to fifty percent of the total 1. 28 project approved costs, excluding feasibility studies, plans or similar 29 activities, for projects for the acquisition, construction, renovation or rehabilitation, including leasehold improvements, of buildings of 30 public libraries and library systems chartered by the regents of the 31 32 state of New York or established by act of the legislature subject to 33 limitations provided in subdivision four of this section and upon the approval by the commissioner, EXCEPT THAT THOSE LIBRARIES 34 THAT SERVE ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED COMMUNITIES, AS DETERMINED BY THE COMMISSION-35 PURSUANT TO REGULATIONS ADOPTED FOR SUCH PURPOSE, SHALL BE ELIGIBLE 36 ER 37 TO RECEIVE STATE AID FOR UP TO SEVENTY-FIVE PERCENT OF THE APPROVED 38 TOTAL PROJECT COSTS. Provided however that the state liability for aid paid pursuant to this section shall be limited to funds appropriated for 39 40 such purpose. Aid shall be provided on approved expenses incurred during the period commencing July first and ending June thirtieth for up to 41 three years, or until the project is completed, whichever occurs first. 42 43 Fifty percent of such aid shall be payable to each system or library 44 upon approval of the application. Forty percent of such aid shall be 45 payable in the next state fiscal year. The remaining ten percent shall 46 be payable upon project completion.

S 6. Section 284 of the education law, as amended by section 5 of part of chapter 57 of the laws of 2005 and paragraph f of subdivision 1 as amended by chapter 654 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as follows:

Each school library 52 system established pursuant to section two hundred eighty-two of this 53 part and operating under a plan approved by the commissioner shall be 54 eligible to receive funding under this section consisting of the follow-55 ing amounts:

Each school library system with a public and nonpublic school enrollment of less than [one] FIVE hundred thousand students shall 1 2 receive a base grant of [eighty-three] ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-FIVE thousand 3 4 dollars; 5 [Each school library system with a public and nonpublic school b. 6 enrollment of one hundred thousand students but less than two hundred 7 thousand students shall receive a base grant of ninety thousand dollars; 8 Each school library system with a public and nonpublic school c. enrollment of two hundred thousand students but less than five hundred 9 10 thousand students shall receive a base grant of one hundred twenty-three 11 thousand dollars; and d.] Each school library system with a public and nonpublic school enrollment of more than five hundred thousand students shall receive a 12 13 14 base grant of eight hundred ninety-seven thousand dollars[.]; 15 [e.] C. In addition to the base grant provided in paragraph a[,] OR b[, c or d] of this subdivision, each school library system shall 16 17 receive annually: (1) [twenty-nine] SEVENTY-FIVE cents per student enrolled in the 18 19 public and nonpublic schools located within such system, and (2) [five] SIX hundred dollars per public school district located 20 21 within such system, and a minimum of [four] FIVE thousand [three 22 hundred] dollars per system located within a board of cooperative educa-23 tional services area, or [five] SIX thousand dollars per city school 24 district of a city with a population of one hundred twenty-five thousand 25 inhabitants or more, and FIVE dollars [and forty-five cents] per square mile of the 26 (3) [two] school library system[.]; 27 28 [f.] D. In addition to any other sum provided in this subdivision, any 29 school library system formed through an act of merger since January first, nineteen hundred eighty-four shall receive fifty thousand dollars 30 annually for each approved act of merger, provided, however, that any 31 32 school library system formed through an act of merger on or after April 33 first, two thousand eight shall receive ninety thousand dollars annually 34 for each approved act of merger[.]; AND 35 In addition to any other sum provided in this subdivision, [q.] E. library system WITH AN ELECTRONIC INFORMATION PROGRAM 36 each school CONSISTENT WITH THE REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSIONER shall be eligible to 37 38 receive annually an [automation grant amounting] AMOUNT EQUAL to [ten] THIRTY-EIGHT percent of the total aid produced for that system by adding 39 40 the base grant provided by paragraph a[,] OR b[, c or d] of this subdivision to the additional aid provided by paragraphs [e and f] C AND D of 41 42 this subdivision. 43 2. Before a school library system shall be entitled to receive operat-44 funds, such system shall submit a plan of library service to the inq commissioner for approval. The commissioner shall establish standards of service for school library systems by regulation. Such regulations shall 45 46 47 contain standards relating to: system staffing; union catalog and database development; interlibrary loan; communications and delivery; gover-48 nance and advisory committees; membership criteria and the means of

49 nance and advisory committees; membership criteria and the means of 50 relating district library resources and programs to those of the system; 51 non-public school participation; and procedures for submission and 52 approval of plans and certification of membership.

53 3. The moneys made available pursuant to this section shall be 54 distributed to each school library system whose plan of service has been 55 approved under the provisions of subdivision two of this section.

1 4. Each school library system receiving state aid pursuant to this section shall furnish such information regarding its library service as 2 3 the commissioner may from time to time require to determine whether it 4 is operating in accordance with its plan and the standards of service 5 the commissioner has established. The commissioner may at any time after 6 affording notice and an opportunity to be heard, revoke approval of a 7 plan of library service if the commissioner finds that the school library system no longer conforms to its approved plan, the provisions 8 9 of this section or the regulations promulgated by the commissioner here-10 under; or, in the case of provisional approval, if such school library system no longer conforms to the agreement, plans or conditions upon 11 which such provisional approval was based. In such case a school library 12 13 system shall not thereafter be entitled to state aid pursuant to this 14 section unless and until its plan of library service is again approved 15 by the commissioner.

16 S 7. Section 285 of the education law, as amended by section 6 of part 17 O of chapter 57 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as follows:

S 285. State aid for cooperation with correctional facilities. 1. Each 18 19 public library system operating under an approved plan of service which has a state correctional facility or facilities within its area of 20 21 service shall be awarded an annual grant of nine dollars [twenty-five] 22 SEVENTY cents per capita for the inmate population of such facility or 23 facilities to make available to the inmate population of such facility 24 facilities, in direct coordination with the correctional facilities or 25 libraries, the library resources of such system. The commissioner shall 26 adopt any regulations necessary to carry out the purposes and provisions 27 of this subdivision.

28 The commissioner is authorized to expend up to one hundred [seven-2. 29 ty-five thousand] EIGHTY-THREE THOUSAND SEVEN HUNDRED FIFTY dollars annually to provide grants to public library systems operating under an 30 approved plan of service for provision of services to county jail facil-31 32 ities. Such formula grants shall assist the library system in making 33 available to the inmate population of such facility or facilities the 34 library resources of such system. Such grants shall be available to each 35 public library system in such manner as to insure that the ratio of the amount each system is eligible to receive equals the ratio of the number 36 37 of inmates served by the county jail facility to the total number of inmates served by county jail facilities in the state as of July first 38 39 of the year preceding the calendar year in which the state aid to public 40 library systems is to be paid. Inmate populations shall be certified by the New York state commission of correction. The commissioner shall 41 42 adopt any regulations necessary to carry out the purposes and provisions 43 of this subdivision.

44 S 8. The education law is amended by adding a new section 286 to read 45 as follows:

46 S 286. STATE AID FOR NEW YORK EXCELLENCE IN LIBRARY SERVICES PROGRAM. YEAR TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN--TWO THOUSAND TWELVE AND 47 STATE FISCAL 1. SUCH GRANTS SHALL BE DETERMINED ON 53 54 THE BASIS OF CRITERIA ΤO BE DEVELOPED BY THE COMMISSIONER AND SHALL 55 ASSIST MEMBER LIBRARIES AND DISTRICTS IN MEETING AND EXCEEDING STANDARDS 56 OF EXCELLENCE ESTABLISHED BY THE REGENTS. GRANTS SHALL BE PROVIDED FOR 1 THE PERIOD COMMENCING JULY FIRST AND ENDING ON JUNE THIRTIETH NEXT 2 FOLLOWING. THE STATE AID SHALL BE AWARDED IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS 3 PROMULGATED BY THE COMMISSIONER.

4 2. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL PROVIDE GRANTS TO ELIGIBLE PUBLIC LIBRARY 5 SYSTEMS, REFERENCE AND RESEARCH LIBRARY RESOURCES SYSTEMS AND SCHOOL 6 LIBRARY SYSTEMS FOR PROGRAMS OF EXCELLENCE IN THE FOLLOWING MANNER:

FUNDS SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO EACH SYSTEM IN SUCH MANNER AS TO INSURE THAT THE RATIO OF THE STATE AID FOR PROGRAMS OF 11 EXCELLENCE 12 EXCEED THE RATIO OF STATE AID RECEIVED BY EACH SYSTEM UNDER SHALL NOT PARAGRAPHS A, C, D, E AND O OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED 13 14 SEVENTY-THREE OF THIS PART;

AN AMOUNT OF FOUR HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR REFERENCE AND 15 Β. 16 RESEARCH LIBRARY RESOURCES SYSTEMS ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION TWO 17 SEVENTY-TWO OF THIS PART AND OPERATING UNDER A PLAN APPROVED BY HUNDRED 18 THE COMMISSIONER. FUNDS SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO EACH SYSTEM IN SUCH MANNER 19 AS TO INSURE THAT THE RATIO OF THE STATE AID FOR PROGRAMS OF EXCELLENCE 20 SHALL NOT EXCEED THE RATIO OF STATE AID RECEIVED BY SUCH SYSTEM UNDER 21 PARAGRAPH A OF SUBDIVISION FOUR OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED SEVENTY-THREE OF 22 THIS PART; AND

AN AMOUNT OF SIX HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR SCHOOL LIBRARY 23 C. 24 SYSTEMS ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SECTION TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY-TWO OF THIS 25 OPERATING UNDER A PLAN APPROVED BY THE COMMISSIONER. PART AND FUNDS 26 SHALL BE AVAILABLE TO EACH SYSTEM IN SUCH MANNER AS TO INSURE THAT THE 27 RATIO OF THE STATE AID FOR PROGRAMS OF EXCELLENCE SHALL NOT EXCEED THE RATIO OF STATE AID RECEIVED BY EACH SYSTEM UNDER PARAGRAPHS A, B, C AND 28 D OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED EIGHTY-FOUR OF THIS PART. 29

THE STATE FISCAL YEAR TWO THOUSAND ELEVEN--TWO THOUSAND TWELVE 30 IN 3. AND THEREAFTER, THE NEW YORK STATE LIBRARY SHALL BE ENTITLED TO RECEIVE 31 32 YEAR THE SUM OF TWO HUNDRED FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR THE ESTAB-EACH 33 LISHMENT AND IMPLEMENTATION OF A STATEWIDE PROGRAM OF EXCELLENCE IN 34 LIBRARY SERVICES FOR LIBRARY SYSTEMS AND THE MEMBER LIBRARIES AND 35 DISTRICTS OF SUCH SYSTEMS. SUCH STATEWIDE SERVICES MAY INCLUDE, BUT ARE NOT LIMITED TO TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE AND TRAINING FOR LIBRARIES AND 36 37 LIBRARY SYSTEMS, PUBLICATIONS, COMMUNICATIONS AND PROGRAM PLANNING, 38 IMPLEMENTATION AND EVALUATION.

39 S 9. Subdivision 3 of section 99-1 of the state finance law, as added 40 by chapter 303 of the laws of 2004, is amended to read as follows:

3. Moneys of the fund, following appropriation by the legislature shall be expended only for the purposes of providing funding for the 41 42 43 statewide summer reading program set forth in subdivision [ten] THIRTEEN 44 of section two hundred seventy-three of the education law. Moneys shall 45 paid out of the fund on the audit and warrant of the state compbe troller on vouchers approved and certified by the commissioner of educa-46 47 tion. Any interest received by the comptroller on moneys on deposit in 48 the love your library fund shall be retained in and become part of such 49 fund.

50 S 10. This act shall take effect April 1, 2011; provided that in the 51 event this act shall have become a law after such date, this act shall 52 take effect immediately and shall be deemed to have been in full force 53 and effect on and after April 1, 2011, and provided further that for the 54 purposes of computing the apportionments of calendar year state aid, 55 grants or other financial assistance to libraries and library systems 56 for the 2011 calendar year, this act shall take effect immediately and 1 shall be deemed to have been in full force and effect on and after Janu-2 ary 1, 2011.
