Introduced by M. of A. MAGEE -- read once and referred to the Committee on Environmental Conservation -- reported and referred to the Committee on Codes -- committee discharged, bill amended, ordered reprinted as amended and recommitted to said committee

AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to snapping turtles; and providing for the repeal of such provisions upon expiration thereof

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Subdivision 10 of section 11-0701 of the environmental
2 conservation law, as amended by chapter 57 of the laws of 1993 and as
3 renumbered by chapter 470 of the laws of 1994, is amended to read as
4 follows:
- 5 10. A trapping license entitles the holder to trap beaver, otter,
6 fisher, mink, muskrat, skunk, raccoon, bobcat, coyote, fox, opossum,
7 weasel, pine marten, SNAPPING TURTLES, and unprotected wildlife except
8 birds, as provided in title 11 OF THIS ARTICLE, subject to the
9 provisions of subdivision [6] 3 of section 11-0713 of this article.
- 10 S 2. Paragraph c of subdivision 3 of section 11-0901 of the environ-
11 mental conservation law, as amended by chapter 825 of the laws of 1973
12 and subparagraph 1 as amended by chapter 407 of the laws of 1976, is
13 amended to read as follows:
- 14 c. Wild small game and wild upland game birds shall be taken only by
15 longbow or gun, or by the use of raptors as provided in title 10 of this
16 article, except that:
- 17 (1) skunk, raccoon, bobcat, coyote, fox, mink and muskrat may be taken
18 in any manner not prohibited in this section or in title 11 of [the Fish
19 and Wildlife Law] THIS ARTICLE, and
- 20 (2) frogs AND SNAPPING TURTLES may also be taken by spearing, catching
21 with the hands, or by the use of a club or hook, AND SNAPPING TURTLES

3 S 3. Subdivision 1 of section 11-1103 of the environmental conserva-
4 tion law, as amended by chapter 911 of the laws of 1990, is amended to
5 read as follows:

6 1. The department may by regulation permit trapping of beaver, fisher,
7 otter, bobcat, coyote, fox, raccoon, opossum, weasel, skunk, muskrat,
8 pine marten [and], mink, SNAPPING TURTLES, or any of them, in specified
9 areas, and may regulate the taking, possession and disposition of such
10 animals. The periods in which trapping of such animals is so permitted
11 are open seasons for the trapping of the species for which the period is
12 fixed, in the area or areas for which it is so fixed.

13 S 4. This act shall take effect immediately and shall expire and be
14 deemed repealed on and after September 30, 2014.
