Introduced by M. of A. THIELE -- read once and referred to the Committee on Governmental Employees

AN ACT to amend the retirement and social security law, in relation to the employment of police officers in the town of Southampton; and to repeal certain provisions of such law relating thereto

PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision m of section 384-d of the retirement and social security law is REPEALED and a new subdivision m is added to read as follows:

NOTWITHSTANDING ANY INCONSISTENT PROVISION OF LAW, IF THE TOWN BOARD OF THE TOWN OF SOUTHAMPTON ELECTS TO MAKE THEBENEFITS SECTION AVAILABLE TO THE MEMBERS OF ITS POLICE DEPARTMENT, EACH MEMBER OF SUCH DEPARTMENT SHALL BE SEPARATED FROM SERVICE UPON COMPLETION TWENTY YEARS OF SERVICE, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT THE TOWN BOARD MAY PERMIT A MEMBER TO CONTINUE IN SERVICE ON AN ANNUAL BASIS AFTER COMPLETION OF TWENTY YEARS OF SERVICE, BUT IN NO EVENT SHALL SUCH ANNUAL SERVICE BE CONTINUED AFTER A MEMBER HAS ATTAINED AGE FIFTY-FIVE UNLESS SUCH MEMBER HAS NOT ATTAINED TWENTY YEARS OF SERVICE, EXCEPT THAT MEMBERS OF SUCH DEPARTMENT WHO HOLD THE RANK OF SERGEANT OR HIGHER

13 WITHIN SUCH DEPARTMENT MAY BE PERMITTED BY THE TOWN BOARD TO REMAIN 14

SERVICE UNTIL THE MEMBER HAS ATTAINED AGE SIXTY. 15

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.

FISCAL NOTE. -- Pursuant to Legislative Law, Section 50:

This bill will amend Subdivision (m) of Section 384-d of the Retirement and Social Security Law so as to not force a police officer employed by the Town of Southampton to retire after attaining age 55 without 20 years of service.

If this bill is enacted, there will be no cost.
