Introduced by M. of A. DINOWITZ -- read once and referred to the Committee on Aging

AN ACT to amend the public health law and the elder law, in relation to requiring hospitals to provide long-term care contact information to certain patients

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The public health law is amended by adding a new section 2803-t to read as follows:

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- 2803-T. LONG-TERM CARE CONTACT INFORMATION. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL REOUIRE THAT EVERY HOSPITAL SHALL PROVIDE TO EVERY PATIENT ANTICIPATED IN NEED OF LONG-TERM CARE, CONTACT INFORMATION AT THE TIME SUCH DETERMINATION IS MADE FOR AT LEAST ONE POINT OF CONTACT IN THE PATIENT'S CHOICES COUNTY OF RESIDENCE FOR THE NY CONNECTS: FOR LONG TERM PROGRAM ESTABLISHED PURSUANT TO SUBDIVISION EIGHT OF SECTION TWO HUNDRED OF THE ELDER LAW, OR IN THE EVENT THAT SUCH POINT OF CONTACT DOES NOT EXIST IN THE PATIENT'S COUNTY OF RESIDENCE, CONTACT INFORMATION FOR ON AGING SERVING THE PATIENT'S COUNTY OF RESIDENCE, AND ANY AGENCY OTHER INFORMATION APPROPRIATE TO THE NEEDS AND CHARACTERISTICS OF PATIENT, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO LOCAL INDEPENDENT LIVING CENTERS, LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF SOCIAL SERVICES AND LOCAL DEPARTMENTS OF HEALTH.
- S 2. Subdivision 8 of section 203 of the elder law, as added by section 18 of part B of chapter 58 of the laws of 2007, is amended to read as follows:
- [8.] 9. The director, in consultation with the commissioner of health, shall establish a program to be known as the NY Connects: Choices for Long Term Care. The purpose of this initiative is to provide consistent, comprehensive, locally-based information and assistance on long term care services to consumers, caregivers and families to help them make educated choices. This program shall provide individuals, caregivers, and families with objective information and assistance about home,

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community-based and institutional long term care services. NY Connects will be available on a voluntary basis to consumers, caregivers and their families. There shall be an on-going education and outreach campaign to educate the public about long term care services available in their community and to assist consumers in preparing for their long term care needs, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO PROVIDING LONG-TERM CARE CONTACT INFORMATION ESTABLISHED UNDER SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED THREE-T OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW.
