AN ACT to amend the vehicle and traffic law, in relation to limiting the use of certain substances in brake friction material

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Legislative findings. The legislature finds that brake 1 2 friction is an essential component of motor vehicle brakes and is crit-3 ically important to transportation safety and public safety in general. 4 Debris from brake friction materials containing copper and its compounds 5 generated and released into the environment during normal operation is 6 of motor vehicle brakes. Thousands of pounds of copper and other 7 from brake friction material enter New York state released substances 8 streams, rivers and marine environments as a result of the normal operation of motor vehicle brakes. The legislature finds that brake friction 9 10 materials are toxic to many aquatic and marine organisms and must be 11 regulated to ensure the quality, safety, and health of the state's 12 waterways.

13 S 2. The vehicle and traffic law is amended by adding a new section 14 382-d to read as follows:

1. 15 S 382-D. BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL. DEFINITIONS. (A) "ALTERNATIVE 16 BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL" MEANS BRAKE MATERIAL THAT: (I) DOES NOT 17 CONTAIN: (A) MORE THAN 0.5 PERCENT COPPER OR ITS COMPOUNDS ΒY WEIGHT; (B) THE CONSTITUENTS IDENTIFIED IN SUBDIVISION TWO OF THIS SECTION AT OR 18 19 ABOVE THE CONCENTRATIONS SPECIFIED; OR (C) OTHER MATERIALS DETERMINED BY 20 THE DEPARTMENT TO BE MORE HARMFUL TO HUMAN HEALTH OR THE ENVIRONMENT 21 THAN EXISTING BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL; (II) ENABLES MOTOR VEHICLE BRAKES 22 TO MEET APPLICABLE FEDERAL SAFETY STANDARDS, OR ΙF NO FEDERAL SAFETY STANDARD EXISTS, A WIDELY ACCEPTED INDUSTRY STANDARD; (III) IS AVAILABLE 23 A COST AND QUANTITY THAT DOES NOT CAUSE SIGNIFICANT FINANCIAL HARD-24 AT 25 SHIP ACROSS A MAJORITY OF BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL AND VEHICLE MANUFAC-26 TURING INDUSTRIES; AND (IV) IS AVAILABLE TO ENABLE BRAKE FRICTION MATE-27 MANUFACTURERS TO PRODUCE PRODUCTS RIAL AND VEHICLE VIABLE MEETING CONSUMER EXPECTATIONS REGARDING BRAKE NOISE, SHUDDERING AND DURABILITY. 28

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4 (C) "MOTOR VEHICLE" MEANS A VEHICLE AS DEFINED BY SECTION ONE HUNDRED 5 TWENTY-FIVE OF THIS CHAPTER; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION SUCH TERM SHALL NOT INCLUDE A MOTORCYCLE AS DEFINED BY SECTION 6 7 ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-THREE OF THIS CHAPTER.

8 (D) "MOTOR VEHICLE BRAKE" MEANS AN ENERGY CONVERSION MECHANISM USED TO SLOW OR STOP THE MOVEMENT OF A MOTOR VEHICLE BUT DOES NOT INCLUDE BRAKES 9 10 DESIGNED PRIMARILY TO HOLD MOTOR VEHICLES STATIONARY AND ARE NOT FOR USE WHILE MOTOR VEHICLES ARE IN MOTION. 11

12 "ORIGINAL EOUIPMENT SERVICE" MEANS BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL (E) 13 PROVIDED AS SERVICE PARTS ORIGINALLY DESIGNED FOR AND USING THE SAME 14 BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL FORMULATION SOLD WITH A NEW MOTOR VEHICLE.

15 (F) "SMALL VOLUME MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURER" MEANS A MANUFACTURER OF 16 MOTOR VEHICLES WITH ANNUAL SALES IN NEW YORK OF LESS THAN ONE THOUSAND NEW PASSENGER CARS, LIGHT-DUTY VEHICLES, HEAVY-DUTY VEHICLES, AND HEAV-17 Y-DUTY ENGINES BASED ON THE AVERAGE NUMBER OF VEHICLES SOLD FOR THE 18 19 THREE PREVIOUS CONSECUTIVE MODEL YEARS.

2. PROHIBITIONS ON BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL. (A) BEGINNING JANUARY 20 21 FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SIXTEEN, NO MANUFACTURER, WHOLESALER, RETAILER, OR DISTRIBUTOR MAY SELL OR OFFER FOR SALE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL IN NEW 22 YORK STATE CONTAINING ANY OF THE FOLLOWING CONSTITUENTS IN AN AMOUNT 23 24 EXCEEDING THE SPECIFIED CONCENTRATIONS: 25

(I) ASBESTIFORM FIBERS: 0.1 PERCENT BY WEIGHT;

(II) CADMIUM AND ITS COMPOUNDS: 0.01 PERCENT BY WEIGHT;

(III) CHROMIUM (VI) SALTS: 0.1 PERCENT BY WEIGHT;

(IV) LEAD AND ITS COMPOUNDS: 0.1 PERCENT BY WEIGHT; 28

29 (V) MERCURY AND ITS COMPOUNDS: 0.1 PERCENT BY WEIGHT.

(B) BEGINNING ON JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TWENTY-THREE NO MANUFAC-30 TURER, WHOLESALER, RETAILER, OR DISTRIBUTOR MAY SELL OR OFFER FOR SALE 31 32 BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL IN NEW YORK STATE CONTAINING MORE THAN FIVE PERCENT COPPER AND ITS COMPOUNDS BY WEIGHT. 33

34 (C) BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURED PRIOR TO TWO THOUSAND SEVEN-35 TEEN IS EXEMPT FROM THE DEADLINE MANDATED BY PARAGRAPH (A) OF THIS SUBDIVISION FOR THE PURPOSES OF CLEARING INVENTORY; PROVIDED, HOWEVER 36 37 THAT SUCH EXEMPTION SHALL NOT EXTEND BEYOND JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND 38 TWENTY-SEVEN.

39 (D) BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURED PRIOR TO TWO THOUSAND TWEN-40 TY-THREE IS EXEMPT FROM THE DEADLINE MANDATED BY PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION FOR THE PURPOSES OF CLEARING INVENTORY; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, 41 THAT SUCH EXEMPTION SHALL NOT EXTEND BEYOND JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND 42 43 THIRTY-THREE.

48 (F) BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURED AS PART OF AN ORIGINAL EQUIP-49 MENT SERVICE CONTRACT FOR VEHICLES MANUFACTURED PRIOR TO JANUARY FIRST, 50 TWO THOUSAND TWENTY-THREE, IS EXEMPT FROM THE DEADLINE MANDATED IN PARA-51 GRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION.

3. DEPARTMENT REVIEW OF ALTERNATIVE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL. (A) ON OR 52 BEFORE DECEMBER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL 53 54 REVIEW RISK ASSESSMENTS, SCIENTIFIC STUDIES, AND OTHER RELEVANT ANALYSES 55 REGARDING BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL AND DETERMINE WHETHER THE MATERIAL MAY

BE AVAILABLE. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL CONSIDER ANY NEW SCIENCE WITH REGARD 1 2 TO THE BIOAVAILABILITY AND TOXICITY OF COPPER. 3 THE DEPARTMENT FINDS THE ALTERNATIVE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL (B) ΙF 4 MAY BE AVAILABLE, IT SHALL: (I) BY DECEMBER THIRTY-FIRST OF THE YEAR THE FINDING IS MADE, 5 PUBLISH 6 INFORMATION AND PRESENT IT IN A REPORT TO THE APPROPRIATE LEGISLA-SUCH 7 SUCH REPORT SHALL TIVE COMMITTEES. INCLUDE RECOMMENDATIONS FOR 8 EXEMPTIONS ON ORIGINAL EQUIPMENT SERVICE AND BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURED PRIOR TO DATES SPECIFIED IN THIS SECTION AND MAY 9 INCLUDE 10 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR OTHER EXEMPTIONS; AND 11 (II) CONVENE A BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE WHICH SHALL 12 INCLUDE: (A) THE COMMISSIONER, OR HIS OR HER DESIGNEE, WHO WILL CHAIR THE 13 14 COMMITTEE; 15 (B) A REPRESENTATIVE OF MANUFACTURERS OF BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL; 16 (C) A REPRESENTATIVE OF MANUFACTURERS OF MOTOR VEHICLES; 17 (D) A REPRESENTATIVE OF THE NATIONAL HIGHWAY TRAFFIC SAFETY ADMINIS-18 TRATION; AND 19 (E) A REPRESENTATIVE OF A NONGOVERNMENTAL ORGANIZATION WHOSE PRIMARY PURPOSE OR ORGANIZING PRINCIPLE IS PROTECTION OF THE ENVIRONMENT. 20 21 COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED IN PARAGRAPH (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION (C) THE 22 SHALL SEPARATELY ASSESS ALTERNATIVE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL FOR PASSEN-23 GER VEHICLES, LIGHT-DUTY VEHICLES AND HEAVY-DUTY VEHICLES AND MAKE 24 RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE DEPARTMENT AS TO WHETHER ALTERNATIVE BRAKE FRIC-25 TION MATERIAL IS AVAILABLE OR UNAVAILABLE FOR EACH. 26 (D) BEGINNING EIGHT YEARS AFTER THE COMMITTEE ESTABLISHED IN PARAGRAPH 27 (B) OF THIS SUBDIVISION CONFIRMS THAT ALTERNATIVE BRAKE FRICTION MATERI-28 AVAILABLE SUBSEQUENT TO THE PUBLICATION IN THE NEW YORK STATE AL IS REGISTER OF THE REPORT REFERENCED IN SUBPARAGRAPH (I) OF PARAGRAPH 29 (B) THIS SUBDIVISION NO MANUFACTURER, WHOLESALER, RETAILER, OR DISTRIBU-30 OF TOR MAY SELL OR OFFER FOR SALE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL IN NEW YORK STATE 31 32 CONTAINING MORE THAN 0.5 PERCENT COPPER AND ITS COMPOUNDS BY WEIGHT, AS 33 SPECIFIED IN THE REPORT. (E) THE DEPARTMENT SHALL ADOPT RULES TO IMPLEMENT THIS SUBDIVISION. 34 35 4. APPLICATION FOR EXEMPTIONS. ANY MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURER OR BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURER MAY APPLY TO THE DEPARTMENT FOR AN 36 37 EXEMPTION FROM THIS SECTION FOR BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL INTENDED FOR A 38 SPECIFIC MOTOR VEHICLE MODEL OR CLASS OF MOTOR VEHICLES BASED ON SPECIAL 39 NEEDS OR CHARACTERISTICS OF THE MOTOR VEHICLES FOR WHICH THE BRAKE FRIC-40 TION MATERIAL IS INTENDED. EXEMPTIONS MAY BE ISSUED FOR SMALL VOLUME MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURERS, SPECIFIC MOTOR VEHICLE MODELS, OR SPECIAL 41 CLASSES OF VEHICLES, INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, FIRE TRUCKS, POLICE 42 43 CARS, AND HEAVY OR WIDE LOAD EQUIPMENT HAULING; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT 44 THE MANUFACTURER CAN DEMONSTRATE THAT COMPLYING WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF 45 THIS SECTION DOES NOT ALLOW COMPLIANCE WITH SAFETY STANDARDS, OR CAUSES SIGNIFICANT FINANCIAL HARDSHIP. EXEMPTIONS ARE VALID FOR NO LESS THAN 46 47 ONE YEAR AND MAY BE RENEWED AUTOMATICALLY AS NEEDED. EXEMPTIONS MAY ALSO 48 BEPERMANENT, PROVIDED THAT THEY ARE DESIGNATED AS SUCH AND PROVIDED 49 THAT THE VEHICLE IS USED SOLELY IN THE MANNER DESCRIBED IN THE APPLICA-50 TION. 51 5. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. (A) BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN, AND AT LEAST EVERY THREE YEARS THEREAFTER, MANUFACTURERS OF BRAKE FRIC-52 TION MATERIAL SOLD OR OFFERED FOR SALE IN NEW YORK SHALL PROVIDE DATA TO 53 54 THE DEPARTMENT ADEQUATE TO ENABLE THE DEPARTMENT TO DETERMINE CONCEN-55 TRATIONS OF ANTIMONY, COPPER, NICKEL AND ZINC AND THEIR COMPOUNDS IN BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL SOLD OR OFFERED FOR SALE IN NEW YORK. 56

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(B) USING THIS DATA AND OTHER DATA AS NEEDED, AND IN CONSULTATION WITH

2 THE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURING INDUSTRY, THE DEPARTMENT 3 SHALL: 4 (I) BY JULY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FIFTEEN, ESTABLISH BASELINE CONCEN-5 TRATION LEVELS FOR CONSTITUENTS IDENTIFIED IN BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL; 6 (II) TRACK PROGRESS TOWARD REDUCING THE USE OF COPPER AND ITS 7 COMPOUNDS AND ENSURE THAT CONCENTRATION LEVELS OF ANTIMONY, COPPER, 8 NICKEL OR ZINC AND THEIR COMPOUNDS DO NOT INCREASE BY MORE THAN FIFTY 9 PERCENT ABOVE BASELINE CONCENTRATION LEVELS; AND 10 (III) IF CONCENTRATION LEVELS OF ANTIMONY, COPPER, NICKEL OR ZINC AND 11 THEIR COMPOUNDS IN BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL INCREASE ABOVE BASELINE CONCENTRATION LEVELS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW SCIENTIFIC STUDIES TO 12 DETERMINE THE POTENTIAL IMPACT OF THE CONSTITUENT ON HUMAN HEALTH AND 13 14 THE ENVIRONMENT. IF SCIENTIFIC STUDIES DEMONSTRATE THE NEED FOR CONTROL-15 LING THE USE OF THE CONSTITUENT IN BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL, THE DEPART-16 MENT MAY RECOMMEND LIMITS ON CONCENTRATION LEVELS OF SUCH CONSTITUENT 17 MATERIAL. 6. COMPLIANCE. (A) MANUFACTURERS OF BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL OFFERED 18 19 FOR SALE IN NEW YORK MUST CERTIFY COMPLIANCE WITH REQUIREMENTS OF THIS 20 SECTION AND MARK PROOF OF CERTIFICATION ON THE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL 21 IN ACCORDANCE WITH CRITERIA IMPLEMENTED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBDIVISION. (B) BY DECEMBER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND FOURTEEN, THE DEPARTMENT 22 SHALL, AFTER CONSULTING WITH INTERESTED PARTIES, DEVELOP COMPLIANCE CRITERIA TO 23 MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. COMPLIANCE CRITERIA SHALL 24 25 INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, (I) SELF-CERTIFICATION OF COMPLIANCE BY 26 BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURERS AND (II) MARKED PROOF OF CERTIF-27 ICATION, INCLUDING MANUFACTURE DATE, ON BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL AND 28 PRODUCT PACKAGING. MARKED PROOF OF CERTIFICATION MUST APPEAR BY JANUARY 29 FIRST, TWO THOUSAND SEVENTEEN. (C) BEGINNING JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TWENTY-THREE, MANUFACTURERS 30 OF NEW MOTOR VEHICLES OFFERED FOR SALE IN NEW YORK MUST ENSURE THAT 31 MOTOR VEHICLES ARE EQUIPPED WITH BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL CERTIFIED TO BE 32 33 COMPLIANT WITH THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS SECTION. 34 7. CIVIL PENALTY. (A) A BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFACTURER THAT 35 KNOWINGLY VIOLATES THIS SECTION SHALL RECALL THE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL AND REIMBURSE THE BRAKE FRICTION DISTRIBUTOR, RETAILER, OR ANY OTHER 36 37 PURCHASER FOR THE MATERIAL AND ANY APPLICABLE SHIPPING AND HANDLING 38 CHARGES FOR RETURNING THE MATERIAL. A BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL MANUFAC-39 TURER THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO 40 EXCEED TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR EACH VIOLATION. (B) A MOTOR VEHICLE DISTRIBUTOR OR RETAILER THAT KNOWINGLY VIOLATES 41 THIS SECTION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TEN THOUSAND 42 43 DOLLARS FOR EACH VIOLATION. A MOTOR VEHICLE DISTRIBUTOR OR RETAILER IS 44 NOT IN VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION FOR SELLING A VEHICLE THAT WAS PREVI-45 OUSLY SOLD AT RETAIL AND THAT CONTAINS BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL FAILING TO MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS CHAPTER. HOWEVER, IF THE DEPARTMENT 46 47 CONCLUSIVELY PROVES THAT THE MOTOR VEHICLE DISTRIBUTOR OR RETAILER 48 INSTALLED BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION ON THE 49 VEHICLE BEING SOLD AND WAS AWARE THAT THE BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL 50 VIOLATES THIS SECTION, THE MOTOR VEHICLE DISTRIBUTOR OR RETAILER IS SUBJECT TO CIVIL PENALTIES UNDER THIS SECTION. 51 (C) A MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURER THAT VIOLATES THIS SECTION MUST NOTI-52 53 FY THE REGISTERED OWNER OF THE VEHICLE WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF KNOWLEDGE OF 54 THE VIOLATION AND MUST REPLACE AT NO COST TO THE OWNER THE NONCOMPLIANT 55 BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL WITH BRAKE FRICTION MATERIAL THAT COMPLIES WITH 56 THIS SECTION. A MOTOR VEHICLE MANUFACTURER THAT FAILS TO PROVIDE THE 1 REQUIRED NOTIFICATION TO REGISTERED OWNERS OF THE AFFECTED VEHICLES 2 WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF KNOWLEDGE OF THE VIOLATION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL 3 PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS. A MOTOR VEHICLE 4 MANUFACTURER THAT FAILS TO PROVIDE THE REQUIRED NOTIFICATION TO REGIS-5 TERED OWNERS OF THE AFFECTED VEHICLES AFTER TWELVE MONTHS OF KNOWLEDGE 6 OF THE VIOLATION IS SUBJECT TO A CIVIL PENALTY NOT TO EXCEED TEN THOU-7 SAND DOLLARS PER VEHICLE.

8 8. EDUCATION. THE DEPARTMENT SHALL, BY JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND 9 THIRTEEN, PREPARE AND DISTRIBUTE INFORMATION ABOUT THE PROHIBITIONS TO 10 MANUFACTURERS, DISTRIBUTORS, AND RETAILERS TO THE MAXIMUM EXTENT PRACTI-11 CABLE.

9. RULES AND REGULATIONS. THE COMMISSIONER SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO
 ENACT RULES AND REGULATIONS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION.
 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
