AN ACT to amend the executive law, in relation to longevity in title for investigative employees of the division of state police

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 3 of section 215 of the executive law, as amended by chapter 478 of the laws of 2004, is amended to read as follows:

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3 3. The sworn members of the New York state police shall be appointed 5 by the superintendent and permanent appointees may be removed by the superintendent only after a hearing. MEMBERS WHO HAVE BEEN ASSIGNED OR 6 7 INVESTIGATORS INVESTIGATORS IN THE BUREAU OF APPOINTED OR SENIOR AS CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION OR AS A STATION COMMANDER, CORPORAL, ZONE COMMAN-9 DER, ZONE SERGEANT, FIRST SERGEANT, STAFF SERGEANT, CAPTAIN OR MAJOR FOR A PERIOD OF THREE CONTINUOUS YEARS OR MORE MAY BE REMOVED OR 10 SUCH ASSIGNMENT OR APPOINTMENT ONLY AFTER A HEARING, THE PROCEDURE 11 OF WHICH SHALL BE IN ACCORDANCE WITH REGULATIONS ADOPTED BY THE 12 INTENDENT OF STATE POLICE; PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT A HEARING SHALL NOT 13 14 BE REQUIRED WHEN REDUCTION IN RANK FROM SUCH POSITION IS BASED SOLELY ON 15 CONSOLIDATION OR ABOLITION THEECONOMY, OF OF ACTIVITIES OR OTHERWISE. No person shall be appointed to 16 CURTAILMENT 17 the New York state police force as a sworn member unless he or she shall 18 be a citizen of the United States, between the ages of twenty-one 19 twenty-nine years except that in the superintendent's discretion, the 20 maximum age may be extended to thirty-five years. Notwithstanding any other provision of law or any general or special law to the contrary the 21 22 spent on military duty, not exceeding a total of six years, shall be subtracted from the age of any applicant who has passed his or her 23 twenty-ninth birthday, solely for the purpose of permitting qualifica-24 25 tion as to age and for no other purpose. Such limitations as to age shall not apply to persons appointed to the positions of coun-27 sel, first assistant counsel, assistant counsel, and assistant deputy 28 superintendent for employee relations nor to any person appointed to the

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bureau of criminal investigation pursuant to section two hundred sixteen this article nor shall any person be appointed unless he or she has 3 fitness and good moral character and shall have passed a physical mental examination based upon standards provided by the rules and regu-5 lations of the superintendent. Appointments shall be made for a proba-6 tionary period which, in the case of appointees required to attend and 7 complete a basic training program at the state police academy, 8 include such time spent attending the basic school and terminate one 9 year after successful completion thereof. All other sworn members shall 10 subject to a probationary period of one year from the date of appointment. Following satisfactory completion of the probationary peri-11 12 od the member shall be a permanent appointee. Voluntary resignation or 13 withdrawal from the New York state police during such appointment shall 14 be submitted to the superintendent for approval. Reasonable time 15 required to account for all equipment issued or for debts or obligations to the state to be satisfied. Resignation or withdrawal from the 16 division during a time of emergency, so declared by the governor, 17 18 be approved if contrary to the best interest of the state and shall 19 be a misdemeanor. No sworn member removed from the New York state police 20 shall be eligible for reappointment. The superintendent shall make rules 21 and regulations subject to approval by the governor for the discipline 22 and control of the New York state police and for the examination and qualifications of applicants for appointment as members thereto and such 23 examinations shall be held and conducted by the superintendent subject 24 25 such rules and regulations. The superintendent is authorized to 26 charge a fee of twenty dollars as an application fee for any person 27 applying to take a competitive examination for the position of trooper, 28 and a fee of five dollars for any competitive examination for a civilian 29 position. The superintendent shall promulgate regulations subject to the approval of the director of the budget, to provide for a waiver of the 30 application fee when the fee would cause an unreasonable hardship on the 31 32 applicant and to establish a fee schedule and charge fees for the use of 33 state police facilities. 34

S 2. This act shall take effect immediately.
