Introduced by Sens. GRISANTI, MAZIARZ, GRIFFO, RITCHIE -- read twice and ordered printed, and when printed to be committed to the Committee on Energy and Telecommunications

AN ACT to amend the public authorities law, in relation to appointing a Lawrence county resident and a Niagara county resident to the power authority of the state of New York

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The opening paragraph of section 1003 of the public author-2 ities law, as amended by chapter 766 of the laws of 2005, is amended to 3 read as follows:

The authority shall consist of seven trustees, five of whom shall 5 serve respectively for terms of one, two, three, four and five years, to appointed by the governor, by and with the advice and consent of the 6 7 senate. The sixth and seventh trustees shall be appointed by the goverby and with the advice and consent of the senate, and shall serve 8 initial terms of one and two years respectively. ONE TRUSTEE SHALL BE A 9 10 RESIDENT OF ST. LAWRENCE COUNTY AND ONE TRUSTEE SHALL BE A RESIDENT OF NIAGARA COUNTY. Each trustee shall hold office until a successor has 11 been appointed and qualified. At the expiration of the term of each 12 trustee and of each succeeding trustee the governor shall, by and with 13 the advice and consent of the senate, appoint a successor, who 14 15 hold office for a term of five years, or until a successor has been appointed and qualified. In the event of a vacancy occurring in the 16 17 office of the trustee by death, resignation or otherwise, the governor shall, by and with the advice and consent of the senate, 18 successor, who shall hold office for the unexpired term. Four trustees shall constitute a quorum for the purpose of organizing the authority

21 and conducting the business thereof.
