AN ACT to amend the environmental conservation law, in relation to
recreational marine fishing licenses

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEM-
BLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. Subdivisions 5, 6, 15 and 16 of section 11-0701 of the
2 environmental conservation law, subdivision 5 as amended by section 10
3 of part F of chapter 82 of the laws of 2002, paragraph c of subdivision
4 5 as added by section 1 of part KK of chapter 59 of the laws of 2009,
5 subdivision 6 as amended by section 11 of part F of chapter 82 of the
6 laws of 2002, subdivision 15 as amended by section 16 of part F of chap-
7 ter 82 of the laws of 2002 and subdivision 16 as amended by section 1 of
8 part LL of chapter 59 of the laws of 2009, are amended to read as
9 follows:
- 10 5. a. A combined resident fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING and
11 small and big game license hereinafter in this article referred to as a
12 sportsman license, entitles the holder to the privileges the holder
13 would have if the holder held separately a fishing license, A RECRE-
14 ATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE and a small and big game license.
- 15 b. A combined resident fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING, small and
16 big game, bowhunting and muzzle-loading license, hereinafter in this
17 article referred to as a resident super-sportsman license, entitles the
18 holder to the privileges the holder would have if the holder held sepa-
19 rately a fishing license, A RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE, a small
20 and big game license, a bowhunting stamp, a muzzle-loading stamp, and a
21 turkey permit.
- 22 c. A combined resident fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING, small and
23 big game, muzzle-loading stamp and trapping license, hereinafter in this
24 article referred to as a resident trapper super-sportsman license, enti-

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1 tles the holder to the privileges the holder would have if the holder
2 held separately a fishing license, A RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING
3 LICENSE, a small and big game license, a muzzle-loading stamp, a trap-
4 ping license, and a turkey permit.

5 6. A free sportsman license entitles the holder to the privileges the
6 holder would have if the holder held separately a small and big game
7 license, A RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE and a fishing license.

8 15. A non-resident combined hunting, fishing, RECREATIONAL MARINE
9 FISHING, big game, bowhunting and muzzle-loading license, hereinafter in
10 this article referred to as a non-resident super-sportsman license,
11 entitles a person who has not been a resident of the state for more than
12 thirty days to the privileges that the holder would have if the holder
13 held separately a non-resident hunting license, a non-resident fishing
14 license, A NON-RESIDENT RECREATIONAL MARINE FISHING LICENSE, a non-resi-
15 dent big game license, a non-resident bowhunting license, a non-resident
16 muzzle-loading license and a non-resident turkey permit.

17 16. A conservation legacy license entitles the holder to fish, [except
18 for migratory fish of the sea or from the waters of the marine
19 district,] hunt wildlife, hunt big game with a longbow and a muzzle-
20 loading firearm during special seasons therefor, hunt turkey, enjoy the
21 benefits of a voluntary habitat stamp and receive the "New York State
22 Conservationist" magazine as if the holder of such license held sepa-
23 rately a resident super-sportsman license, a voluntary habitat stamp and
24 a subscription to the "New York State Conservationist" magazine.

25 S 2. Paragraph d and the closing paragraph of subdivision 1 of section
26 11-0702 of the environmental conservation law, as amended by chapter 507
27 of the laws of 2010, are amended to read as follows:

28 d. Lifetime COMBINED
29 fishing AND RECREATIONAL
30 MARINE FISHING license
31 for a person age seventy
32 and over.

33 The holder of a lifetime small and big game license, RECREATIONAL
34 MARINE FISHING LICENSE or fishing license may, at any time, convert such
35 license to a lifetime sportsman license and turkey permit for an addi-
36 tional fee equal to the existing differential.

37 S 3. Subdivision 4 of section 11-0702 of the environmental conserva-
38 tion law, as added by chapter 352 of the laws of 1987 and as renumbered
39 by chapter 626 of the laws of 1988, is amended to read as follows:

40 4. All moneys collected from the sale of lifetime licenses shall be
41 deposited in the state fish and game trust account pursuant to section
42 eighty-three of the state finance law, EXCEPT THAT TEN PERCENT OF THE
43 FEES COLLECTED FROM PARAGRAPHS A, D, H AND I OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF THIS
44 SECTION SHALL BE DEPOSITED IN THE MARINE RESOURCES ACCOUNT OF THE
45 CONSERVATION FUND PURSUANT TO SECTION EIGHTY-THREE OF THE STATE FINANCE
46 LAW.

47 S 4. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall
48 have become a law.
