AN ACT to amend the education law, the insurance law and the public health law, in relation to providing for dispensing emergency contraception under certain conditions

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as 2 the "unintended pregnancy prevention act".

3 S 2. Legislative findings. The United States Food and Drug Administration (FDA) has declared emergency contraceptive pills to be safe and 4 5 effective in preventing pregnancy when used within 72 hours after unpro-6 tected intercourse. The American College of Obstetricians and Gynecolo-7 gists and the American College of Nurse-Midwives state that emergency contraception (EC) is so safe, and using it quickly is so important, 8 9 that it should be available over the counter, without a prescription. 10 They also emphasize the need for unimpeded access to EC for all women of 11 reproductive age. However, although there are no medical reasons to limit provision of EC, the FDA only approved non-prescription access for 12 women 18 years and older. Additionally, the FDA imposed requirements for 13 14 proving the patient's identity with government-issued identification 15 documents. The need remains, however, to provide access to women who have difficulty obtaining the required identification documents and to 16 women under the age of 17 years. Minors in New York State have long been 17 legally entitled to full access, without parental consent, to all repro-18 ductive health care and services, including EC. Providing direct access 19 20 EC for younger women will also make it more likely that they will to 21 receive appropriate and timely professional attention, support and 22 assistance.

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The legislature deems it necessary to create a structure for simplify-ng access to EC for these women, while respecting and preserving the 1 2 ina 3 prescribing scopes of practice of physicians, nurse practitioners, and 4 midwives, the treating and case-finding scope of practice of registered 5 professional nurses, and the dispensing scope of practice of pharma-6 cists. This act does not alter the scopes of such professions, nor does 7 legislation interfere with non-prescription access to EC where it this 8 is otherwise lawful.

9 The legislature also finds that this legislation is necessary to 10 ensure that women do not lose insurance coverage for EC solely because 11 it has become available without a prescription. Losing coverage would be 12 a major obstacle to access, which would undermine the important health 13 objectives of the FDA and the legislature.

S 3. Subdivision 6 of section 6527 of the education law, as added by the chapter 573 of the laws of 1999, paragraph (c) as added by chapter 221 of the laws of 2002 and paragraph (d) as added by chapter 429 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as follows:

6. A licensed physician may prescribe and order a non-patient specific regimen [to a registered professional nurse], pursuant to regulations promulgated by the commissioner, and consistent with the public health law, [for] TO:

(a) A REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE FOR:

(I) administering immunizations[.];

26 [(d)] (IV) administering tests to determine the presence of the human 27 immunodeficiency virus[.];

31 (B) A LICENSED PHARMACIST, FOR DISPENSING EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION, TO 32 BE SELF-ADMINISTERED BY THE PATIENT, UNDER SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED 33 TWENTY-NINE OF THIS TITLE.

34 S 4. Subdivision 3 of section 6807 of the education law, as added by 35 chapter 573 of the laws of 1999, is amended and a new subdivision 4 is 36 added to read as follows:

37 3. A pharmacist may dispense drugs and devices to a registered profes-38 sional nurse, and a registered professional nurse may possess and admin-39 ister, drugs and devices, pursuant to a non-patient specific regimen 40 prescribed or ordered by a licensed physician, LICENSED MIDWIFE, or 41 certified nurse practitioner, pursuant to regulations promulgated by the 42 commissioner and the public health law.

48 S 5. The education law is amended by adding a new section 6829 to read 49 as follows:

50 S 6829. EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION; NON-PATIENT SPECIFIC PRESCRIPTION OR 51 ORDER. 1. AS USED IN THIS SECTION, THE FOLLOWING TERMS SHALL HAVE THE 52 FOLLOWING MEANINGS, UNLESS THE CONTEXT REQUIRES OTHERWISE:

53 (A) "EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION" MEANS ONE OR MORE PRESCRIPTION OR 54 NON-PRESCRIPTION DRUGS, USED SEPARATELY OR IN COMBINATION, IN A DOSAGE 55 AND MANNER FOR PREVENTING PREGNANCY WHEN USED AFTER INTERCOURSE, FOUND SAFE AND EFFECTIVE FOR THAT USE BY THE UNITED STATES FOOD AND DRUG
 ADMINISTRATION, AND DISPENSED OR ADMINISTERED FOR THAT PURPOSE.
 (B) "PRESCRIBER" MEANS A LICENSED PHYSICIAN, CERTIFIED NURSE PRACTI-

4 TIONER OR LICENSED MIDWIFE. 5 2. THIS SECTION APPLIES TO THE ADMINISTERING OR DISPENSING OF EMERGEN-6 CY CONTRACEPTION BY A REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE OR LICENSED PHARMA-7 PURSUANT TO A PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER FOR A NON-PATIENT SPECIFIC CIST 8 REGIMEN MADE BY A PRESCRIBER UNDER SECTION SIXTY-FIVE HUNDRED TWENTY-SEVEN, SIXTY-NINE HUNDRED NINE OR SIXTY-NINE HUNDRED FIFTY-ONE OF 9 10 THIS SECTION DOES NOT APPLY TO ADMINISTERING OR DISPENSING THIS TITLE. EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION WHEN LAWFULLY DONE WITHOUT SUCH A PRESCRIPTION 11 12 OR ORDER.

ADMINISTERING OR DISPENSING OF EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION BY A 13 3. THE 14 REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE OR LICENSED PHARMACIST SHALL BE DONE IΝ 15 ACCORDANCE WITH PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS OF PRACTICE AND IN ACCORDANCE WITH WRITTEN PROCEDURES AND PROTOCOLS AGREED TO BY THE 16 REGISTERED 17 PROFESSIONAL NURSE OR LICENSED PHARMACIST AND THE PRESCRIBER OR A HOSPI-(LICENSED UNDER ARTICLE TWENTY-EIGHT OF THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW) THAT 18 TAL 19 PROVIDES GYNECOLOGICAL OR FAMILY PLANNING SERVICES.

(A) WHEN EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION IS ADMINISTERED OR DISPENSED, THE 21 REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE OR LICENSED PHARMACIST SHALL PROVIDE TO 22 THE PATIENT WRITTEN MATERIAL THAT INCLUDES: (I) THE CLINICAL CONSIDER-23 RECOMMENDATIONS FOR USE OF THE DRUG; (II) THE APPROPRIATE ATIONS AND 24 METHOD FOR USING THE DRUG; (III) INFORMATION ON THEIMPORTANCE OF 25 FOLLOW-UP HEALTH CARE; (IV) INFORMATION ON THE HEALTH RISKS AND OTHER 26 DANGERS OF UNPROTECTED INTERCOURSE; AND (V) REFERRAL INFORMATION RELAT-27 TO HEALTH CARE AND SERVICES RELATING TO SEXUAL ABUSE AND DOMESTIC ING 28 VIOLENCE.

(B) SUCH WRITTEN MATERIAL SHALL BE DEVELOPED OR APPROVED BY THE
 COMMISSIONER IN CONSULTATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND THE AMER ICAN COLLEGE OF OBSTETRICIANS AND GYNECOLOGISTS.

32 6. Subdivision 4 of section 6909 of the education law, as added by S 33 chapter 573 of the laws of 1999, paragraph (a) as amended and paragraph (c) as added by chapter 221 of the laws of 2002 and paragraph (d) as 34 added by chapter 429 of the laws of 2005, is amended to read as follows: 35 4. A certified nurse practitioner may prescribe and order a non-pa-36 37 tient specific regimen [to a registered professional nurse], pursuant to regulations promulgated by the commissioner, consistent with subdivision 38 39 three of section [six thousand nine] SIXTY-NINE hundred two of this 40 article, and consistent with the public health law, [for] TO:

53 S 7. Subdivision 5 of section 6909 of the education law, as added by 54 chapter 573 of the laws of 1999, is amended to read as follows:

55 5. A registered professional nurse may execute a non-patient specific 56 regimen prescribed or ordered by a licensed physician, LICENSED MIDWIFE, 1 2

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or certified nurse practitioner, pursuant to regulations promulgated by the commissioner. S 8. Section 6951 of the education law is amended by adding a new subdivision 4 to read as follows: 4. A LICENSED MIDWIFE MAY PRESCRIBE AND ORDER A NON-PATIENT SPECIFIC PURSUANT TO REGULATIONS OF THE COMMISSIONER, CONSISTENT WITH REGIMEN THIS SECTION AND THE PUBLIC HEALTH LAW, TO: (A) A REGISTERED PROFESSIONAL NURSE FOR EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION, TO BE ADMINISTERED TO OR DISPENSED TO BE SELF-ADMINISTERED BY THEPATIENT, UNDER SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE OF THIS TITLE; OR A LICENSED PHARMACIST, FOR DISPENSING EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION, TO (B) BE SELF-ADMINISTERED BY THE PATIENT, UNDER SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE OF THIS TITLE. Section 3216 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new S 9. subsection (m) to read as follows: (M) ANY POLICY UNDER THIS ARTICLE THAT COVERS CONTRACEPTION WHEN PROVIDED PURSUANT TO A PRESCRIPTION SHALL COVER EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE OF THE EDUCATION LAW, WHEN PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AN ORDINARY PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER UNDER SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWEN-TY-NINE OF THE EDUCATION LAW AND WHEN LAWFULLY PROVIDED OTHER THAN THROUGH A PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER. S 10. Section 3221 of the insurance law is amended by adding a new subsection (s) to read as follows: POLICY UNDER THIS ARTICLE THAT COVERS CONTRACEPTION WHEN (S) ANY PROVIDED PURSUANT TO A PRESCRIPTION, SHALL COVER EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT TWENTY-NINE OF THE EDUCATION LAW, WHEN PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AN HUNDRED ORDINARY PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER UNDER SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWEN-THE EDUCATION LAW AND WHEN LAWFULLY PROVIDED OTHER THAN TY-NINE OF THROUGH A PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER. S 11. Section 4304 of the insurance law is amended by adding а new subsection (n) to read as follows: (N) ANY POLICY UNDER THIS ARTICLE THAT COVERS CONTRACEPTION WHEN PROVIDED PURSUANT TO A PRESCRIPTION, SHALL COVER EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION AS DEFINED IN PARAGRAPH (A) OF SUBDIVISION ONE OF SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWENTY-NINE OF THE EDUCATION LAW, WHEN PROVIDED PURSUANT TO AN ORDINARY PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER UNDER SECTION SIXTY-EIGHT HUNDRED TWEN-TY-NINE OF THEEDUCATION LAW AND WHEN LAWFULLY PROVIDED OTHER THAN THROUGH A PRESCRIPTION OR ORDER.

S 12. Subdivision 1 of section 207 of the public health law is amended 41 by adding a new paragraph (i) to read as follows: 42

43 (I) EMERGENCY CONTRACEPTION, INCLUDING INFORMATION ABOUT ITS SAFETY, 44 EFFICACY, APPROPRIATE USE AND AVAILABILITY.

45 This act shall take effect on the one hundred eightieth day S 13. after it shall have become a law; and sections nine, ten and eleven of 46 apply to policies and contracts issued, renewed, modi-47 shall this act 48 fied, altered or amended on or after such effective date. The commis-49 sioner of education is authorized to promulgate any and all rules and 50 regulations and take any other measures necessary to implement this act 51 on its effective date on or before such effective date.
