AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to including employees of the office of children and family services on the list of public employees for which prevention of duties qualifies as assault in the second degree

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivisions 3 and 11 of section 120.05 of the penal law, as separately amended by chapters 318 and 345 of the laws of 2010, are amended to read as follows:

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With intent to prevent a peace officer, a police officer, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, a firefighter, including a firefighter acting as a paramedic or emergency medical technician administering first aid in the course of performance duty as such firefighter, an emergency medical service paramedic or emergency medical service technician, or medical or related personnel in a hospital emergency department, a city marshal, a traffic enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A SECURE OR LIMITED RESIDENTIAL FACILITY ADMINISTERED AND OPERATED BY THE OFFICE OF SECURE CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES, from performing a lawful duty, including releasing or failing to control an animal under circumstances evincing the actor's intent that the animal obstruct the lawful activity of such peace officer, police officer, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, firefighter, paramedic, technician, city marshal, traffic enforcement officer or traffic enforcement EMPLOYEE OF A SECURE OR LIMITED SECURE RESIDENTIAL FACILITY ADMINISTERED AND OPERATED BY THE OFFICE OF CHILDREN AND FAMILY SERVICES, he or she causes physical injury to such peace officer, police officer, registered nurse, licensed practical nurse, sanitation enforcement agent, firefighter, paramedic, technician or medical or related persona hospital emergency department, city marshal, traffic enforcement officer or traffic enforcement agent, OR EMPLOYEE OF A SECURE OR
