- AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to contracts for technology and telecommunications services between boards of cooperative educational services and third-party vendors

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subparagraph 7 of paragraph h of subdivision 4 of section 2 1950 of the education law, as added by chapter 395 of the laws of 1984, 3 is amended to read as follows:

4 (7) To enter into contracts with the state of New York, any community agricultural and technical college, MUNICIPALITY or public 5 college, б agency for the purpose of providing [electronic data processing] INFOR-7 MATION TECHNOLOGY AND INTERNET services to such agencies. Any such proposed contract shall be subject to the review and approval of the 8 commissioner, who may only approve such proposed contract when, in his 9 10 OR HER opinion, such contract will not disrupt the level of services 11 provided to component school districts and will result in a more econom-12 ical utilization of existing board of cooperative educational services 13 computer facilities. The commissioner shall issue a finding in writing 14 in making all determinations pursuant to this subparagraph.

15 S 2. Subdivision 4 of section 1950 of the education law is amended by 16 adding a new paragraph oo to read as follows:

17 OO. BOARDS OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES MAY CONTRACT WITH 18 THIRD-PARTY VENDORS TO SUPPORT OR PROVIDE TECHNOLOGY, TELECOMMUNICATIONS 19 AND RELATED SERVICES TO SCHOOL DISTRICTS.

20 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
