- AN ACT to amend the alcoholic beverage control law, in relation to mandating the installation of security cameras in cabaret establishments

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as
 "Imette's Law".
 S 2. The alcoholic beverage control law is amended by adding a new

4 section 64-e to read as follows: 5 S 64-E. INSTALLATION OF SECURITY CAMERAS IN CABARET ESTABLISHMENTS. 1.

6 NO ONE SHALL OPERATE A CABARET LICENSED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION UNLESS 7 ALL ENTRANCES AND EXITS USED BY PATRONS ARE EQUIPPED WITH DIGITAL VIDEO 8 SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS, PROVIDED, HOWEVER, THAT THIS SECTION SHALL NOT 9 APPLY TO AN ESTABLISHMENT THAT OPERATES PRIMARILY AS A RESTAURANT, AS 10 DEFINED BY SECTION SIXTY-FOUR-C OF THIS ARTICLE, DURING ALL HOURS OF 11 OPERATION.

12 2. DIGITAL VIDEO SURVEILLANCE SYSTEMS SHALL COMPLY WITH THE FOLLOWING 13 PROVISIONS AND WITH THE RULES OF THE AUTHORITY:

14 (A) THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS SHALL BE DIGITAL IN NATURE AND
15 SHALL BE OF SUFFICIENT NUMBER, TYPE, PLACEMENT AND LOCATION TO VIEW AND
16 RECORD ALL ACTIVITY IN FRONT OF AND WITHIN FIFTEEN FEET OF EITHER SIDE
17 OF EACH ENTRANCE OR EXIT;

18 (B) THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS SHALL BE SUFFICIENTLY LIGHT SENSI-19 TIVE AND PROVIDE SUFFICIENT IMAGE RESOLUTION (SUPPORTED BY ADDITIONAL 20 LIGHTING IF NECESSARY) TO PRODUCE EASILY DISCERNIBLE IMAGES RECORDED AT 21 ALL TIMES;

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(C) THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS SHALL RECORD AT A MINIMUM SPEED OF 1 2 FIFTEEN FRAMES PER SECOND; 3 (D) VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERA IMAGES SHALL BE CAPABLE OF BEING THE 4 VIEWED THROUGH USE OF APPROPRIATE TECHNOLOGY, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED 5 TO A COMPUTER SCREEN OR CLOSED CIRCUIT TELEVISION MONITOR; 6 THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERA SYSTEM SHALL BE CAPABLE OF TRANS-(E) 7 FERRING THE RECORDED IMAGES TO A PORTABLE FORM OF MEDIA, INCLUDING BUT 8 NOT LIMITED TO COMPACT DISC OR DIGITAL VIDEO DISC; (F) THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS SHALL NOT HAVE AN AUDIO CAPABILITY; 9 10 (G) THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS SHALL BE MAINTAINED IN GOOD WORKING 11 CONDITION; 12 EXCEPT AS OTHERWISE PROVIDED BY RULE, THE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE (H) CAMERAS SHALL BE IN OPERATION AND RECORDING CONTINUOUSLY DURING ALL 13 14 HOURS OF OPERATION OF THE CABARET AND FOR TWO HOURS AFTER THE CABARET 15 CLOSES; 16 (I) THE RECORDINGS MADE BY VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS INSTALLED AND MAINTAINED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION SHALL BE INDEXED BY DATES AND TIMES 17 AND PRESERVED FOR A MINIMUM OF THIRTY DAYS SO THAT THEY MAY BE MADE 18 19 AVAILABLE TO THE AUTHORITY, THE POLICE DEPARTMENT AND OTHER GOVERNMENT 20 AGENCIES ACTING IN FURTHERANCE OF A CRIMINAL INVESTIGATION OR A CIVIL OR 21 ADMINISTRATIVE LAW ENFORCEMENT PURPOSE; (J) ALL RECORDINGS MADE BY VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS INSTALLED AND 22 23 MAINTAINED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION WHILE IN THE POSSESSION OF THE CABARET SHALL BE STORED IN A LOCKED RECEPTACLE LOCATED IN A CONTROLLED 24 25 ACCESS AREA, TO WHICH ONLY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL HAVE ACCESS, OR SHALL 26 OTHERWISE BE SECURED SO THAT ONLY AUTHORIZED PERSONNEL MAY ACCESS SUCH 27 VIDEO RECORDINGS. ALL PERSONNEL AUTHORIZED TO ACCESS SUCH VIDEO RECORDINGS MUST CERTIFY IN WRITING THAT THEY HAVE BEEN INFORMED ON 28 THE 29 APPROPRIATE USE AND RETENTION OF RECORDINGS AS SET FORTH IN THIS SECTION, AND ON THE LEGAL ISSUES ASSOCIATED WITH VIDEO SURVEILLANCE AND 30 THE USE AND RETENTION OF RECORDINGS. THE CABARET SHALL KEEP A LOG OF ALL 31 32 INSTANCES OF REQUESTS FOR ACCESS TO, AND DISSEMINATION AND USE OF, 33 RECORDED MATERIALS MADE BY VIDEO SURVEILLANCE CAMERAS INSTALLED AND MAINTAINED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION. COPIES OF THE CERTIFICATIONS BY 34 35 AUTHORIZED EMPLOYEES AND OF THE ACCESS LOG SHALL BE PROVIDED TO THE AUTHORITY IN ACCORDANCE WITH ITS RULES; 36 37 (K) THE USE OR DISSEMINATION OF RECORDINGS MADE BY VIDEO SURVEILLANCE 38 CAMERAS INSTALLED AND MAINTAINED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION IN VIOLATION 39 OF THE PENAL LAW OR SECTION FIFTY OF THE CIVIL RIGHTS LAW SHALL RESULT 40 IN SUSPENSION OR REVOCATION OF A LICENSE AND A FINE OF NOT LESS THAN FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS NOR MORE THAN FIFTY THOUSAND DOLLARS; AND 41 (L) THE CABARET SHALL POST SIGNAGE AT APPROPRIATE LOCATIONS, AS DETER-42 43 MINED BY RULE OF THE AUTHORITY, TO NOTIFY THE PUBLIC OF ITS USE OF VIDEO SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT AND THE LOCATIONS OF VIDEO SURVEILLANCE EQUIPMENT 44 45 SO THAT THE PUBLIC HAS SUFFICIENT WARNING THAT SURVEILLANCE IS IN OPERA-46 TION. 47 3. EACH PERSON SUBJECT TO THE PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION SHALL SUBMIT, 48 OR ENSURE THE SUBMISSION OF, A REPORT TO THE AUTHORITY WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THIS SECTION, OR, IN THE CASE OF A NEW 49 CABARET WITHIN THIRTY DAYS AFTER THE ESTABLISHMENT OF SUCH CABARET. SUCH 50 REPORT SHALL CERTIFY THAT THE CABARET IS IN COMPLIANCE WITH THIS 51 SECTION. REPORTS FILED PURSUANT TO THIS SUBDIVISION SHALL BE SUBMITTED 52 53 IN SUCH FORM AND MANNER AND CONTAINING SUCH INFORMATION AS SHALL BE 54 PROVIDED BY RULE OF THE AUTHORITY.

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4. THE AUTHORITY SHALL CONDUCT PERIODIC INSPECTIONS OF LICENSEES TO
 ENSURE COMPLIANCE WITH THE USE AND RETENTION POLICIES SET FORTH IN THIS
 SECTION.

4 S 3. Rules and regulations. The chairman of the state liquor authority 5 is hereby authorized and directed to promulgate rules and regulations 6 necessary for the implementation of this act on or before the effective 7 date of this act.

8 S 4. This act shall take effect on the ninetieth day after it shall 9 have become a law.
