AN ACT to amend the state finance law, in relation to the definition of "emergency" in the procurement process

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Paragraph b of subdivision 1 of section 163 of the state
2 finance law, as added by chapter 83 of the laws of 1995, is amended to
3 read as follows:
4 b. "Emergency" means an urgent and unexpected requirement where health
5 and public safety or the conservation of public resources is at risk,
6 WHICH CREATES AN IMMINENT DANGER AND PRESSING NECESSITY FOR IMMEDIATE
7 ATTENTION TO PERMIT THE SAFE CONTINUATION OF A NECESSARY PUBLIC USE OR
8 FUNCTION, OR TO PROTECT THE PROPERTY OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, OR THE
9 LIFE, SAFETY, OR HEALTH OF ANY PERSON. AN AGENCY'S FAILURE TO PLAN IN
10 ADVANCE, INCLUDING A FAILED PROCUREMENT PROCESS, WHICH RESULTS IN A
11 SITUATION IN WHICH NORMAL PRACTICES CANNOT BE FOLLOWED DOES NOT CONSTI-
12 TUTE AN EMERGENCY. AN EMERGENCY MUST BE DECLARED BY THE GOVERNOR.
13 S 2. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after
14 it shall have become a law; provided, however, that effective immediate-
15 ly, the addition, amendment and/or repeal of any rules or regulations
16 necessary for the implementation of this act on its effective date is
17 authorized and directed to be made and completed on or before such
18 effective date; and provided further, however, that the amendment to
19 paragraph b of subdivision 1 of section 163 of the state finance law
20 made by section one of this act shall not affect the repeal of such
21 section and shall be deemed repealed therewith.
