Introduced by M. of A. PERRY, CAMARA -- Multi-Sponsored by -- M. of A. COLTON, ROBINSON -- read once and referred to the Committee on Codes

AN ACT to amend the executive law and the criminal procedure law, in relation to requiring a police officer or peace officer who discharges his or her weapon under circumstances where a person could be struck by a bullet to immediately report the incident

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

- 1 Section 1. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 231 to 2 read as follows:
- 3 231. REPORT OF DISCHARGE OF WEAPON. 1. ANY POLICE OFFICER WHO DISCHARGES HIS OR HER WEAPON WHILE ON DUTY OR OFF DUTY UNDER 5 STANCES WHEREIN A PERSON COULD BE STRUCK BY A BULLET FROM THE WEAPON, 6 INCLUDING SITUATIONS WHEREIN SUCH OFFICER DISCHARGES HIS OR HER 7 THE DIRECTION OF A PERSON OR AN ANIMAL, SHALL VERBALLY REPORT THE INCIDENT TO HIS OR HER SUPERIORS WITHIN SIX HOURS OF THE 8 OCCURRENCE 9 THE INCIDENT AND SHALL PREPARE AND FILE A WRITTEN REPORT OF THE INCIDENT 10 WITHIN FORTY-EIGHT HOURS OF THE OCCURRENCE OF THE INCIDENT. CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION SHALL PREVENT ANY POLICE OFFICER FROM INVOKING 11 12 HIS OR HER CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO AVOID SELF-INCRIMINATION.
- 2. AS USED IN THIS SECTION "POLICE OFFICER" MEANS A MEMBER OF
- 13 Z. AS USED IN THIS SECTION POLICE OFFICER MEANS A MEMBER OF THE 14 STATE POLICE.
- 15 S 2. The criminal procedure law is amended by adding a new section 16 2.35 to read as follows:
- 17 S 2.35 REPORT OF DISCHARGE OF WEAPON.

ANY PEACE OFFICER WHO DISCHARGES HIS OR HER WEAPON WHILE ON DUTY OR 18 STRUCK BY 19 OFF DUTY UNDER CIRCUMSTANCES WHEREIN A PERSON COULD BE20 BULLET FROM THE INCLUDING SITUATIONS WEAPON, WHEREIN SUCH OFFICER 21 DISCHARGES HIS OR HER WEAPON IN THE DIRECTION OF A PERSON OR AN 22 SHALL VERBALLY REPORT THE INCIDENT TO HIS OR HER SUPERIORS WITHIN SIX

WRITTEN REPORT OF THE INCIDENT WITHIN FORTY-EIGHT HOURS OF THE OCCUR-RENCE OF THE INCIDENT. NOTHING CONTAINED IN THIS SECTION SHALL PREVENT ANY PEACE OFFICER FROM INVOKING HIS OR HER CONSTITUTIONAL RIGHT TO AVOID SELF-INCRIMINATION.

- 5 2. AS USED IN THIS SECTION "PEACE OFFICER" MEANS A PEACE OFFICER AS 6 DEFINED IN SECTION 2.10 OF THIS ARTICLE.
- 7 S 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
