AN ACT to amend the education law, in relation to providing dating violence education and dating violence policies in school districts, boards of cooperative educational services and county vocational education and extension boards

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Short title. This act shall be known and may be cited as 2 the "Jessica Tush act".

3 S 2. The education law is amended by adding a new section 815 to read 4 as follows:

5 S 815. DATING VIOLENCE EDUCATION. 1. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT SHALL 6 INCORPORATE DATING VIOLENCE EDUCATION THAT IS AGE-APPROPRIATE INTO THE 7 ANNUAL CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES SEVEN THROUGH TWELVE 8 AND WHICH SHALL BE INCORPORATED INTO VARIOUS CLASS SUBJECTS, INCLUDING 9 HEALTH.

10 (A) DATING VIOLENCE EDUCATION SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BELIMITED TO, DEFINING DATING VIOLENCE, RECOGNIZING DATING VIOLENCE WARNING SIGNS AND 11 THE ROLE OF CELL PHONES, TEXT MESSAGES, INTERNET AND OTHER ELECTRONIC 12 13 MEANS IN CONNECTION WITH DATING VIOLENCE AND CHARACTERISTICS OF HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS. ADDITIONALLY, STUDENTS SHALL BE PROVIDED WITH THE 14 SCHOOL 15 DISTRICT'S DATING VIOLENCE POLICY AS PROVIDED IN SECTION TWENTY-EIGHT HUNDRED THREE OF THIS CHAPTER. 16

17 (B) FOR THE PURPOSES OF THIS SECTION:

(I) "DATING VIOLENCE" MEANS A PATTERN OF BEHAVIOR WHERE ONE PERSON
USES THREATS OF, OR ACTUALLY USES, PHYSICAL, SEXUAL, VERBAL OR EMOTIONAL
ABUSE TO CONTROL HIS OR HER DATING PARTNER AND INCLUDES THREATS MADE BY
CELL PHONE, TEXT MESSAGE, INTERNET OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS.

EXPLANATION--Matter in ITALICS (underscored) is new; matter in brackets
[] is old law to be omitted.

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(II) "DATING PARTNER" MEANS ANY PERSON INVOLVED IN AN INTIMATE ASSOCI-1 2 ATION WITH ANOTHER PRIMARILY CHARACTERIZED BY THE EXPECTATION OF AFFEC-3 TIONATE INVOLVEMENT WHETHER CASUAL, SERIOUS OR LONG-TERM. 4 (III) "AT SCHOOL" MEANS IN A CLASSROOM, ON OR IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT TO 5 SUCH SCHOOL PREMISES, ON A SCHOOL BUS OR OTHER SCHOOL-RELATED VEHICLE, 6 AN OFFICIAL SCHOOL BUS STOP, OR AT ANY SCHOOL-SPONSORED ACTIVITY OR AT 7 EVENT WHETHER OR NOT IT IS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS. 8 (C) TO ASSIST SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN DEVELOPING A DATING VIOLENCE EDUCA-TION PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW AND APPROVE THE GRADE LEVEL 9 10 TOPICS RELATING TO DATING VIOLENCE AND HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS. 2. UPON WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE SCHOOL PRINCIPAL, A PARENT 11 OR LEGAL 12 GUARDIAN OF A PUPIL LESS THAN EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE, WITHIN A REASONABLE PERIOD OF TIME AFTER THE REQUEST IS MADE, SHALL BE PERMITTED TO EXAMINE 13 14 THE DATING VIOLENCE EDUCATION PROGRAM INSTRUCTION MATERIALS AT THE 15 SCHOOL IN WHICH HIS OR HER CHILD IS ENROLLED. 16 S 3. The education law is amended by adding a new section 2803 to read 17 as follows: S 2803. DATING VIOLENCE POLICY. 1. AS USED IN THIS SECTION: 18 19 "DATING VIOLENCE" MEANS A PATTERN OF BEHAVIOR WHERE ONE PERSON (A) USES THREATS OF, OR ACTUALLY USES, PHYSICAL, SEXUAL, VERBAL OR EMOTIONAL 20 ABUSE TO CONTROL HIS OR HER DATING PARTNER AND INCLUDES THREATS MADE BY 21 CELL PHONE, TEXT MESSAGE, INTERNET OR OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS. 22 (B) "DATING PARTNER" MEANS ANY PERSON, REGARDLESS OF GENDER, INVOLVED 23 IN AN INTIMATE RELATIONSHIP WITH ANOTHER PRIMARILY CHARACTERIZED BY THE 24 25 EXPECTATION OF AFFECTIONATE INVOLVEMENT WHETHER CASUAL, SERIOUS OR 26 LONG-TERM. 27 (C) "AT SCHOOL" MEANS IN A CLASSROOM, ON OR IMMEDIATELY ADJACENT ТΟ 28 SCHOOL PREMISES, ON A SCHOOL BUS OR OTHER SCHOOL-RELATED VEHICLE, AT AN 29 OFFICIAL SCHOOL BUS STOP, OR AT ANY SCHOOL-SPONSORED ACTIVITY OR EVENT WHETHER OR NOT IT IS ON SCHOOL GROUNDS. 30 THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE OFFICE FOR THE PREVENTION 31 2.

31 2. THE DEPARTMENT, IN CONJUNCTION WITH THE OFFICE FOR THE PREVENTION 32 OF DOMESTIC VIOLENCE, SHALL DEVELOP A MODEL DATING VIOLENCE POLICY TO 33 ASSIST SCHOOL DISTRICTS, BOARDS OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND 34 COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARDS IN DEVELOPING POLICIES 35 FOR DATING VIOLENCE REPORTING AND RESPONSE. THE MODEL POLICY SHALL BE 36 ISSUED ON OR BEFORE APRIL FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TWELVE.

3. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND 37 38 COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD SHALL ESTABLISH A 39 SPECIFIC POLICY TO ADDRESS INCIDENTS OF DATING VIOLENCE INVOLVING 40 STUDENTS AT SCHOOL BY DECEMBER FIRST, TWO THOUSAND TWELVE. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND COUNTY VOCA-41 TIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD SHALL VERIFY COMPLIANCE 42 WITH THE 43 DEPARTMENT ON AN ANNUAL BASIS THROUGH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT REPORT CARDS 44 OR BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES REPORT CARD REQUIRED BY 45 THIS CHAPTER.

(A) SUCH POLICY SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, A STATEMENT THAT 46 47 DATING VIOLENCE WILL NOT BE TOLERATED, DATING VIOLENCE REPORTING PROCE-48 DURES, GUIDELINES TO RESPONDING TO AT-SCHOOL INCIDENTS OF DATING 49 VIOLENCE AND DISCIPLINE PROCEDURES SPECIFIC TO SUCH INCIDENTS. SUCH 50 POLICY SHALL FURTHER AUTHORIZE A STUDENT WHO IS A VICTIM OF DATING 51 TO REQUEST THAT THE PERPETRATOR OF THE VIOLENCE BE TRANSFERRED VIOLENCE 52 TO ANOTHER SCHOOL.

(B) TO ENSURE NOTICE OF THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE
EDUCATIONAL SERVICES' AND COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION
BOARD'S DATING VIOLENCE POLICY, THE POLICY SHALL BE PUBLISHED IN ANY
SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND COUNTY

1 VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD POLICY AND HANDBOOK THAT SETS 2 FORTH THE COMPREHENSIVE RULES, PROCEDURES AND STANDARDS OF CONDUCT FOR 3 STUDENTS AT SCHOOL.

4 4. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND 5 COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD SHALL PROVIDE DATING 6 VIOLENCE TRAINING TO ALL ADMINISTRATORS, TEACHERS, NURSES AND MENTAL 7 HEALTH STAFF AT THE MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL LEVELS. UPON THE RECOMMENDA-8 TION OF THE ADMINISTRATOR, OTHER STAFF MAY BE INCLUDED OR MAY ATTEND THE TRAINING ON A VOLUNTEER BASIS. THE DATING VIOLENCE TRAINING SHALL 9 10 INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, BASIC PRINCIPLES OF DATING VIOLENCE, 11 WARNING SIGNS OF DATING VIOLENCE AND THE ROLE OF CELL PHONES, TEXT MESSAGES, INTERNET, AND OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS IN CONNECTION WITH DATING 12 13 VIOLENCE AND THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S DATING VIOLENCE POLICY, TO ENSURE 14 THAT THEY ARE ABLE TO APPROPRIATELY RESPOND TO INCIDENTS OF DATING 15 VIOLENCE AT SCHOOL. THEREAFTER, THIS TRAINING SHALL BE PROVIDED YEARLY TO ALL NEWLY HIRED STAFF DEEMED APPROPRIATE TO RECEIVE THE TRAINING BY 16 17 THE SCHOOL'S ADMINISTRATION.

18 5. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND 19 COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD SHALL INFORM THE 20 STUDENTS' PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS OF THE DATING VIOLENCE POLICY. IF 21 REQUESTED, THE SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL 22 SERVICES OR COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD SHALL 23 PROVIDE THE PARENTS OR LEGAL GUARDIANS WITH THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S DATING VIOLENCE POLICY AND RELEVANT INFORMATION. 24

25 6. EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT, BOARD OF COOPERATIVE EDUCATIONAL SERVICES AND 26 COUNTY VOCATIONAL EDUCATION AND EXTENSION BOARD SHALL PROVIDE PARENT 27 AWARENESS DATING VIOLENCE TRAINING TO EDUCATE PARENTS ON SIGNS OF DATING VIOLENCE AND WAYS TO PREVENT TEEN DATING VIOLENCE TO ALL 28 PARENTS OF 29 CHILDREN AT THE MIDDLE AND HIGH SCHOOL LEVELS. THE PARENT AWARENESS DATING VIOLENCE TRAINING SHALL INCLUDE, BUT NOT BE LIMITED TO, BASIC 30 PRINCIPLES OF DATING VIOLENCE, WARNING SIGNS OF DATING VIOLENCE AND THE 31 32 ROLE OF CELL PHONES, TEXT MESSAGES, INTERNET, AND OTHER ELECTRONIC MEANS 33 IN CONNECTION WITH DATING VIOLENCE AND THE SCHOOL DISTRICT'S DATING VIOLENCE POLICY, TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE ABLE TO RECOGNIZE INCIDENTS OF 34 DATING VIOLENCE AND TO ADVISE PARENTS WHAT THEY CAN DO IF THEY SUSPECT 35 THEIR CHILD IS A VICTIM OR PERPETRATOR OF DATING VIOLENCE. PARENT AWARE-36 37 NESS DATING VIOLENCE TRAINING SHALL BE PROVIDED YEARLY.

38 7. THIS SECTION DOES NOT PREVENT A VICTIM FROM SEEKING REDRESS UNDER 39 ANY OTHER AVAILABLE LAW, EITHER CIVIL OR CRIMINAL. THIS SECTION DOES NOT 40 CREATE OR ALTER ANY TORT LIABILITY.

41 S 4. The education law is amended by adding a new section 816 to read 42 as follows:

43 S 816. RESPECT AND SELF-ESTEEM EDUCATION. 1. (A) EACH SCHOOL DISTRICT 44 SHALL INCORPORATE RESPECT AND SELF-ESTEEM EDUCATION THAT IS AGE-APPRO-45 PRIATE INTO THE ANNUAL CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK FOR STUDENTS IN GRADES 46 KINDERGARTEN THROUGH SIX.

47 (B) TO ASSIST SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN DEVELOPING A RESPECT AND SELF-ESTEEM
48 EDUCATION PROGRAM, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL REVIEW AND APPROVE THE GRADE
49 LEVEL TOPICS RELATING TO RESPECT AND SELF-ESTEEM.

2. UPON WRITTEN REQUEST TO THE SCHOOL PRINCIPAL, A PARENT OR LEGAL
GUARDIAN OF A PUPIL LESS THAN EIGHTEEN YEARS OF AGE, WITHIN A REASONABLE
PERIOD OF TIME AFTER THE REQUEST IS MADE, SHALL BE PERMITTED TO EXAMINE
THE RESPECT AND SELF-ESTEEM EDUCATION PROGRAM INSTRUCTION MATERIALS AT
THE SCHOOL IN WHICH HIS OR HER CHILD IS ENROLLED.

55 S 5. This act shall take effect on the one hundred twentieth day after 56 it shall have become a law.
