AN ACT to amend the general business law and the executive law, in relation to requiring mattresses and upholstered furniture to be fire retardant

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The general business law is amended by adding a new section 385-b to read as follows:

S 385-B. MATTRESSES AND UPHOLSTERED FURNITURE TO BE FIRE RETARDANT. 1. AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

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5 (A) "FIRE RETARDANT" MEANS A PRODUCT THAT MEETS THE REGULATIONS 6 ADOPTED BY THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL. THIS DOES NOT 7 INCLUDE FURNITURE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PHYSICAL FITNESS 8 AND EXERCISE.

9 (B) "BEDDING" MEANS ANY QUILTED PAD, PACKING PAD, MATTRESS PAD, 10 HAMMOCK PAD, MATTRESS, COMFORTER, QUILT, SLEEPING BAG, BOX SPRING, 11 STUDIO COUCH, PILLOW OR CUSHION MADE OF LEATHER, CLOTH OR ANY OTHER 12 MATERIAL, WHICH IS OR CAN BE STUFFED OR FILLED IN WHOLE OR IN PART WITH 13 ANY CONCEALED SUBSTANCE OR MATERIAL, WHICH CAN BE USED BY ANY HUMAN 14 BEING FOR SLEEPING OR RECLINING PURPOSES.

15 2. (A) ALL MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS MANUFACTURED FOR SALE IN THIS 16 STATE SHALL BE FIRE RETARDANT PURSUANT TO SECTION ONE HUNDRED 17 FIFTY-SIX-H OF THE EXECUTIVE LAW. THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS NO LATER THAN JANUARY FIRST, 18 TWO THOU-SAND THIRTEEN, REQUIRING THAT FIRE RETARDANT MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS 19 MEET A RESISTANCE TO OPEN-FLAME TEST THAT USES A PASS OR FAIL PERFORM-20 21 CRITERIA BASED ON A TEST METHOD DEVELOPED BY THE OFFICE OF FIRE ANCE 22 PREVENTION AND CONTROL OR THAT IS BASED ON ASTME 1590. IF THE OFFICE OF 23 FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL CONCLUDES THAT OTHER BEDDING CONTRIBUTES TO

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MATTRESS FIRES, THE REGULATIONS SHALL REQUIRE THE OTHER BEDDING TO BE 1 FLAME RETARDANT UNDER THE RESISTANCE TO OPEN-FLAME TEST. IF FEASIBLE, 2 3 THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL REGULATIONS SHALL PERMIT A 4 MANUFACTURER TO COMPLY WITH THE RESISTANCE TO OPEN-FLAME TEST BY TESTING 5 A SMALL SCALE VERSION OF ITS PRODUCT. IN DEVELOPING THESE REGULATIONS, 6 THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL MAY CONTRACT, COOPERATE, OR 7 OTHERWISE SHARE RESOURCES WITH OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, PRIVATE ORGAN-8 IZATIONS, OR INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS THAT IT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE FOR 9 PURPOSES OF REVIEWING TEST CRITERIA AND METHODS, EQUIPMENT SPECIFICA-10 TIONS, AND OTHER RELEVANT SUBJECTS. THESE REGULATIONS SHALL BECOME INOP-11 ERATIVE UPON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF ANY FEDERAL LAW OR REGULATION ESTAB-LISHING AN OPEN-FLAME RESISTANCE STANDARD FOR THESE PRODUCTS. THE OFFICE 12 OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND 13 14 THE LEGISLATURE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN, 15 SUMMARIZING ITS REGULATORY FINDINGS.

(B) REQUIREMENTS FOR FLAME RESISTANT MATTRESSES, BOX SPRINGS, OR OTHER
BEDDING PRODUCTS SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY HOTEL, MOTEL, BED AND BREAKFAST,
INN, OR SIMILAR TRANSIENT LODGING ESTABLISHMENT THAT HAS AN AUTOMATIC
FIRE EXTINGUISHING SYSTEM THAT CONFORMS TO APPLICABLE STATE CODES.

(C) ALL SEATING FURNITURE SOLD OR OFFERED FOR SALE BY AN IMPORTER,
MANUFACTURER, OR WHOLESALER FOR USE IN THIS STATE, INCLUDING ANY SEATING
FURNITURE SOLD TO OR OFFERED FOR SALE FOR USE IN A HOTEL, MOTEL, OR
OTHER PLACE OF PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION IN THIS STATE, AND REUPHOLSTERED
FURNITURE TO WHICH FILLING MATERIALS ARE ADDED, SHALL BE FIRE RETARDANT
AND SHALL BE LABELED IN A MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE OFFICE OF FIRE
PREVENTION AND CONTROL.

27 S 2. The executive law is amended by adding a new section 156-h to 28 read as follows:

29 S 156-H. FIRE SAFETY STANDARDS FOR MATTRESSES AND UPHOLSTERED FURNI-30 TURE. 1. AS USED IN THIS SECTION:

(A) "FIRE RETARDANT" MEANS A PRODUCT THAT MEETS THE REGULATIONS
ADOPTED BY THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL. THIS DOES NOT
INCLUDE FURNITURE USED EXCLUSIVELY FOR THE PURPOSE OF PHYSICAL FITNESS
AND EXERCISE.

(B) "BEDDING" MEANS ANY QUILTED PAD, PACKING PAD, MATTRESS PAD,
HAMMOCK PAD, MATTRESS, COMFORTER, QUILT, SLEEPING BAG, BOX SPRING,
STUDIO COUCH, PILLOW OR CUSHION MADE OF LEATHER, CLOTH OR ANY OTHER
MATERIAL, WHICH IS OR CAN BE STUFFED OR FILLED IN WHOLE OR IN PART WITH
ANY CONCEALED SUBSTANCE OR MATERIAL, WHICH CAN BE USED BY ANY HUMAN
BEING FOR SLEEPING OR RECLINING PURPOSES.

(A) ALL MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS MANUFACTURED FOR SALE IN THIS 41 2. STATE SHALL BE FIRE RETARDANT. THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL 42 43 SHALL ADOPT REGULATIONS NO LATER THAN JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIR-44 TEEN, REQUIRING THAT FIRE RETARDANT MATTRESSES AND BOX SPRINGS MEET A 45 RESISTANCE TO OPEN-FLAME TEST THAT USES A PASS OR FAIL PERFORMANCE CRITERIA BASED ON A TEST METHOD DEVELOPED BY THE OFFICE OF FIRE 46 47 PREVENTION AND CONTROL OR THAT IS BASED ON ASTME 1590. IF THE OFFICE OF 48 FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL CONCLUDES THAT OTHER BEDDING CONTRIBUTES TO 49 MATTRESS FIRES, THE REGULATIONS SHALL REQUIRE THE OTHER BEDDING TO ΒE 50 FLAME RETARDANT UNDER THE RESISTANCE TO OPEN-FLAME TEST. IF FEASIBLE, 51 THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL REGULATIONS SHALL PERMIT A MANUFACTURER TO COMPLY WITH THE RESISTANCE TO OPEN-FLAME TEST BY TESTING 52 A SMALL SCALE VERSION OF ITS PRODUCT. IN DEVELOPING THESE REGULATIONS, 53 54 THE OFFICE OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL MAY CONTRACT, COOPERATE, OR 55 OTHERWISE SHARE RESOURCES WITH OTHER GOVERNMENT AGENCIES, PRIVATE ORGAN-56 IZATIONS, OR INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS THAT IT CONSIDERS APPROPRIATE FOR 1 PURPOSES OF REVIEWING TEST CRITERIA AND METHODS, EQUIPMENT SPECIFICA-2 TIONS, AND OTHER RELEVANT SUBJECTS. THESE REGULATIONS SHALL BECOME INOP-3 ERATIVE UPON THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF ANY FEDERAL LAW OR REGULATION ESTAB-4 LISHING AN OPEN-FLAME RESISTANCE STANDARD FOR THESE PRODUCTS. THE OFFICE 5 OF FIRE PREVENTION AND CONTROL SHALL SUBMIT A REPORT TO THE GOVERNOR AND 6 THE LEGISLATURE ON OR BEFORE JANUARY FIRST, TWO THOUSAND THIRTEEN, 7 SUMMARIZING ITS REGULATORY FINDINGS.

8 (B) REQUIREMENTS FOR FLAME RESISTANT MATTRESSES, BOX SPRINGS, OR OTHER 9 BEDDING PRODUCTS SHALL NOT APPLY TO ANY HOTEL, MOTEL, BED AND BREAKFAST, 10 INN, OR SIMILAR TRANSIENT LODGING ESTABLISHMENT THAT HAS AN AUTOMATIC 11 FIRE EXTINGUISHING SYSTEM THAT CONFORMS TO APPLICABLE STATE CODES.

12 (C) ALL SEATING FURNITURE SOLD OR OFFERED FOR SALE BY AN IMPORTER, MANUFACTURER, OR WHOLESALER FOR USE IN THIS STATE, INCLUDING ANY SEATING 13 14 FURNITURE SOLD TO OR OFFERED FOR SALE FOR USE IN A HOTEL, MOTEL, OR 15 OTHER PLACE OF PUBLIC ACCOMMODATION IN THIS STATE, AND REUPHOLSTERED FURNITURE TO WHICH FILLING MATERIALS ARE ADDED, SHALL BE FIRE RETARDANT 16 AND SHALL BE LABELED IN A MANNER SPECIFIED BY THE OFFICE OF FIRE 17 PREVENTION AND CONTROL. 18

19 3. THE ATTORNEY GENERAL SHALL HAVE THE POWER TO ASSESS A FINE OF UP TO 20 ONE THOUSAND DOLLARS FOR EACH VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION. TO ENFORCE THE 21 PROVISIONS OF THIS SECTION, THE ATTORNEY GENERAL MAY BRING AN ACTION ON 22 BEHALF OF THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK TO ENJOIN ACTS IN 23 VIOLATION OF THIS SECTION AND TO RECOVER CIVIL PENALTIES AUTHORIZED 24 UNDER THIS SUBDIVISION.

25 S 3. This act shall take effect on the sixtieth day after it shall 26 have become a law.
