AN ACT to amend the civil rights law, in relation to civilian complaint review boards

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 50-a of the civil rights law, as amended by chapter 137 of the laws of 2002, is amended to read as follows:

- 1. All personnel records, used to evaluate performance toward continued employment or promotion, under the control of any police agency or 5 department of the state or any political subdivision thereof including 6 7 authorities or agencies maintaining police forces of individuals defined 8 police officers in section 1.20 of the criminal procedure law and 9 such personnel records under the control of a sheriff's department or a 10 department of correction of individuals employed as correction officers 11 and such personnel records under the control of a paid fire department 12 force of individuals employed as firefighters 13 firefighter/paramedics and such personnel records under the control the division of parole for individuals defined as peace officers pursu-14 15 ant to subdivisions twenty-three and twenty-three-a of section 2.10 of criminal procedure law shall be considered confidential and not 16 17 subject to inspection or review without the express written consent of 18 such police officer, firefighter, firefighter/paramedic, officer or peace officer within the division of parole except as may be 19 mandated by lawful court order, AND EXCEPT THAT A MEMBER OF A CIVILIAN 20 21 COMPLAINT REVIEW BOARD THAT IS RESPONSIBLE FOR INVESTIGATING 22 MISCONDUCT MAY PETITION THE COURT FOR AN ORDER PERMITTING DISCLOSURE OF 23 ALL PERSONNEL RECORDS IF THOSE RECORDS RELATE TO AN OFFICER WHO WAS
