AN ACT to amend the penal law, in relation to establishing the crime of unlawful procurement of clients, patients or customers

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Section 176.00 of the penal law is amended by adding three new subdivisions 6, 7 and 8 to read as follows:

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6. "PROVIDER" MEANS A HEALTH CARE PROFESSIONAL, AN OWNER OR OPERATOR 4 OF A HEALTH CARE PRACTICE OR FACILITY OR AN ATTORNEY.

5 7. "PUBLIC MEDIA" MEANS ANY OF THE FOLLOWING MEANS OF COMMUNICATION, 6 PROVIDED THAT THE USE OF SUCH COMMUNICATION DOES NOT INVOLVE IN-PERSON 7 CONTACT WITH A SPECIFIC PROSPECTIVE CLIENT, PATIENT OR CUSTOMER FOR THE TREATMENT OR REPRESENTATION 8 RETENTION, PURPOSE OF IN A PARTICULAR 9 MATTER: TELEPHONE DIRECTORIES, PROFESSIONAL DIRECTORIES, NEWSPAPERS AND OTHER PERIODICALS, RADIO AND TELEVISION, BILLBOARDS, BROCHURES, BUSINESS 10 CARDS, NEWSLETTERS, ANNOUNCEMENTS, PROMOTIONAL ITEMS BRANDING MATERIALS, 11 12 ADVERTISEMENTS, WEBSITES AND MAILED OR ELECTRONICALLY TRANSMITTED WRIT-TEN COMMUNICATIONS, ADVERTISEMENTS AND BRANDINGS. 13

14 8. "RUNNER" MEANS A PERSON, NOT A PROVIDER, WHO THEΤO WITH INTENT OBTAIN A MATERIAL PECUNIARY BENEFIT, PROCURES OR ATTEMPTS TO PROCURE A 15 CLIENT, PATIENT OR CUSTOMER AT THE DIRECTION OF, REQUEST OF, IN COOPER-16 17 ATION WITH, WHILE EMPLOYED BY, OR WITH INTENT TO SOLICIT A FEE FROM, A PROVIDER OR FROM ANY PERSON WHO CREATES THE IMPRESSION THAT HE OR SHE OR 18 19 HIS OR HER PRACTICE CAN PROVIDE LEGAL OR HEALTH CARE SERVICES. SUCH TERM 20 SHALL NOT INCLUDE A PERSON WHO PROCURES OR ATTEMPTS TO PROCURE CLIENTS, OR CUSTOMERS FOR A PROVIDER THROUGH PUBLIC MEDIA OR WHO REFERS 21 PATIENTS CLIENTS, PATIENTS OR CUSTOMERS AS AUTHORIZED OR PERMITTED BY LAW 22 OR IN 23 ACCORDANCE WITH EXISTING PROFESSIONAL CODES OF CONDUCT GOVERNING THE 24 PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE OF A PROVIDER. NOTHING IN THIS ARTICLE SHALL ΒE 25 DEEMED TO PROHIBIT AN AGENT, BROKER OR EMPLOYEE OF A HEALTH MAINTENANCE

AS 12 OF CONDUCT GOVERNING THE PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE OF THE PROVIDER, USES, SOLICITS, DIRECTS, HIRES OR EMPLOYS ANOTHER PERSON TO ACT AS A RUNNER ON 13 14 MORE THAN ONE OCCASION OVER ANY TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD AND PROVIDES A MATE-15 RIAL PECUNIARY BENEFIT. 16 UNLAWFUL PROCUREMENT OF CLIENTS, PATIENTS OR CUSTOMERS IN THE THIRD 17 DEGREE IS A CLASS A MISDEMEANOR. S 176.80 UNLAWFUL PROCUREMENT OF CLIENTS, PATIENTS OR CUSTOMERS 18 INTHE 19 SECOND DEGREE. 20 A PERSON IS GUILTY OF UNLAWFUL PROCUREMENT OF CLIENTS, PATIENTS OR 1. CUSTOMERS IN THE SECOND DEGREE WHEN HE OR SHE KNOWINGLY ACTS AS A RUNNER 21 22 ON FIVE OR MORE OCCASIONS OVER ANY TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD, OR FOR A PECUNI-23 ARY BENEFIT THAT IN THE AGGREGATE EXCEEDS FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS IN 24 VALUE; OR 25 AS A PROVIDER, IN VIOLATION OF LAW OR EXISTING PROFESSIONAL CODES 2. 26 OF CONDUCT GOVERNING THE PROFESSIONAL PRACTICE OF THE PROVIDER, KNOWING-27 LY USES, SOLICITS, DIRECTS, HIRES OR EMPLOYS ONE OR MORE PERSONS TO ACT A RUNNER ON FIVE OR MORE OCCASIONS OVER ANY TWELVE-MONTH PERIOD, OR 28 AS PROVIDES A PECUNIARY BENEFIT TO THE RUNNER THAT IN THE AGGREGATE EXCEEDS 29 30 FIVE THOUSAND DOLLARS IN VALUE. UNLAWFUL PROCUREMENT OF CLIENTS, PATIENTS OR CUSTOMERS IN 31 THESECOND 32 DEGREE IS A CLASS E FELONY. 33 S 176.85 UNLAWFUL PROCUREMENT OF CLIENTS, PATIENTS OR CUSTOMERS IN THE 34 FIRST DEGREE. 35 1.
