Introduced by M. of A. RABBITT -- read once and referred to the Committee on Local Governments

AN ACT to amend the village law, in relation to requiring five percent of the number of people who voted in the last gubernatorial election to sign a petition

THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF NEW YORK, REPRESENTED IN SENATE AND ASSEMBLY, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

1 Section 1. Subdivision 1 of section 9-902 of the village law is
2 amended to read as follows:
3 1. An act or resolution of the board of trustees as described in the
4 preceding section shall not take effect until thirty days after its
5 adoption; nor until approved by the affirmative vote of a majority of
6 the qualified electors of such village voting on such proposition for
7 its approval if within thirty days after its adoption there be filed
8 with the village clerk a petition signed and acknowledged by electors of
9 the village in number equal to at least [twenty] FIVE per centum of
10 [such electors in the village, as shown on the register of electors for
11 the previous general village election] THE TOTAL VILLAGE VOTE CAST AT
12 THE MOST RECENT GUBERNATORIAL ELECTION, protesting against such act or
13 resolution and requesting that it be submitted to the electors of the
14 village for their approval or disapproval.
15 S 2. This act shall take effect on the thirtieth day after it shall
16 have become a law.
